The Plan commission believes the proposed amendment to Chapter 159, Article 13 is consistent with Indiana Code 36-7-4-600 series and otherwise complies with Indiana Code 36-7-4 and all other legal requirements.

The Plan Commission held a properly noticed public hearing on the proposed amendment to Chapter 159, Article 13, on May 25th, 2022, and considered all verbal and written comments submitted to the Plan commission.

When considering the proposed amendment to Chapter 159, Article 13, the Plan Commission paid reasonable regard to the (1) the Zoning Code; (2) the conservation of property throughout Montgomery County; (3) the Comprehensive Plan; (4) responsible development and growth; (5) the most desirable use of land in the district.

After proper consideration, a majority of the Plan Commission members voted to make a favorable recommendation to the Montgomery County Commissioners. The vote was 9 in favor, 0 against, and 0 abstentions.

The Plan Commission now certifies the proposed amendment, Article 13, of Chapter 159 Zoning Code to the Board of county Commissioners and recommends that the Commissioners approve and adopt the proposed amendment to Chapter 159 Zoning.

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ARTICLE 13—SOLAR FARMS AND FACILITIES

13.01 Purpose. The regulation of solar energy systems, solar farms and facilities and other solar energy devices is authorized by Indiana Code §36-7-2-2 and is designed to protect the public health, welfare and safety. The purpose of this Section is to plan for and regulate the use, improvement, and maintenance of real property and the location, condition, and maintenance of structures and other improvements. These regulations allow solar energy systems, solar farms and facilities and other solar energy devices in certain areas, and, therefore, do not have the effect of unreasonably restricting the use of such facilities other than for the preservation and protection of the public health and safety. It is the policy of Montgomery County to promote and encourage the use of solar energy systems and facilities, and these regulations are not intended to and do not have the effect of significantly increasing the cost of such systems, decreasing the efficiency of such systems, or impeding alternative systems of comparable cost and efficiency.

13.02 Permitted Districts. Solar energy systems, solar farms and facilities are allowed only in the Agriculture and Industrial Zoning Districts.

13.03. Exemptions. Solar devices which are part of the structure of a residence or business or part of the permitted yard of a residence or business and which are designed to provide electrical power, heating or cooling, or water heating only for the residence or business are exempt from this regulation.

13.04 Setbacks: The following setbacks apply to all ground-mounted solar panels and arrays:

All ground-mounted solar panels or arrays must be at least thirty (30) feet from any property line, at least one hundred (100) feet from the center of any road, street, highway, alley or public way, at least two hundred (200) feet from the property line if adjoined by property that is zoned residential, and at least two (200) hundred feet from the property line if adjoined by property that is zoned agricultural which has a single family dwelling within five hundred (500) feet of the solar panels or arrays. When the solar facilities for a single project encompass multiple parcels, there is no requited setback from a property line for the internal property lines in the project. Security fencing, access roads, and distribution poles and wires may be located within the setbacks but may not be located in a road right-of-way.

An adjacent landowner who benefits from the required setbacks may waive all or a portion of the setback by executing a written waiver agreement with the operator of the solar facility. This waiver must be recorded and filed with the Zoning Administrator.

13.05 Height Limitations: Ground-mounted solar panels or arrays may not exceed twenty (20) feet in height as measured from the natural grade to the top of the panel or array when at its highest position.

13.06 Permits. Each property owner must obtain a solar farm permit prior to constructing, operating or maintaining a solar energy system, farm or facility. In order to obtain a permit, the applicant must submit to the Zoning Administrator a conceptual site plan which includes the general footprint of the solar energy system, farm or facility the number of panels, the generating capacity, the location of all fences, electrical poles and lines, the location of all other equipment and structures, the location of any and all underground electrical lines, facilities and structures, the location of all access roads, rights-of-way and easements, drainage plan for the site which complies with the Montgomery County Storm Water Ordinance, a road use plan for construction, specifications for equipment, compliance with all applicable industry standards and safety codes, Federal Aviation Administration rules and regulations, and Federal Communications Commission rules and regulations. Within 15 days of receipt of an application for a permit, the Zoning Administrator will determine whether the application is complete. The Zoning Administrator will notify the applicant in writing of his determination. If the application is complete, the application will be reviewed by the Zoning Administrator and then by the Plan Commission as a request for a development plan review, as provided for in Section 13. If the application is not complete, the applicant must provide to the Zoning Administrative the supplemental information within sixty (60) days. If the applicant fails to provide the supplemental material for the application in a timely manner, the application will be dismissed.

13.07 Development Plan Review: The Plan Commission will conduct a public hearing on the application as a request for a development plan review, as provided for in Section 13 of the Zoning Ordinance.

13.08 Issuance of Permit: If the Plan Commission approves the development plan and the applicant has satisfied all of the requirements of this Ordinance, the Subdivision Control Ordinance, and all other applicable ordinances, rules and regulations, the Zoning Administrator will issue an improvement location permit.

13.09 Permit Fee: At the time of submission, the applicant will submit to the Zoning Administrator a nonrefundable fee in the amount of \$500.00, plus the following additional fee for solar energy systems, farms of facilities that are more than one hundred (100) acres:

13.10 Fencing: All solar energy systems, farms and facilities shall be surrounded by a security fence not less than eight (8) feet in height and not more than twelve (12) feet in height in order to prevent unauthorized access. All fences will be painted black or coated with black vinyl or similar coating. All gates will be locked. The applicant will place a sign, not to exceed eight square feet in area, which contains the name and address of the operator and an emergency telephone contact number for the operator.

13.11 Exterior Lighting. All exterior safety lighting will be developed in a manner which precludes light trespass onto adjoining parcels and which is limited to the amount of light needed for maintenance, safety and security.

13.12 Legal Drains: No solar energy system, farm or facility may encroach upon the seventyfive (75) easement of any legal drain or ditch. If the construction of the solar energy system, farm or facility requires the relocation of any legal drain or ditch, such relocation must be approved by the Montgomery County Drainage Board.

13.13 Private and Mutual Drains: No solar energy system, farm or facility may encroach upon any private or mutual drain or ditch. If the construction of the solar energy system, farm or facility requires the relocation of any private or mutual drain or ditch, such relocation must be approved by the parties to the private or mutual drain or ditch, performed at the expense of the operator, and relocated in a manner so as not to materially impede the function of the drain or ditch. This obligation to refrain from encroaching upon any private or mutual drain or ditch continues and applies even if the encroachment is discovered after construction of the project.

13.14 Damage to Roads: The applicant will be allowed to use County roads to transport equipment, materials and supplies to the location for construction. Prior to the issuance of a permit, the applicant must provide to the Zoning Administrator a road use plan. This plan must be approved by the Zoning Administrator and the County Highway Superintendent. The applicant will be responsible for any road and ditch damage caused by the applicant during construction and operations. In order to ensure the applicant's financial responsibility, the

applicant must provide to the County a bond, letter of credit or other surety in an amount determined by the County Engineer to be sufficient to cover the expense of remediation of damages. The amount of the bond, letter of credit or other surety required must be the County Engineer's estimate of road damages caused during the construction of solar projects. If the applicant disagrees with the determination by the County Engineer of the amount of the bond, letter of credit or other surety, the applicant may appeal this determination to the Board of Zoning Appeals. This bond, letter of credit or surety must be in an amount and in a form acceptable to the Zoning Administrator. After construction of the project, the County Engineer will inspect the roads and ditches contained in the road use plan and determine whether damage has resulted because of the applicant's project. If the County Engineer finds that such damage has occurred, the Engineer will provide written notice to the applicant of the estimated cost of the remediation. The County will cause the remediation to occur, and the Engineer will certify to the applicant the expense of the remediation. The applicant will pay to the County the certified amount within sixty (60) days of receipt of the notice of the certified amount. If the applicant fails to timely pay the remediation expense, the County will be entitled to file a claim with the bond company or holder of the letter of credit or other surety and be paid from the bond, letter of credit or other surety.

13.15 Enforcement: In the event of a violation of this Section, the Zoning Administrator may enforce the Ordinance using the rights and remedies provided for in Section 5.04 of the Zoning Ordinance.

The Plan commission believes the proposed amendment to Chapter 159, Article 3 is consistent with Indiana Code 36-7-4-600 series and otherwise complies with Indiana Code 36-7-4 and all other legal requirements.

The Plan Commission held a properly noticed public hearing on the proposed amendment to Chapter 159, Article 3, on May 25th, 2022, and considered all verbal and written comments submitted to the Plan commission.

When considering the proposed amendment to Chapter 159, Article 3, the Plan Commission paid reasonable regard to the (1) the Zoning Code; (2) the conservation of property throughout Montgomery County; (3) the Comprehensive Plan; (4) responsible development and growth; (5) the most desirable use of land in the district.

After proper consideration, a majority of the Plan Commission members voted to make a favorable recommendation to the Montgomery County Commissioners with one condition: Clerical corrections to text made prior to approval. The vote was 9 in favor, 0 against, and 0 abstentions.

RULES OF PROCEDURE MONTGOMERY COUNTY ADVISORY PLAN COMMISSION MONTGOMERY COUNTY, INDIANA

Article I. Authority and Duties

The Montgomery County Advisory Plan Commission (hereinafter called "Commission") exists as an advisory plan commission under the authority of IC 36-7-4-401 and Section 3.09 of the Zoning Ordinance of Montgomery County, Indiana, and any amendments thereto. These rules are adopted in accordance with the requirements of IC 36-7-4-401.

The duties of the Commission shall be those set forth in IC 36-7-4-400 et al., and such other responsibilities as may be required by state statute or county ordinance.

Article II. Officers, Members and Staff of the Plan Commission

Section 1. Members

1. The Commission shall consist of seven (9) voting members, appointed in accordance with IC 36-7-4-208. One (1) member is appointed by the County Commissioners from its membership. One (1) member is appointed by the County Council form its membership. The county surveyor or the surveyor's designee shall be one (1) member. One (1) member shall be the county agricultural extension educator or, if the educator does not reside in Montgomery County, then a person selected by the County Extension Board. The Five (5) remaining members shall be citizen members appointed by the County Commissioners. Not more than three of these citizen members may be from the same political party. Political affiliation is determined by the voting record of the citizen in the last three (3) political primary elections. All five citizen members must be a resident of an unincorporated area of the county or a resident of the county who is also an owner of real property located in whole or in part in an unincorporated area of the county. If the County agricultural extension educator is not a resident, the educator will serve the Commission in a nonvoting advisory capacity.

Section 2. Officers

- 1. At its first regularly scheduled meeting in each calendar year, the Commission shall elect from its voting membership a president and a vice president.
- 2. Each shall serve during the period of their membership on the Commission for the balance of the calendar year.

Section 3. Absence

- 1. The vice president shall have authority to act as president of the Commission during the absence or disability of the president.
- 2. In the absence of both the president and vice-president, a majority of the members present may nominate and appoint a chairperson for the meeting.

