## **Ordinance 2016 - 23**

## An Ordinance Amending the Qualifications of the Non-Voting Member of the Montgomery County Redevelopment Commission

**Whereas,** Montgomery County, Indiana has a Redevelopment Commission established under Indiana Code 36-7-14 et al.; and

**Whereas,** the Indiana Legislature recently amended Indiana Code 36-7-14-6.1 in Senate Enrolled Act No. 380 (2016) to change the requirements of the non-voting adviser appointed to serve on a redevelopment commission to include either a member of a school board or an individual recommended by one of the school boards located in Montgomery County; and

**Whereas,** the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners has determined that it should amend its ordinance to reflect the change in state statute.

**Therefore, it is ORDAINED** that Section 33.11(C)(2) of the Montgomery County Redevelopment Commission Ordinance shall be amended to read as follows:

(2) Nonvoting Adviser. The County Commissioners shall also appoint one (1) person to serve as a non-voting adviser to the Redevelopment Commission. This person must be a school board member of one of the school corporations located in Montgomery County or an individual recommended by one of the school boards located in Montgomery County. This adviser is not considered a member of the Commission but is entitled to attend and participate in the proceedings of all Commission meetings. The non-voting adviser is not entitled to a salary, per diem, or reimbursement of expenses. The adviser serves a term of two (2) years and until a successor is appointed, and serves at the pleasure of the County Commissioners.

It is further ordained that all other provisions of the Montgomery County Code of Ordinances which are not expressly amended by this ordinance, will remain in full force and effect.

It is further ordained that the all provisions of the Montgomery County Code of Ordinances shall be effective upon adoption by the Board of Commissioners.