- 3. A member intending to be absent from any scheduled public meeting shall notify the secretary prior to the start of the scheduled public meeting, either in person, by phone, or in writing (e-mail, fax, etc...).
 - a. A member failing to provide prior notification of absence from a scheduled public meeting shall be considered unexcused.
 - i. The secretary shall have the authority to consider an absence excused in the event of an emergency, regardless of receipt of notification.
 - b. Two unexcused absences within a twelve (12) month period may be grounds for removal as stated in IC 36-7-4-218
 - c. As per IC 36-7-4-220, any three consecutive absences shall be treated as though the member resigned, at the discretion of the appointing authority.
- Section 4. Replacement
 - 1. Upon resignation or replacement of the president or vice president as a member of the Commission, the commission shall elect a new president or vice president at its next regularly scheduled meeting.
- Section 5. Secretary
 - 1. The Director of the Montgomery County Building Department, or the Director's designee, shall perform all duties of secretary of the Plan Commission.
 - a. In the event of a vacancy in the position of Director of the Montgomery County Building Department, the Plan Commission may:
 - i. Elect a Plan Commission member to complete the duties of secretary until the position of Director is filled, or
 - ii. Request the Montgomery County Administrator designate a cunty staff member to complete the duties of secretary until the position of Director is filled.
 - 2. The secretary shall be charged with such duties as required under State statutes, ordinances, and these rules.
 - 3. Performance of the duties of the secretary of the Plan Commission shall not entitle the Director, or the Director's designee, to serve as a voting member of the Plan Commission in the event of the absence of a duly-appointed member.

Section 6. Vacancy

- 1. If a vacancy occurs among the members of the Commission, the appointing authority shall appoint a member for the unexpired term of the vacating member.
 - a. The appointing authority shall be notified in writing by the secretary when a member has been absent as per Article II, Section 3.

Section 7. Legal Counsel

1. Within its budget allotment, the Commission may contract for legal counsel.

Section 8. Correspondence

 All correspondence intended to go to the Commission shall be addressed to the Montgomery County Plan Commission, 1580 Constitution Row, Crawfordsville, Indiana 47933.

Article III. Seal

The Commission shall adopt a seal with the caption "The Seal of the Montgomery County Plan Commission." The Secretary shall employ the seal to certify to all official acts of the Commission.

Article IV. Meetings

Section 1. Regular Meetings

- 1. The regular meeting of the Commission shall be the fourth Wednesday of each month at 4:00 PM in the Montgomery County Government Center Community Room, 1580 Constitution Row, Crawfordsville, IN 47933, unless it becomes necessary to use another location.
 - a. If the date of a regular meeting falls on a legal holiday, or if it is not feasible to conduct the meeting at that time or place, the president may set an alternate date, time, or place for the regular meeting, or may cancel the meeting with the consent of a majority of the members of the Commission, provided that the secretary complies with the notice requirements of IC 5-14-1.5 and reasonable attempts are made to individually notify all members of the meeting change.
- Section 2. Special Meetings
 - 1. Special meetings may be called by the president or two (2) members of the Commission upon written request to the secretary.
 - a. The secretary shall send to all members, at least three (3) days before the special meeting, a written notice fixing the time and place of the meeting. Written notice is not required if:
 - i. the date, time, and place of the special meeting are fixed in a regular meeting;
 - ii. all members of the Commission are present at that regular meeting; and
 - iii. the secretary complies with the notice requirements of IC 5-14-1.5.

Section 3. Order of Business

- 1. The order of business at regular meetings shall be:
 - a. Call to Order/Pledge of Allegiance;
 - b. Roll Call/Determination of a Quorum;
 - c. Minutes;
 - d. Reports of Officers, Committees, and Staff;
 - e. Agenda modification(s);
 - f. Old Business;
 - g. New Business;
 - h. Adjournment.

Section 4. Agenda

- 1. The agenda shall list all items to be considered by the Plan Commission at the regular or special meeting.
- 2. The items shall be listed on the agenda in the order in which the petition or other document was filed with the secretary.
 - a. The order in which agenda items are handled by the Plan Commission may be modified at the meeting.
 - b. Modification of the agenda order shall be at the discretion of the members of the Plan Commission.
 - c. Modification of the agenda order shall require a majority vote of members present.
 - d. Requests to modify the agenda order shall be subject to the rules for public hearings established below.
 - i. Requests to modify the agenda order shall not be subject to the requirement of mailing or publishing legal notice.
- 3. No petition shall be considered by the Plan Commission unless it appears on the agenda.
 - a. Any clerical item, agenda modification, waiver of procedure, or waiver of notice may be added to the agenda the night of the request, subject to a majority vote of members present.
- 4. The agenda shall be provided to all members of the Plan Commission and shall be available for public inspection at the office of the Planning and Building Department no later than three (3) days before any regular meeting.

Section 5. Presiding

- 1. The president of the Commission shall preside over meetings, decide questions of order, subject to appeal by Commission members, and preserve decorum in the meeting room.
- 2. The president shall pronounce the decisions of the Commission for purposes of recording in the minutes.

Section 6. Addressing the Commission

1. No one who is not a member of the Commission shall be permitted to address the Commission except by request to and consent of the president.

Article V. Official Action

Section 1. Quorum

- 1. A majority of the members of the Commission who are qualified to vote shall constitute a quorum.
- 2. Action of the Commission shall not be official unless it is authorized at a regular or properly called special meeting by a majority of the entire membership of the Commission.
- 3. At the start of any meeting at which there are no more than five (5) Plan Commission members present, the President shall announce that any petitioner may request and receive a continuance until the next meeting, regardless of whether the petitioner was previously granted a continuance.

Section 2. Voting

- 1. Voting by the Plan Commission on any petition shall be by roll call vote of the members.
 - a. Voting on any clerical item, agenda modification, waiver of procedure, election of officers, adoption or amendment of rules of procedure, approval of resolutions or waiver of notice may be done by show of hands or simultaneous voice vote.
- Section 3. Conflict and Abstention
 - 1. No member of the Commission shall participate in a hearing, discussion, or decision of the Commission upon any zoning matter in which the member:
 - a. has a known direct or indirect financial interest; or
 - b. is biased, prejudiced, or otherwise unable to be impartial.
 - i. A "zoning matter" does not include the preparation or adoption of a comprehensive plan.
 - c. Participation in a hearing or decision of the Plan Commission in which the member has a direct or indirect financial interest, or is biased, prejudiced or otherwise unable to be impartial may constitute cause for removal.
 - 2. A member who is disqualified under Subsection 1 will notify the President and Secretary of this fact prior to the meeting and will leave the hearing room during the case.
 - 3. The Plan Commission shall enter into its records the fact that the member has such a disqualification, and the name of the alternative member, if any, who participates in the hearing or decision in place of the regular member.

Section 4. Incomplete Commission

1. In the event a majority vote of the Commission cannot be achieved due to absences, permitted abstentions or disqualification, the matter shall be rescheduled for the next regular meeting at the request of any Commission member, a petitioner, or a remonstrator without penalty to the petitioner.

Article VI. Minutes and Records

Section 1. Minutes

- 1. The secretary of the Commission shall prepare and maintain minutes of its meetings.
- 2. The minutes shall include the vote of each member on each question presented or indicate that the member is absent, abstaining, or not voting because of a disqualification.

Section 2. Approval

- 1. The minutes shall be presented to the Commission for approval at the next succeeding regular meeting.
- 2. When approved, the minutes shall be signed by the president and attested by the secretary.

Article VII. Petitions for Commission Consideration and Public Hearings

Section 1. Public Hearings

- 1. The Commission shall hold such public hearings as are required by state statute and county ordinances.
 - a. The Commission may hold additional hearings at such times and places and upon such notice, as it considers necessary.

Section 2. Fees

1. All petitions not initiated by the Commission itself shall be accompanied by a nonrefundable filing fee in an amount established by the Montgomery County's fee ordinance.

Section 3. Supporting Documentation - Petitions

- 1. The Plan Commission staff may require additional information, data, statistics, or plats beyond those established by statute, ordinance or these Rules whenever it deems it necessary for the intelligent determination of a matter by the Commission.
 - a. The Director shall inform the petitioner, in writing, of any additional information or documentation required at the time of the Staff Review meeting.

- b. The Plan Commission shall not be precluded from requesting additional information or documentation necessary to facilitate the review of a petition when the Director has previously requested additional information.
- 2. All petitions without specific submittal requirements established by the fMontgomery County Zoning Ordinance must be accompanied by a digital copy of the application materials, including:
 - a. an aerial map of the site and adjacent parcels,
 - b. an aerial photograph showing the required setbacks and right-of-way,
 - c. and a site plan showing the requested action(s) and
 - d. all proposed public street improvements.
- 3. For a Development Plan Review, Planned Unit Development, Plat or Map Amendment, and any other petition that establishes forms of filing within the terms of the Montgomery County Zoning Ordinance, submittal shall be in accordance with the Zoning Ordinance, Subdivision Control Ordinance, and any other applicable ordinance, rule or order.
 - a. In the event, conflicting sections of the Zoning Ordinance require duplicate or conflicting forms of filing, the Director shall determine, in writing, which forms of filing shall be required.

Section 4. Docketing

1. If the Plan Commission staff finds that the petition is in good order with sufficient information, it shall set a time for a public hearing on the matter and shall provide public notice in accordance with IC 5-3-1.

Section 5. Notice

1. Notice shall be provided in accordance with Article VIII below.

Section 6. Presentation

- 1. The Plan Commission may allow petitioners to provide electronic presentations at the hearing.
 - a. Plan Commission staff will provide a projector, the petitioner shall be responsible for making sure documents are of a format to match the software provided or bring their own equipment.

Article VIII. Notice Requirements

Section 1. Minimum notice requirements

- 1. A notice of a public hearing required by state statute or county ordinance shall contain as a minimum the following information:
 - a. Docket number and the substance of the matter to be heard;
 - General location by address or other identifiable geographical characteristics of the property;
 - c. Name of the person, agency, or entity initiating the matter to be heard;

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- d. Time and place of the hearing;
- e. Statement that the petition may be examined at the Commission office;
- f. Statement that any person may offer verbal comments at the hearing or may file written comments prior to or at the hearing; and
- g. Any other information which may be required by law to be contained in such notice.

Section 2. Posting of Notice

- 1. For an initial or replacement zoning ordinance or a subdivision control ordinance, the Commission shall be required to provide for the publication of notice pursuant to IC 36-7-4-604 at least ten (10) days prior to the public hearing by posting copies of the notice in at least two (2) public places in the county.
- 2. For an amendment to the text of the zoning ordinance, the Commission shall provide notice by means of publication of notice pursuant to IC 36-7-4-604 at least ten (10) days prior to the public hearing by posting copies of the notice in at least two (2) public places in county.
- Section 3. Interested Parties
 - 1. For the purposes of an amendment to the zoning map, interested parties are determined to be all persons with a legal interest in the property and all owners of real property within a distance of six hundred sixty (660) feet or to a depth of two (2) ownerships, whichever is less.
 - 2. For the purposes of approving or vacating a plat, all owners of land in the plat and all owners of real property within a distance of six hundred sixty (660) feet of the property to be platted or to a depth of two (2) ownerships, whichever is less, shall be interested parties.
 - 3. Pursuant to IC 36-7-4-604(c), If the subject of the proposal abuts or includes a county line, or a county line street or road, or a county line body of water, all owners of real property to a depth of two (2) ownerships or 660 feet into the adjacent county, whichever is less, shall be interested parties.
 - 4. The names of property owners to be notified are to be ascertained from the latest real estate tax assessment lists as they appear in the office of the Montgomery County Assessor.

Section 4. Mailing of Notice

1. In addition, the petitioner must notify by, first class mail, all persons deemed by state statute and the Commission to be interested parties at least ten (10) days before the date of the public hearing, pursuant to Article IX.

Section 5 Proof of Notice

- 1. Proof of notice shall be provided prior to the scheduled public hearing.
 - a. Proof of notice shall consist of, at minimum:
 - i. a list of addresses and property owners receiving notice, and

- ii. an affidavit including the name of the party providing notice, the date notice was provided, and a signature affirming notice was provided in compliance with all applicable statutes.
- 2. Petitions failing to provide proof of notice in accordance with this section shall not be heard until compliant notice is provided.

Section 6. Preparation of Notice

- 1. The Plan Commission staff shall prepare the legal advertisement for public hearings for publication in local newspapers.
 - a. The petitioner shall bear the expense of the advertising costs.
 - b. The County staff shall cause the legal notice to be published in local newspapers in compliance with all applicable State statutes
 - i. Any petition which has failed to publish legal notice in local newspapers in compliance with all applicable State statutes shall be not be heard until compliant notice is published.
 - ii. Any petition continued as a result of a failure on the part of County staff to publish appropriate notice shall be without penalty to the petitioner.

Article IX. Conduct of Commission Deliberations and Public Hearings

Section 1. Deliberation of a matter before the Commission,

- 1. A person wishing to speak for or against an application must sign in or be recognized by the presiding officer and must provide his or her address to the Secretary.
 - a. Any person not wishing to speak but wishing to be considered an "interested party" for the purposes of any appeal as per IC 36-7-4-604(c) and Article VIII, Section 3 of these Rules shall either
 - i. sign in on the provided sign in sheet; or
 - ii. shall provide written copy of contact information for the petition file.
- 2. The Planning and Building staff shall read the application, describe the location of the affected area, present the staff opinion and any proposed Findings of Fact (if necessary). Estimated time: 5 minutes.
- 3. The petitioner shall present facts relating to the case, with up to ten (10) minutes being available for the presentation.
 - a. Exhibits, pictures and graphics provided in support of the request shall be made part of the petition file, and shall remain in the petition file upon the completion of the presentation.

- b. Any exhibits provided to the members of the Plan Commission during the presentation shall simultaneously be made available to the Planning and Building staff.
 - i. Reasonable efforts shall be made to simultaneously provide exhibits to any remonstrators, recognizing that the number of remonstrators may be unknown prior to the scheduled hearing.
- 4. The chairperson shall then signify the start of the public hearing and note the time for the record
- 5. Persons or groups who have registered against the proposal shall be provided a total of ten (10) minutes to present objections.
 - a. Any person representing a group or organization shall be allowed a maximum of five (5) minutes to speak.
 - b. Any individual shall be allowed a maximum of three (3) minutes to speak
 - c. The rules pertaining to petitioner's exhibits shall pertain to remonstrator's exhibits as well.
- 6. Persons or groups who have registered in support of the proposal shall be provided a total of ten (10) minutes to present support.
 - a. Any person representing a group or organization shall be allowed a maximum of five (5) minutes to speak.
 - b. Any individual shall be allowed a maximum of three (3) minutes to speak.
 - c. The rules pertaining to petitioner's and remonstrator's exhibits shall pertain to supporters' exhibits as well.
- 7. The chairperson shall then signify the close of the public hearing and note the time for the record.
- 8. The chairperson shall then recognize the petitioner for the purpose of rebuttal for up to five (5) minutes.
 - a. The total presentation and rebuttal period shall not exceed thirty-five (35) minutes.
- 9. Plan Commission members may direct questions to any petitioner, proponent, or opponent, or staff following any presentation.
 - a. Upon conclusion of questioning and discussion, the chairman shall entertain a motion to conclude the public hearing or conclude debate on the motion.

Section 2. Written Comments

- 1. The president shall state the names and their general position on the petition for those persons submitting written comments that are not read aloud.
- 2. Such written comments shall be made part of the case file and shall therefore be part of the public record.
- 3. The president shall close public hearings after the Commission has adequately heard from interested persons and the written comments received.

Section 3. Supporting Documentation - Presentation

- 1. In the presentation of a petition, the burden shall be upon the petitioner to supply all information, including charts, diagrams, and other exhibits necessary for a clear understanding of the matter.
- 2. The Plan Commission may allow petitioners to provide electronic presentations at the hearing.
- 3. Plan Commission staff will provide a projector, the petitioner shall be responsible for making sure documents are of a format to match the software provided or bring their own equipment.
- 4. The Commission may continue the hearing when in its judgment, the petitioner has not provided sufficient evidence on which to make a determination.

Section 4. Conduct

- 1. Every person appearing before the Commission shall abide by the order and directions of the president.
- 2. Discourteous, disorderly, or contemptuous conduct shall be regarded as a breach of the privileges of the Commission and shall be dealt with as the Commission directs.
- 3. The president shall have the authority to prohibit repetitious, immaterial and irrelevant testimony.

Section 5. Continuance

- 1. Any petition may be continued from the scheduled hearing date to a later date for cause.
- 2. Any petition continued more than one (1) month from the original scheduled hearing date shall provide additional mailed legal notice to abutting property owners in accordance with the "Notice "section of these Rules.
- 3. No petition may be continued more than three (3) months from the current scheduled hearing date in a single continuance request.
- 4. No petition may be continued more than six (6) months beyond the original scheduled hearing date.
- 5. Each petition shall be afforded one (1) continuance of one (1) month without penalty or additional fee.
 - a. The petitioner shall request this continuance at any time prior to the vote of the Commission to be without penalty or additional fee.
- 6. The Montgomery County Planning and Building staff may continue each petition one (1) time without express authority of the Plan Commission or agreement of the petitioner.
 - a. Such continuance shall be without penalty or additional fee to the petitioner.
- 7. Individuals or groups opposed to a petition may request a petition be continued, subject to the approval of the Plan Commission.
 - a. Such continuance shall be requested in person at the scheduled public hearing.

- b. Such continuance, if granted, shall be without penalty or additional fee to either the petitioner or the remonstrator(s).
- 8. The Plan Commission may continue any item that has not been dismissed from one meeting to another without further public notice provided that an announcement of the date, time, and place of the reconvened meeting is made at the original meeting and recorded in the minutes.
 - a. Such continuance shall be without penalty or additional fee to the petitioner.

Article X. Disposition of Matters before the Commission

Section 1. Final Disposition

- 1. The final disposition of any matter, including recommendations to the County Commissioners, shall be by a vote of the Commission.
 - a. As required by State statute, the Commission shall set forth its findings and determinations, together with any modification, specification, or limitation, which it makes.

Section 2. Dismissal

- 1. The Commission may dismiss a matter for lack of prosecution or lack of jurisdiction.
 - a. When a petitioner has failed to appear at two (2) consecutive meetings, the case may be dismissed for lack of prosecution.
 - b. Failure by the petitioner to provide adequate legal notice within three
 (3) months of the originally-scheduled hearing date may result in the dismissal of the petition.

Section 3. Withdrawal

- 1. Any petition may be withdrawn by the property owner of record or petitioner's representative at any time prior to the Plan Commission calling for a vote.
 - a. A petition may be withdrawn in writing prior to the scheduled meeting date.
 - b. The Plan Commission shall verbally acknowledge the withdrawal at the scheduled public hearing at which the petition was set for consideration.
 - c. The official date of withdrawal of the petition shall be the date of acknowledgement by the Plan Commission.

Section 4. Re-filing

1. A petition other than a change in zoning request (including a PUD District) which has been withdrawn by the petitioner shall not be again placed on the docket for consideration within a period of six (6) months after the date of withdrawal.

- 2. A petition other than a change in zoning request (including a PUD District) which has been decided adversely to the petitioner shall not again be placed on the docket for consideration until twelve (12) months after the date of decision previously rendered.
- 3. A petition other than a change in zoning request (including a PUD District) which has been dismissed by the Plan Commission shall not again be placed on the docket for consideration for six (6) months after the date of the dismissal.
- 4. A petition other than a change in zoning request (including a PUD District) which is substantially different from the previous petition shall not be subject to the Re-filing rules listed above.
 - a. The determination of "substantially different" shall be made by the acting Zoning Administrator of Montgomery County.
 - b. The determination of the Zoning Administrator may be appealed in accordance with State statute.

Article XI. Reconsideration

Section 1. Reconsideration of Rezoning

- 1. The Commission may not further consider a petition to amend the zoning map which has been rejected by the County Commissioners, or upon which the County Commissioners have failed to act, for twelve (12) months.
 - a. Where the Zoning Administrator determines that a subsequent petition to amend the zoning map for the same property is substantially different from prior petition, the time limit listed above shall not apply.
 - b. The determination of "substantially different" shall be made by the acting Zoning Administrator of Montgomery County.
 - c. The determination of the Zoning Administrator may be appealed in accordance with State statute.

Article XII. Document Submissions and Review

Section 1. Forms

- 1. All documents, exhibits, plans, plats and other items required for Plan Commissions action under the County's zoning ordinance or other ordinances or state statutes, must be submitted in the form and pursuant to the process required by the County's ordinances and state statutes.
- 2. Subject to any greater filing requirement imposed by the County's ordinances or state statutes, all documents, exhibits, plans, plats and other items for which the County's ordinances, these rules or Commission staff require review by the County's consulting engineering firm shall be submitted to the Commission staff at least fifty (50) days in advance of the Plan Commission meeting at which petitioner seeks Commission action.

Article XIII. Amendments

Amendments to these Rules of Procedure may be made by the Commission at any regular or special meeting upon the affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the Commission. The suspension of any rule of the Commission may be ordered at any meeting upon the affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the Commission or by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the quorum, whichever is less.

Article XIV. Repeal

All previous rules and regulations heretofore adopted by the Montgomery County Advisory Plan Commission are hereby expressly repealed, as of the effective date of these rules.

Through these specifications the Board of Commissioners ("Board") of Montgomery County, Indiana ("County") seeks to contract with public or private persons, entities, or corporations for the purpose of providing and maintaining emergency medical and ambulance services (the "Contracted Services") in designated areas of Montgomery County, Indiana pursuant to Indiana Code ("IC") 16-31-1, et seq. (the "Act"). Qualified Proposers include any private or public entities, or corporations registered to do business in Indiana and it in good standing with the State of Indiana.

1. The successful Proposer(s) ("Successful Proposer") will be held to those standards of care required by the Indiana Emergency Medical Services Commission (the "Commission") and shall always comply with and adhere to all rules and regulations of the Commission. Such rules and regulations are by this reference incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

2. The contract contemplated to be entered into will be based upon proposals for the provision of Contracted Services submitted in response to the County's Request for Proposals ("RFP"). Use herein of the terms "proposal," or "quote" or the derivative terms "proposer" or "quoter" shall be deemed to be interchangeable. The solicitation for such proposals, quotes shall, insofar as practicable, be pursuant to the procedures set forth at IC 5-22-9, et. seq., recognizing however, that these specifications, and the RFP that will issue herein, are for the County's proposed purchase of the Contracted Services and as such, fall under the purview of IC 5-22-6, et. seq.

3. The Successful Proposer agrees to provide emergency medical services on a 24 hours per day/seven days per week basis to persons requiring emergency medical care throughout Montgomery County referenced in the particular contract during the period from January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2032, both dates inclusive, in accordance with all terms, conditions and provisions set forth in these specifications. Award of the contract herein contemplated shall be subject to the absolute condition precedent to the obligations of County that there are sufficient annual appropriations to fund the Contracted Services to be provided pursuant to the contract in each of the contract years.

4. Proposers for Montgomery County EMS agree to provide those minimum levels of emergency medical service described above in accordance with IC 16-31-1 et seq. and 836 IAC 1-1, et. seq.

5. The Successful Proposer must hold a currently valid certificate issued by the Commission authorizing the Successful Proposer to engage in the provision of emergency medical services as a part of its regular course of business as provided in the Act.

6. The Successful Proposer shall provide fully equipped ambulance(s) capable of responding to a call for assistance within the "Maximum Acceptable Response Time" as hereinafter defined. Each such ambulance shall be staffed by at least the minimum personnel

required by the Commission. The Successful Proposer shall have staff duly certified at a Paramedic level of certification by the Commission to provide advance life support (ALS) service for those emergencies requiring such level of support in accordance with the regulations of the Commission and pursuant to protocols developed by the County in consultation with the Franciscan Health Crawfordsville Medical Control. All vehicles, supplies and equipment of the Successful Proposer shall be maintained in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Commission. Though the Successful Proposer is not obligated to use Franciscan Health Crawfordsville Medical Control as a supervising hospital, the Successful Proposer shall submit all patient care protocols to Franciscan Health Crawfordsville Medical Control Medical Control for its review. All providers are to adhere, when applicable, to Advanced Life Support intercept protocols as established by the Medical Control Committee.

7. For purposes of these specifications and for assessment of the Successful Proposer's performance in its delivery of the Contracted Services, the term "Maximum Acceptable Response Time" means "enroute to call" within two (2) minutes of dispatched time with an arrival on scene time of fifteen (15) minutes or less, and a total time of seventeen (17) minutes or less from receipt of dispatched call by the ambulance provider to its arrival at the scene of the emergency. Acceptable performance will require that the Successful Proposer meet the Maximum Acceptable Response Time in at least ninety percent (90%) of the dispatched calls to which the Successful Proposer responds.

8. Compliance with the 90% requirements on emergency calls must be met in Montgomery County. This requirement will be reviewed by the County and the Quality Assurance team each month for compliance. Failure to meet this requirement may result in an "Action Plan" that addresses the issues in response times and a delay in monthly contractual payments.

9. The Successful Proposer shall maintain a complete and current listing of personnel to be employed as paramedics, emergency medical technicians, and ambulance drivers. All records required by the Commission to be maintained by the Successful Proposer shall be made available for inspection by the duly authorized representative of the County, or its authorized representative, may at reasonable times, also inspect the premises at which ambulances and ambulance supplies are stored.

10. Each Successful Proposer shall submit with its proposal documents the following supplemental information.

- a) A profile of the medical equipment and rolling stock to be utilized by the Successful Proposer in performing the contract, to include identification of an adequate level of available resources to provide an acceptable level of service meeting or exceeding the standards of the Maximum Acceptable Response Time within the geographical area covered by the proposal alternate(s).
- b) The Successful Proposer's back-up service policies and procedures to be implemented in the event the Successful Proposer is unable to respond to an emergency as otherwise required herein.
- c) The Successful Proposer's proposal regarding how it will provide Advanced Life Support (ALS) services and coordinate with ALS providers, including mutual aid agreements, where necessary.

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d) A description of the training programs and requirements established by the Successful Proposer for its employees.

e) A description of the proposer's implementation and operational practices in use of the Incident Command System (ICS) as developed under the National Incident Management System (NIMS) when engaged in multi-agency response operations.

- A description of the Proposer's procedures and support services for effective response to mass casualty incidents.
- g) A description of the Proposer's fixed and mobile radio communications system(s) that demonstrates interoperable communications capabilities between the proposer Emergency Medical Responders (EMR) and other EMS providers, the Montgomery County Central Communications Center, Hospital, and supporting/assisting agencies. The successful Proposer must, at its costs, have and maintain operable radio communication systems and devices as to enable it to be directly dispatched on a call by the Montgomery County Emergency Communication's Center.
- h) A listing and description of any other emergency medical or ambulance operations in which the Successful Proposer is engaged, either alone or in concert with other providers.
- i) Current and verifiable references that County may contact.
- j) Experiences with other government entities in providing emergency medical services.
- k) A copy of the Proposer's operating authority issued by the Commission.
- Authorization for County to conduct a background investigation prior to awarding the proposal, both as to the criminal and the credit history, of the Successful Proposer, its identified owners of more than ten percent (10%) of the equity interest therein, and its chief operating officer representing the Successful Proposer.
- m) A copy of their employee drug control policy.
- n) The name and contact information of their training officer.

11. The Successful Proposer shall always during the period of the Contracted Services remain an independent contractor and at no time shall any employee of the Successful Proposer be considered an employee of County. The Successful Proposer expressly agrees to indemnify and hold harmless County, its officers, officials, agents, servants, and employees, from all claims, losses, damages, injuries, and liabilities however caused, resulting from, or arising out of, or in any way connected with the Successful Proposer's performance of the Contracted Services herein contemplated.

12. Satisfactory insurance coverage is a condition precedent to the award, issuance, maintenance, and renewal of any contract to the Successful Proposer. The Successful Proposer must present satisfactory evidence of full compliance with any insurance requirements of the Commission or those stipulated below, whichever are the more stringent. In the absence of higher statutory or regulatory minimums, the Successful Proposer shall maintain general, public liability and property damage insurance coverage as well as coverage for any claims which may be made under worker's compensation, disability' benefit and/or other similar employee benefit acts, as well as any claims for damages because of bodily injury, sickness, disease or death of any person or employees or from claims for any damages because of injury to or destruction of tangible property, including the loss of use resulting therefrom. Specifically, the Successful Proposer(s)

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will be required to maintain comprehensive automobile liability insurance with limits in the amounts of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per person and Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) per occurrence with corresponding property damage liability limits to be not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), combined single limit bodily injury and/or property damage liability. Performance of any contractual obligations comprising the Contracted Services of the Successful Proposer shall not be assigned or delegated without the prior written consent of County, except for short-term delegations to other emergency responders pursuant to Mutual Aid Agreements to which the successful Proposer and the other emergency responder are parties.

16. Each Proposer shall prepare and submit its proposal and include therewith an affidavit of non-collusion to the effect that the Proposer has not entered into any agreement, combination or undertaking with any other entity to discourage said entity from proposing or to affect the substantive content of any such proposal. All required support documentation and information shall accompany the proposal. In addition, each Proposer shall deposit with its proposal a certified check, cashier's check, or proposal bond payable to Montgomery County,

22. The Proposal shall re supply the First Responders with disposable items used by the First Responder in the treatment of patients that are turned over to the Proposer.

Data Reporting Requirements

The Proposer must be capable of producing the following reports to be submitted to the County or designee monthly no later than the second Monday of the month:

- a. Number of Non-emergency responses and response time data.
- b. Number of Emergency responses and response time data.

c. Response times by call, to include time/date dispatched, time arrived on scene and onscene time. Confidential information as name and address of patient should not be included.

Ambulance Transport Fees

The Proposer shall furnish a proposed ambulance service fee schedule, which is comparative to other ambulance services operating at the same level, in the State of Indiana. The rate schedule will be the maximum rate Proposer will charge a patient for rendering services during the Term of the contract. Proposer shall include the rate schedule for years one (1) and two (2) of the Contract. The Successful Proposer shall submit rate schedules for years three (3) through ten (10), annually on or before December 1st of the prior year.

Character Competence and Professionalism of Personnel

County always expects and requires professional and courteous conduct and appearance from the Proposer's field personnel, medical communications personnel, middle managers, and top executives.

Final Terms and Conditions negotiated and mutually agreed upon by the County and Successful Proposer will be included in the Contract.

Acceptance

LPA - CONSULTING CONTRACT

This Contract ("this Contract") is made and entered into effective as of ______, 2022 ("Effective Date") by and between Montgomery County Commissioners, acting by and through its proper officials ("LOCAL PUBLIC AGENCY" or "LPA"), and HWC Engineering ("the CONSULTANT"), a corporation/limited liability company organized under the laws of the State of Indiana.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the LPA has entered into an agreement to utilize federal monies with the Indiana Department of Transportation ("INDOT") for a transportation or transportation enhancement project ("the Project"), which Project Coordination Contract is herein attached as Attachment 1 and incorporated as reference; and

WHEREAS, the LPA wishes to hire the CONSULTANT to provide services toward the Project completion more fully described in Appendix "A" attached hereto ("Services");

WHEREAS, the CONSULTANT has extensive experience, knowledge and expertise relating to these Services; and

WHEREAS, the CONSULTANT has expressed a willingness to furnish the Services in connection therewith.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the following mutual covenants, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree as follows:

The "Recitals" above are hereby made an integral part and specifically incorporated into this Contract.

SECTION I SERVICES BY CONSULTANT. The CONSULTANT will provide the Services and deliverables described in Appendix "A" which is herein attached to and made an integral part of this Contract.

SECTION II INFORMATION AND SERVICES TO BE FURNISHED BY THE LPA. The information and services to be furnished by the LPA are set out in Appendix "B" which is herein attached to and made an integral part of this Contract.

SECTION III TERM. The term of this Contract shall be from the date of the last signature affixed to this Contract to the completion of the construction contract which is estimated to be <u>December 31, 2027</u>. A schedule for completion of the Services and deliverables is set forth in Appendix "C" which is herein attached to and made an integral part of this Contract.

SECTION IV COMPENSATION. The LPA shall pay the CONSULTANT for the Services performed under this Contract as set forth in Appendix "D" which is herein attached to and made an integral part of this Contract. The maximum amount payable under this Contract shall not exceed \$ 65,296.10.

SECTION V NOTICE TO PROCEED AND SCHEDULE. The CONSULTANT shall begin the work to be performed under this Contract only upon receipt of the written notice to proceed from the LPA, and shall deliver the work to the LPA in accordance with the schedule contained in Appendix "C" which is herein attached to and made an integral part of this Contract.

SECTION VI GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. <u>Access to Records</u>. The CONSULTANT and any SUB-CONSULTANTS shall maintain all books, documents, papers, correspondence, accounting records and other evidence pertaining to the cost incurred under this Contract, and shall make such materials available at their respective offices at all reasonable times during the period of this Contract and for five (5) years from the date of final payment under the terms of this Contract, for inspection or audit by the LPA, INDOT and/or the Federal Highway Administration ("FHWA") or its authorized representative, and copies thereof shall be furnished free of charge, if requested by the LPA, INDOT, and/or FHWA. The CONSULTANT agrees that, upon request by any agency participating in federally-assisted programs with whom the CONSULTANT has contracted or seeks to contract, the CONSULTANT may release or make available to the agency any working papers from an audit performed by the LPA, INDOT and/or FHWA of the CONSULTANT and its SUB-CONSULTANTS in connection with this Contract, including any books, documents, papers, accounting records and other documentation which support or form the basis for the audit conclusions and judgments.

2. Assignment; Successors.

- A. The CONSULTANT binds its successors and assignees to all the terms and conditions of this Contract. The CONSULTANT shall not assign or subcontract the whole or any part of this Contract without the LPA's prior written consent, except that the CONSULTANT may assign its right to receive payments to such third parties as the CONSULTANT may desire without the prior written consent of the LPA, provided that the CONSULTANT gives written notice (including evidence of such assignment) to the LPA thirty (30) days in advance of any payment so assigned. The assignment shall cover all unpaid amounts under this Contract and shall not be made to more than one party.
- B. Any substitution of SUB-CONSULTANTS must first be approved and receive written authorization from the LPA. Any substitution or termination of a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise ("DBE") SUB-CONSULTANT must first be approved and receive written authorization from the LPA and INDOT's Economic Opportunity Division Director.
- **3.** <u>Audit</u>. The CONSULTANT acknowledges that it may be required to submit to an audit of funds paid through this Contract. Any such audit shall be conducted in accordance with 48 CFR part 31 and audit guidelines specified by the State and/or in accordance with audit requirements specified elsewhere in this Contract.
- 4. <u>Authority to Bind Consultant</u>. The CONSULTANT warrants that it has the necessary authority to enter into this Contract. The signatory for the CONSULTANT represents that he/she has been duly authorized to execute this Contract on behalf of the CONSULTANT and has obtained all necessary or applicable approval to make this Contract fully binding upon the CONSULTANT when his/her signature is affixed hereto.

5. <u>Certification for Federal-Aid Contracts Lobbying Activities</u>.

- A. The CONSULTANT certifies, by signing and submitting this Contract, to the best of its knowledge and belief after diligent inquiry, and other than as disclosed in writing to the LPA prior to or contemporaneously with the execution and delivery of this Contract by the CONSULTANT, the CONSULTANT has complied with Section 1352, Title 31, U.S. Code, and specifically, that:
 - i. No federal appropriated funds have been paid, or will be paid, by or on behalf of the CONSULTANT to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any federal agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any federal contracts, the making of any federal grant, the making of any federal loan, the

entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.

- ii. If any funds other than federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any Federal agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this federal Contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.
- B. The CONSULTANT also agrees by signing this Contract that it shall require that the language of this certification be included in all lower tier subcontracts, which exceed \$100,000, and that all such sub-recipients shall certify and disclose accordingly. Any person who fails to sign or file this required certification shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$100,000 for each failure.
- 6. <u>Changes in Work</u>. The CONSULTANT shall not commence any additional work or change the scope of the work until authorized in writing by the LPA. The CONSULTANT shall make no claim for additional compensation or time in the absence of a prior written approval and amendment executed by all signatories hereto. This Contract may be amended, supplemented or modified only by a written document executed in the same manner as this Contract. The CONSULTANT acknowledges that no claim for additional compensation or time may be made by implication, oral agreements, actions, inaction, or course of conduct.

7. <u>Compliance with Laws</u>.

- A. The CONSULTANT shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances, and all provisions required thereby to be included herein are hereby incorporated by reference. If the CONSULTANT violates such rules, laws, regulations and ordinances, the CONSULTANT shall assume full responsibility for such violations and shall bear any and all costs attributable to the original performance of any correction of such acts. The enactment of any state or federal statute, or the promulgation of regulations thereunder, after execution of this Contract, shall be reviewed by the LPA and the CONSULTANT to determine whether formal modifications are required to the provisions of this Contract.
- B. The CONSULTANT represents to the LPA that, to the best of the CONSULTANT'S knowledge and belief after diligent inquiry and other than as disclosed in writing to the LPA prior to or contemporaneously with the execution and delivery of this Contract by the CONSULTANT:
 - State of Indiana Actions. The CONSULTANT has no current or outstanding criminal, civil, or enforcement actions initiated by the State of Indiana pending, and agrees that it will immediately notify the LPA of any such actions. During the term of such actions, CONSULTANT agrees that the LPA may delay, withhold, or deny work under any supplement or amendment, change order or other contractual device issued pursuant to this Contract.
 - ii. *Professional Licensing Standards*. The CONSULTANT, its employees and SUBCONSULTANTS have complied with and shall continue to comply with all applicable licensing standards, certification standards, accrediting standards and any other laws, rules or regulations governing services to be provided by the CONSULTANT pursuant to this Contract.

- iii. *Work Specific Standards.* The CONSULTANT and its SUB-CONSULTANTS, if any, have obtained, will obtain and/or will maintain all required permits, licenses, registrations and approvals, as well as comply with all health, safety, and environmental statutes, rules, or regulations in the performance of work activities for the LPA.
- Secretary of State Registration. If the CONSULTANT is an entity described in IC Title 23, it is properly registered and owes no outstanding reports with the Indiana Secretary of State.
- v. Debarment and Suspension of CONSULTANT. Neither the CONSULTANT nor its principals are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from entering into this Contract by any federal agency or by any department, agency or political subdivision of the State and will immediately notify the LPA of any such actions. The term "principal" for purposes of this Contract means an officer, director, owner, partner, key employee, or other person with primary management or supervisory responsibilities, or a person who has a critical influence on or substantive control over the operations of the CONSULTANT or who has managerial or supervisory responsibilities for the Services.
- vi. Debarment and Suspension of any SUB-CONSULTANTS. The CONSULTANT's SUB-CONSULTANTS are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from entering into this Contract by any federal agency or by any department, agency or political subdivision of the State. The CONSULTANT shall be solely responsible for any recoupment, penalties or costs that might arise from the use of a suspended or debarred SUBCONSULTANT. The CONSULTANT shall immediately notify the LPA and INDOT if any SUB-CONSULTANT becomes debarred or suspended, and shall, at the LPA's request, take all steps required by the LPA to terminate its contractual relationship with the SUB-CONSULTANT for work to be performed under this Contract.
- C. *Violations.* In addition to any other remedies at law or in equity, upon CONSULTANT'S violation of any of Section 7(A) through 7(B), the LPA may, at its sole discretion, do any one or more of the following:
 - i. terminate this Contract; or
 - delay, withhold, or deny work under any supplement or amendment, change order or other contractual device issued pursuant to this Contract.
- D. Disputes. If a dispute exists as to the CONSULTANT's liability or guilt in any action initiated by the LPA, and the LPA decides to delay, withhold, or deny work to the CONSULTANT, the CONSULTANT may request that it be allowed to continue, or receive work, without delay. The CONSULTANT must submit, in writing, a request for review to the LPA. A determination by the LPA under this Section 7.D shall be final and binding on the parties and not subject to administrative review. Any payments the LPA may delay, withhold, deny, or apply under this section shall not be subject to penalty or interest under IC 5-17-5.
- 8. <u>Condition of Payment</u>. The CONSULTANT must perform all Services under this Contract to the LPA's reasonable satisfaction, as determined at the discretion of the LPA and in accordance with all applicable federal, state, local laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations. The LPA will not pay for work not performed to the LPA's reasonable satisfaction, inconsistent with this Contract or performed in violation of federal, state, or local law (collectively, "deficiencies") until all deficiencies are remedied in a timely manner.

9. <u>Confidentiality of LPA Information</u>.

- A. The CONSULTANT understands and agrees that data, materials, and information disclosed to the CONSULTANT may contain confidential and protected information. Therefore, the CONSULTANT covenants that data, material, and information gathered, based upon or disclosed to the CONSULTANT for the purpose of this Contract, will not be disclosed to others or discussed with third parties without the LPA's prior written consent.
- B. The parties acknowledge that the Services to be performed by the CONSULTANT for the LPA under this Contract may require or allow access to data, materials, and information containing Social Security numbers and maintained by the LPA in its computer system or other records. In addition to the covenant made above in this section and pursuant to 10 IAC 5-3-1(4), the CONSULTANT and the LPA agree to comply with the provisions of IC 4-1-10 and IC 4-1-11. If any Social Security number(s) is/are disclosed by the CONSULTANT, the CONSULTANT agrees to pay the cost of the notice of disclosure of a breach of the security of the system in addition to any other claims and expenses for which it is liable under the terms of this Contract.
- 10. Delays and Extensions. The CONSULTANT agrees that no charges or claim for damages shall be made by it for any minor delays from any cause whatsoever during the progress of any portion of the Services specified in this Contract. Such delays, if any, shall be compensated for by an extension of time for such period as may be determined by the LPA subject to the CONSULTANT's approval, it being understood, however, that permitting the CONSULTANT to proceed to complete any services, or any part of them after the date to which the time of completion may have been extended, shall in no way operate as a waiver on the part of the LPA of any of its rights herein. In the event of substantial delays or extensions, or change of any kind, not caused by the CONSULTANT, which causes a material change in scope, character or complexity of work the CONSULTANT is to perform under this Contract, the LPA at its sole discretion shall determine any adjustments in compensation and in the schedule for completion of the Services. CONSULTANT must notify the LPA in writing of a material change in the work immediately after the CONSULTANT first recognizes the material change.

11. DBE Requirements.

A. Notice is hereby given to the CONSULTANT and any SUB-CONSULTANT, and both agree, that failure to carry out the requirements set forth in 49 CFR Sec. 26.13(b) shall constitute a breach of this Contract and, after notification and failure to promptly cure such breach, may result in termination of this Contract or such remedy as INDOT deems appropriate. The referenced section requires the following assurance to be included in all subsequent contracts between the CONSULTANT and any SUB-CONSULTANT:

The CONSULTANT, sub recipient or SUB-CONSULTANT shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the performance of this Contract. The CONSULTANT shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 CFR Part 26 in the award and administration of DOT-assisted contracts. Failure by the CONSULTANT to carry out these requirements is a material breach of this Contract, which may result in the termination of this Contract or such other remedy, as INDOT, as the recipient, deems appropriate.

B. The CONSULTANT shall make good faith efforts to achieve the DBE percentage goal that may be included as part of this Contract with the approved DBE SUB-CONSULTANTS identified on its Affirmative Action Certification submitted with its Letter of Interest, or with approved amendments. Any changes to a DBE firm listed in the Affirmative Action Certification must be requested in writing and receive prior approval by the LPA and INDOT's Economic Opportunity Division Director. After this Contract is completed and if a DBE SUB-CONSULTANT has performed services thereon, the CONSULTANT must complete, and return, a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Utilization Affidavit ("DBE-3 Form") to INDOT's Economic Opportunity Division Director. The DBE-3 Form requires certification by the CONSULTANT AND DBE SUB-CONSULTANT that the committed contract amounts have been paid and received.

12. <u>Non-Discrimination</u>.

- A. Pursuant to I.C. 22-9-1-10, the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and the Americans with Disabilities Act, the CONSULTANT shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment, to be employed in the performance of work under this Contract, with respect to hire, tenure, terms, conditions or privileges of employment or any matter directly or indirectly related to employment, because of race, color, religion, sex, disability, national origin, ancestry or status as a veteran. Breach of this covenant may be regarded as a material breach of this Contract. Acceptance of this Contract also signifies compliance with applicable federal laws, regulations, and executive orders prohibiting discrimination in the provision of services based on race, color, national origin, age, sex, disability or status as a veteran.
- B The CONSULTANT understands that the LPA is a recipient of federal funds. Pursuant to that understanding, the CONSULTANT agrees that if the CONSULTANT employs fifty (50) or more employees and does at least \$50,000.00 worth of business with the State and is not exempt, the CONSULTANT will comply with the affirmative action reporting requirements of 41 CFR 60-1.7. The CONSULTANT shall comply with Section 202 of executive order 11246, as amended, 41 CFR 60-250, and 41 CFR 60-741, as amended, which are incorporated herein by specific reference. Breach of this covenant may be regarded as a material breach of Contract.

It is the policy of INDOT to assure full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Americans with Disabilities Act and Section 504 of the Vocational Rehabilitation Act and related statutes and regulations in all programs and activities. - C. The CONSULTANT shall not discriminate in its selection and retention of contractors, including without limitation, those services retained for, or incidental to, construction, planning, research, engineering, property management, and fee contracts and other commitments with persons for services and expenses incidental to the acquisitions of right-of-way.
- D. The CONSULTANT shall not modify the Project in such a manner as to require, on the basis of race, color or national origin, the relocation of any persons. (INDOT's Title VI enforcement will include the following additional grounds; sex, ancestry, age, income status, religion and disability).

- F. - G. The CONSULTANT shall take appropriate actions to correct any deficiency determined by itself and/or the Federal Highway Administration ("FHWA") within a reasonable time period, not to exceed ninety (90) days, in order to implement Title VI compliance in accordance with INDOT's assurances and guidelines.
- H. During the performance of this Contract, the CONSULTANT, for itself, its assignees and successors in interest (hereinafter referred to as the "CONSULTANT") agrees as follows:

 - (3) Solicitations for SUBCONSULTANTS, Including Procurements of Materials and Equipment: In all solicitations either by competitive bidding or negotiation made by the CONSULTANT for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurements of materials or leases of equipment, each potential SUBCONSULTANT or supplier shall be notified by the CONSULTANT of the CONSULTANT'S obligations under this Contract and the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination on the grounds of race, color, or national origin.
 - (4) Information and Reports: The CONSULTANT shall provide all information and reports required by the Regulations or directives issued pursuant thereto, and shall permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as may be determined by the LPA or INDOT to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such Regulations, orders and instructions. Where any information required of a CONSULTANT is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information the CONSULTANT shall so certify to the LPA, or INDOT as appropriate, and shall set forth what efforts it has made to obtain the information.
 - (5) Sanctions for Noncompliance: In the event of the CONSULTANT'S noncompliance with the nondiscrimination provisions of this contract, the LPA shall impose such contract sanctions as it or INDOT may determine to be appropriate, including, but not limited to:
 - (a) withholding of payments to the CONSULTANT under the Contract until the CONSULTANT complies, and/or
 - (b) cancellation, termination or suspension of the Contract, in whole or in part.
 - (6) Incorporation of Provisions: The CONSULTANT shall include the provisions of paragraphs (1) through (6) in every subcontract, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment, unless exempt by the Regulations, or directives issued pursuant thereto.

The CONSULTANT shall take such action with respect to any SUBCONSULTANT procurement as the LPA or INDOT may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for noncompliance: Provided, however, that, in the event a CONSULTANT becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a SUBCONSULTANT or supplier as a result of such direction, the CONSULTANT may request the LPA to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the LPA, and, in addition, the CONSULTANT may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

13. Disputes.

- A. Should any disputes arise with respect to this Contract, the CONSULTANT and the LPA agree to act promptly and in good faith to resolve such disputes in accordance with this Section 13. Time is of the essence in the resolution of disputes.
- B. The CONSULTANT agrees that the existence of a dispute notwithstanding, it will continue without delay to carry out all of its responsibilities under this Contract that are not affected by the dispute. Should the CONSULTANT fail to continue to perform its responsibilities regarding all non-disputed work, without delay, any additional costs (including reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses) incurred by the LPA or the CONSULTANT as a result of such failure to proceed shall be borne by the CONSULTANT.
- C. If a party to this Contract is not satisfied with the progress toward resolving a dispute, the party must notify the other party of this dissatisfaction in writing. Upon written notice, the parties have ten (10) business days, unless the parties mutually agree in writing to extend this period, following the written notification to resolve the dispute. If the dispute is not resolved within ten (10) business days, a dissatisfied party may submit the dispute in writing to initiate negotiations to resolve the dispute. The LPA may withhold payments on disputed items pending resolution of the dispute.

14. Drug-Free Workplace Certification.

- A. The CONSULTANT hereby covenants and agrees to make a good faith effort to provide and maintain a drug-free workplace, and that it will give written notice to the LPA within ten (10) days after receiving actual notice that an employee of the CONSULTANT in the State of Indiana has been convicted of a criminal drug violation occurring in the CONSULTANT's workplace. False certification or violation of the certification may result in sanctions including, but not limited to, suspension of Contract payments, termination of this Contract and/or debarment of contracting opportunities with the LPA.
- B. The CONSULTANT certifies and agrees that it will provide a drug-free workplace by:
 - Publishing and providing to all of its employees a statement notifying their employees that the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensing, possession or use of a controlled substance is prohibited in the CONSULTANT's workplace and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition;
 - ii. Establishing a drug-free awareness program to inform its employees of (1) the dangers of drug abuse in the workplace; (2) the CONSULTANT's policy of maintaining a drug-free workplace; (3) any available drug counseling, rehabilitation, and employee assistance programs; and (4) the penalties that may be imposed upon an employee for drug abuse violations occurring in the workplace;

- iii. Notifying all employees in the statement required by subparagraph 14.B.i above that as a condition of continued employment, the employee will (1) abide by the terms of the statement; and (2) notify the CONSULTANT of any criminal drug statute conviction for a violation occurring in the workplace no later than five (5) days after such conviction;
- iv. Notifying in writing the LPA within ten (10) days after receiving notice from an employee under subdivision 14.B.iii(2) above, or otherwise receiving actual notice of such conviction;
- v. Within thirty (30) days after receiving notice under subdivision 14.B.iii(2) above of a conviction, imposing the following sanctions or remedial measures on any employee who is convicted of drug abuse violations occurring in the workplace: (1) take appropriate personnel action against the employee, up to and including termination; or (2) require such employee to satisfactorily participate in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a Federal, State or local health, law enforcement, or other appropriate agency; and
- vi. Making a good faith effort to maintain a drug-free workplace through the implementation of subparagraphs 14.B.i. through 14.B.v. above.
- **15.** <u>Employment Eligibility Verification</u>. The CONSULTANT affirms under the penalties of perjury that he/she/it does not knowingly employ an unauthorized alien.

The CONSULTANT shall enroll in and verify the work eligibility status of all his/her/its newly hired employees through the E-Verify program as defined in IC 22-5-1.7-3. The CONSULTANT is not required to participate should the E-Verify program cease to exist. Additionally, the CONSULTANT is not required to participate if the CONSULTANT is self-employed and does not employ any employees.

The CONSULTANT shall not knowingly employ or contract with an unauthorized alien. The CONSULTANT shall not retain an employee or contract with a person that the CONSULTANT subsequently learns is an unauthorized alien.

The CONSULTANT shall require his/her/its subcontractors, who perform work under this Contract, to certify to the CONSULTANT that the SUB-CONSULTANT does not knowingly employ or contract with an unauthorized alien and that the SUB-CONSULTANT has enrolled and is participating in the E-Verify program. The CONSULTANT agrees to maintain this certification throughout the duration of the term of a contract with a SUB-CONSULTANT.

The LPA may terminate for default if the CONSULTANT fails to cure a breach of this provision no later than thirty (30) days after being notified by the LPA.

16. Force Majeure. In the event that either party is unable to perform any of its obligations under this Contract or to enjoy any of its benefits because of fire, natural disaster, acts of God, acts of war, terrorism, civil disorders, decrees of governmental bodies, strikes, lockouts, labor or supply disruptions or similar causes beyond the reasonable control of the affected party (hereinafter referred to as a Force Majeure Event), the party who has been so affected shall immediately give written notice to the other party of the occurrence of the Force Majeure Event (with a description in reasonable detail of the circumstances causing such Event) and shall do everything reasonably possible to resume performance. Upon receipt of such written notice, all obligations under this Contract shall be immediately suspended for as long as such Force Majeure Event continues and provided that the affected party continues to use commercially reasonable efforts to recommence performance whenever and to whatever extent possible without delay. If the period of nonperformance exceeds thirty (30) days from the receipt of written notice of the Force Majeure Event, the party whose ability to perform has not been so affected may, by giving written notice, terminate this Contract.

- 17. <u>Governing Laws</u>. This Contract shall be construed in accordance with and governed by the laws of the State of Indiana and the suit, if any, must be brought in the State of Indiana. The CONSULTANT consents to the jurisdiction of and to venue in any court of competent jurisdiction in the State of Indiana.
- **18.** <u>Liability</u>. If the CONSULTANT or any of its SUB-CONSULTANTS fail to comply with any federal requirement which results in the LPA's repayment of federal funds to INDOT the CONSULTANT shall be responsible to the LPA, for repayment of such costs to the extent such costs are caused by the CONSULTANT and/or its SUB-CONSULTANTS.
- 19. Indemnification. The CONSULTANT agrees to indemnify the LPA, and their agents, officials, and employees, and to hold each of them harmless, from claims and suits including court costs, attorney's fees, and other expenses caused by any negligent act, error or omission of, or by any recklessness or willful misconduct by, the CONSULTANT and/or its SUB-CONSULTANTS, if any, under this Contract, provided that if the CONSULTANT is a "contractor" within the meaning of I.C. 8-3-2-12.5, this indemnity obligation shall be limited by and interpreted in accordance with I.C. 8-23-2-12-5. The LPA shall not provide such indemnification to the CONSULTANT.
- 20. Independent Contractor. Both parties hereto, in the performance of this Contract, shall act in an individual capacity and not as agents, employees, partners, joint ventures or associates of one another. The employees or agents of one party shall not be deemed or construed to be the employees or agents of the other party for any purposes whatsoever. Neither party will assume liability for any injury (including death) to any persons, or damage to any property, arising out of the acts or omissions of the agents or employees of the other party. The CONSULTANT shall be responsible for providing all necessary unemployment and workers' compensation insurance for its employees.

21. <u>Insurance - Liability for Damages</u>.

- A. The CONSULTANT shall be responsible for the accuracy of the Services performed under this Contract and shall promptly make necessary revisions or corrections resulting from its negligence, errors or omissions without any additional compensation from the LPA. Acceptance of the Services by the LPA shall not relieve the CONSULTANT of responsibility for subsequent correction of its negligent act, error or omission or for clarification of ambiguities. The CONSULTANT shall have no liability for the errors or deficiencies in designs, drawings, specifications or other services furnished to the CONSULTANT by the LPA on which the Consultant has reasonably relied, provided that the foregoing shall not relieve the CONSULTANT from any liability from the CONSULTANT'S failure to fulfill its obligations under this Contract, to exercise its professional responsibilities to the LPA, or to notify the LPA of any errors or deficiencies which the CONSULTANT knew or should have known existed.
- B. During construction or any phase of work performed by others based on Services provided by the CONSULTANT, the CONSULTANT shall confer with the LPA when necessary for the purpose of interpreting the information, and/or to correct any negligent act, error or omission. The CONSULTANT shall prepare any plans or data needed to correct the negligent act, error or omission without additional compensation, even though final payment may have been received by the CONSULTANT. The CONSULTANT shall give immediate attention to these changes for a minimum of delay to the project.
- C. The CONSULTANT shall be responsible for damages including but not limited to direct and indirect damages incurred by the LPA as a result of any negligent act, error or omission of the CONSULTANT, and for the LPA's losses or costs to repair or remedy construction. Acceptance of the Services by the LPA shall not relieve the CONSULTANT of responsibility for subsequent correction.

- D. The CONSULTANT shall be required to maintain in full force and effect, insurance as described below from the date of the first authorization to proceed until the LPA's acceptance of the work product. The CONSULTANT shall list both the LPA and INDOT as insureds on any policies. The CONSULTANT must obtain insurance written by insurance companies authorized to transact business in the State of Indiana and licensed by the Department of Insurance as either admitted or non-admitted insurers.
- E. The LPA, its officers and employees assume no responsibility for the adequacy of limits and coverage in the event of any claims against the CONSULTANT, its officers, employees, subconsultants or any agent of any of them, and the obligations of indemnification in Section 19 herein shall survive the exhaustion of limits of coverage and discontinuance of coverage beyond the term specified, to the fullest extent of the law.
- F. The CONSULTANT shall furnish a certificate of insurance and all endorsements to the LPA prior to the commencement of this Contract. Any deductible or self-insured retention amount or other similar obligation under the insurance policies shall be the sole obligation of the CONSULTANT. Failure to provide insurance as required in this Contract is a material breach of Contract entitling the LPA to immediately terminate this Contract.
 - I. Professional Liability Insurance

The CONSULTANT must obtain and carry professional liability insurance as follows: For INDOT Prequalification **Work Types** 1.1, 12.2-12.6 the CONSULTANTS shall provide not less than \$250,000.00 professional liability insurance per claim and \$250.000.00 aggregate for all claims for negligent performance. For **Work Types** 2.2, 3.1, 3.2, 4.1, 4.2, 5.5, 5.8, 5.11, 6.1, 7.1, 8.1, 8.2, 9.1, 9.2, 10.1 – 10.4, 11.1, 13.1, 14.1 – 14.5, the CONSULTANTS shall carry professional liability insurance in an amount not less than \$1,000,000.00 per claim and \$1,000,000.00 aggregate for all claims for negligent performance. The CONSULTANT shall maintain the coverage for a period ending two (2) years after substantial completion of construction.

II. Commercial General Liability Insurance

The CONSULTANT must obtain and carry Commercial / General liability insurance as follows: For INDOT Prequalification **Work Types** 2.1, 6.1, 7.1, 8.1, 8.2, 9.1, 9.2, 10.1 - 10.4, 11.1, 13.1, 14.1 - 14.5, the CONSULTANT shall carry \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence, \$2,000,000.00 general aggregate. Coverage shall be on an occurrence form, and include contractual liability. The policy shall be amended to include the following extensions of coverage:

- Exclusions relating to the use of explosives, collapse, and underground damage to property shall be removed.
- 2. The policy shall provide thirty (30) days notice of cancellation to LPA.
- 3. The CONSULTANT shall name the LPA as an additional insured.
- III. Automobile Liability

The CONSULTANT shall obtain automobile liability insurance covering all owned, leased, borrowed, rented, or non-owned autos used by employees or others on behalf of the CONSULTANT for the conduct of the CONSULTANT's business, for an amount not less than \$1,000,000.00 Combined Single Limit for Bodily Injury and Property Damage. The term "automobile" shall include private passenger autos, trucks, and similar type vehicles licensed for use on public highways. The policy shall be amended to include the following extensions of coverage:

- 1. Contractual Liability coverage shall be included.
- 2. The policy shall provide thirty (30) days notice of cancellation to the LPA.
- 3. The CONSULTANT shall name the LPA as an additional insured.
- IV. Watercraft Liability (When Applicable)
 - When necessary to use watercraft for the performance of the CONSULTANT's Services under the terms of this Contract, either by the CONSULTANT, or any SUB-CONSULTANT, the CONSULTANT or SUB-CONSULTANT operating the watercraft shall carry watercraft liability insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 Combined Single Limit for Bodily Injury and Property Damage, including Protection & Indemnity where applicable. Coverage shall apply to owned, nonowned, and hired watercraft.
 - 2. If the maritime laws apply to any work to be performed by the CONSULTANT under the terms of the agreement, the following coverage shall be provided:
 - a. United States Longshoremen & Harbor workers
 - b. Maritime Coverage Jones Act
 - 3. The policy shall provide thirty (30) days notice of cancellation to the LPA.
 - The CONSULTANT or SUB-CONSULTANT shall name the LPA as an additional insured.
- V. Aircraft Liability (When Applicable)
 - When necessary to use aircraft for the performance of the CONSULTANT's Services under the terms of this Contract, either by the CONSULTANT or SUB-CONSULTANT, the CONSULTANT or SUB-CONSULTANT operating the aircraft shall carry aircraft liability insurance in the amount of \$5,000,000 Combined Single Limit for Bodily Injury and Property Damage, including Passenger Liability. Coverage shall apply to owned, non-owned and hired aircraft.
 - 2. The policy shall provide thirty (30) days notice of cancellation to the LPA.
 - The CONSULTANT or SUB-CONSULTANT shall name the LPA as an additional insured.
- 22. <u>Merger and Modification</u>. This Contract constitutes the entire agreement between the parties. No understandings, agreements or representations, oral or written, not specified within this Contract will be valid provisions of this Contact. This Contract may not be modified, supplemented or amended, in any manner, except by written agreement signed by all necessary parties.
- 23. <u>Notice to Parties</u>: Any notice, request, consent or communication (collectively a "Notice") under this Agreement shall be effective only if it is in writing and (a) personally delivered; (b) sent by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid; or (c) sent by a nationally recognized overnight delivery service, with delivery confirmed and costs of delivery being prepaid, addressed as follows:

or to such other address or addresses as shall be furnished in writing by any party to the other party. Unless the sending party has actual knowledge that a Notice was not received by the intended recipient, a Notice shall be deemed to have been given as of the date (i) when personally delivered; (ii) three (3) days after the date deposited with the United States mail properly addressed; or (iii) the next day when delivered during business hours to overnight delivery service, properly addressed and prior to such delivery service's cut off time for next day delivery. The parties acknowledge that notices delivered by facsimile or by email shall not be effective.

- 24. Order of Precedence; Incorporation by Reference. Any inconsistency or ambiguity in this Contract shall be resolved by giving precedence in the following order: (1) This Contract and attachments, (2) RFP document, (3) the CONSULTANT's response to the RFP document, and (4) attachments prepared by the CONSULTANT. All of the foregoing are incorporated fully by reference.
- 25. Ownership of Documents and Materials. All documents, records, programs, data, film, tape, articles, memoranda, and other materials not developed or licensed by the CONSULTANT prior to execution of this Contract, but specifically developed under this Contract shall be considered "work for hire" and the CONSULTANT assigns and transfers any ownership claim to the LPA and all such materials ("Work Product) will be the property of the LPA. The CONSULTANT agrees to execute and deliver such assignments or other documents as may be requested by the LPA. Use of these materials, other than related to contract performance by the CONSULTANT, without the LPA's prior written consent, is prohibited. During the performance of this Contract, the CONSULTANT shall be responsible for any loss of or damage to any of the Work Product developed for or supplied by INDOT and used to develop or assist in the Services provided herein while any such Work Product is in the possession or control of the CONSULTANT. Any loss or damage thereto shall be restored at the CONSULTANT's expense. The CONSULTANT shall provide the LPA full, immediate, and unrestricted access to the Work Product during the term of this Contract. The CONSULTANT represents, to the best of its knowledge and belief after diligent inquiry and other than as disclosed in writing prior to or contemporaneously with the execution of this Contract by the CONSULTANT, that the Work Product does not infringe upon or misappropriate the intellectual property or other rights of any third party. The CONSULTANT shall not be liable for the use of its deliverables described in Appendix "A" on other projects without the express written consent of the CONSULTANT or as provided in Appendix "A". The LPA acknowledges that it has no claims to any copyrights not transferred to INDOT under this paragraph.
- 26. <u>Payments</u>. All payments shall be made in arrears and in conformance with the LPA's fiscal policies and procedures.
- 27. <u>Penalties, Interest and Attorney's Fees</u>. The LPA will in good faith perform its required obligations hereunder, and does not agree to pay any penalties, liquidated damages, interest, or attorney's fees, except as required by Indiana law in part, IC 5-17-5, I. C. 34-54-8, and I. C. 34-13-1.

- 28. <u>Pollution Control Requirements</u>. If this Contract is for \$100,000 or more, the CONSULTANT:
 - Stipulates that any facility to be utilized in performance under or to benefit from this Contract is not listed on the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) List of Violating Facilities issued pursuant to the requirements of the Clean Air Act, as amended, and the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended;
 - Agrees to comply with all of the requirements of section 114 of the Clean Air Act and section 308 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, and all regulations and guidelines issued thereunder; and
 - iii. Stipulates that, as a condition of federal aid pursuant to this Contract, it shall notify INDOT and the Federal Highway Administration of the receipt of any knowledge indicating that a facility to be utilized in performance under or to benefit from this Contract is under consideration to be listed on the EPA Listing of Violating Facilities.
- **29.** <u>Severability</u>. The invalidity of any section, subsection, clause or provision of this Contract shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, subsections, clauses or provisions of this Contract.
- 30. <u>Status of Claims</u>. The CONSULTANT shall give prompt written notice to the LPA any claims made for damages against the CONSULTANT resulting from Services performed under this Contract and shall be responsible for keeping the LPA currently advised as to the status of such claims. The CONSULTANT shall send notice of claims related to work under this Contract to:

- 31. <u>Sub-consultant Acknowledgement</u>. The CONSULTANT agrees and represents and warrants to the LPA, that the CONSULTANT will obtain signed Sub-consultant Acknowledgement forms, from all SUB-CONSULTANTS providing Services under this Contract or to be compensated for Services through this Contract. The CONSULTANT agrees to provide signed originals of the Sub-consultant Acknowledgement form(s) to the LPA for approval prior to performance of the Services by any SUB-CONSULTANT.
- **32.** <u>Substantial Performance</u>. This Contract shall be deemed to be substantially performed only when fully performed according to its terms and conditions and any modification or Amendment thereof.
- **33.** <u>**Taxes**</u>. The LPA will not be responsible for any taxes levied on the CONSULTANT as a result of this Contract.
- 34. <u>Termination for Convenience</u>.
 - A. The LPA may terminate, in whole or in part, whenever, for any reason, when the LPA determines that such termination is in its best interests. Termination or partial termination of Services shall be effected by delivery to the CONSULTANT of a Termination Notice at least fifteen (15) days prior to the termination effective date, specifying the extent to which performance of Services under such termination becomes effective. The CONSULTANT shall be compensated for Services properly rendered prior to the effective date of termination. The LPA will not be liable for Services performed after the effective date of termination.
 - B. If the LPA terminates or partially terminates this Contract for any reason regardless of whether it is for convenience or for default, then and in such event, all data, reports, drawings, plans, sketches, sections and models, all specifications, estimates, measurements and data pertaining to the project, prepared under the terms or in fulfillment of this Contract, shall be delivered within ten (10) days to the LPA. In the event of the failure by the CONSULTANT to make

such delivery upon demand, the CONSULTANT shall pay to the LPA any damage (including costs and reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses) it may sustain by reason thereof.

35. <u>Termination for Default</u>.

- A. With the provision of twenty (20) days written notice to the CONSULTANT, the LPA may terminate this Contract in whole or in part if
 - (i) the CONSULTANT fails to:
 - 1. Correct or cure any breach of this Contract within such time, provided that if such cure is not reasonably achievable in such time, the CONSULTANT shall have up to ninety (90) days from such notice to effect such cure if the CONSULTANT promptly commences and diligently pursues such cure as soon as practicable;
 - Deliver the supplies or perform the Services within the time specified in this Contract or any amendment or extension;
 - 3. Make progress so as to endanger performance of this Contract; or
 - 4. Perform any of the other provisions of this Contract to be performed by the CONSULTANT; or
 - (ii) if any representation or warranty of the CONSULTANT is untrue or inaccurate in any material respect at the time made or deemed to be made.
- B. If the LPA terminates this Contract in whole or in part, it may acquire, under the terms and in the manner the LPA considers appropriate, supplies or services similar to those terminated, and the CONSULTANT will be liable to the LPA for any excess costs for those supplies or services. However, the CONSULTANT shall continue the work not terminated.
- C. The LPA shall pay the contract price for completed supplies delivered and Services accepted. The CONSULTANT and the LPA shall agree on the amount of payment for manufactured materials delivered and accepted and for the protection and preservation of the property. Failure to agree will be a dispute under the Disputes clause (see Section 13). The LPA may withhold from the agreed upon price for Services any sum the LPA determine necessary to protect the LPA against loss because of outstanding liens or claims of former lien holders.
- D. The rights and remedies of the LPA in this clause are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or equity or under this Contract.
- E. Default by the LPA. If the CONSULTANT believes the LPA is in default of this Contract, it shall provide written notice immediately to the LPA describing such default. If the LPA fails to take steps to correct or cure any material breach of this Contract within sixty (60) days after receipt of such written notice, the CONSULTANT may cancel and terminate this Contract and institute the appropriate measures to collect monies due up to and including the date of termination, including reasonable attorney fees and expenses, provided that if such cure is not reasonably achievable in such time, the LPA shall have up to one hundred twenty (120) days from such notice to effect such cure if the LPA promptly commences and diligently pursues such cure as soon as practicable. The CONSULTANT shall be compensated for Services properly rendered prior to the effective date of such termination. The CONSULTANT agrees that it has no right of termination for non-material breaches by the LPA.

- 36. Waiver of Rights. No rights conferred on either party under this Contract shall be deemed waived, and no breach of this Contract excused, unless such waiver or excuse is approved in writing and signed by the party claimed to have waived such right. Neither the LPA's review, approval or acceptance of, nor payment for, the Services required under this Contract shall be construed to operate as a waiver of any rights under this Contract or of any cause of action arising out of the performance of this Contract, and the CONSULTANT shall be and remain liable to the LPA in accordance with applicable law for all damages to the LPA caused by the CONSULTANT's negligent performance of any of the Services furnished under this Contract.
- **37.** Work Standards/Conflicts of Interest. The CONSULTANT shall understand and utilize all relevant INDOT standards including, but not limited to, the most current version of the Indiana Department of Transportation Design Manual, where applicable, and other appropriate materials and shall perform all Services in accordance with the standards of care, skill and diligence required in Appendix "A" or, if not set forth therein, ordinarily exercised by competent professionals doing work of a similar nature.
- 38. <u>No Third-Party Beneficiaries</u>. This Agreement is solely for the benefit of the parties hereto. Other than the indemnity rights under this Contract, nothing contained in this Agreement is intended or shall be construed to confer upon any person or entity (other than the parties hereto) any rights, benefits or remedies of any kind or character whatsoever.
- 39. <u>No Investment in Iran</u>. As required by IC 5-22-16.5, the CONSULTANT certifies that the CONSULTANT is not engaged in investment activities in Iran. Providing false certification may result in the consequences listed in IC 5-22-16.5-14, including termination of this Contract and denial of future state contracts, as well as an imposition of a civil penalty.
- **40.** <u>Assignment of Antitrust Claims</u>. The CONSULTANT assigns to the State all right, title and interest in and to any claims the CONSULTANT now has, or may acquire, under state or federal antitrust laws relating to the products or services which are the subject of this Contract.

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Non-Collusion.

The undersigned attests, subject to the penalties for perjury, that he/she is the CONSULTANT, or that he/she is the properly authorized representative, agent, member or officer of the CONSULTANT, that he/she has not, nor has any other member, employee, representative, agent or officer of the CONSULTANT, directly or indirectly, to the best of his/her knowledge, entered into or offered to enter into any combination, collusion or agreement to receive or pay, and that he/she has not received or paid, any sum of money or other consideration for the execution of this Contract other than that which appears upon the face of this Contract. Furthermore, if the undersigned has knowledge that a state officer, employee, or special state appointee, as those terms are defined in IC §4-2-6-1, has a financial interest in the Contract, the Party attests to compliance with the disclosure requirements in IC §4-2-6-10.5.

APPENDIX "A"

SERVICES TO BE FURNISHED BY CONSULTANT:

In fulfillment of this Contract, the CONSULTANT shall comply with the requirements of the appropriate regulations and requirements of the Indiana Department of Transportation and Federal Highway Administration.

The CONSULTANT shall be responsible for performing the following activities:

A. Engineering Personnel

For the fulfillment of all services outlined in Section B below, the CONSULTANT will provide one (1) full time Resident Project Representative, and Inspectors and clerical and secretarial personnel as required for a period of time necessary to complete the construction project and final construction report.

The qualifications and experiences of personnel provided by the CONSULTANT are subject to approval by the LPA and the INDOT and no personnel will be assigned to the project until LPA and INDOT approval is obtained.

The full time RPR will take directions from and report to the INDOT's Area Engineer on all matters concerning contract compliance and administration.

The full time RPR will coordinate project activities with the LPA's Project Coordinator and INDOT's Area Engineer.

- B. Description of Services
 - 1. <u>Construction Schedule:</u> Review the construction schedule prepared by the Contractor for compliance with the Contract, and give to the LPA detailed documentation concerning its acceptability.
 - <u>Conferences:</u> Attend pre-construction conferences as directed by the LPA, arrange a schedule of progress meetings, and such other job conferences as required for the timely and acceptable conduct of the job, and submit such schedules prepared, to the LPA for notification to those who are expected to attend. Record for the LPA, as directed, minutes of such meetings.

The CONSULTANT shall be available for conferences as requested by the LPA, State, and FHWA to review working details of the project. The LPA, State, and FHWA may review and inspect the activities whenever desired during the life of the Agreement.

- 3. Liaison: Serve as the LPA's liaison with the contractor, working principally through the Contractor's field superintendent or such other person in authority as designated by the Contractor. Acting in liaison capacity, the fulltime RPR shall be thoroughly familiar with the plans and specifications applicable to the project to insure that all provisions therein are complied with. Any deviation observed shall be reported to the LPA and INDOT by the fulltime RPR.
- 4. <u>Cooperate</u>: with the LPA in dealing with the various Federal, State, and Local agencies having jurisdictions over the project.

- 5. <u>Assist:</u> the LPA and INDOT in obtaining from the Contractor a list of his proposed suppliers and subcontractors.
- 6. <u>Assist:</u> the LPA and INDOT in obtaining from the Contractor additional details or information when needed at the job site for proper execution of work.
- 7. <u>Equipment</u>: Furnish all equipment necessary to sample and test materials in accordance with INDOT's procedures.
- 8. <u>Samples</u>: Obtain field samples of materials delivered to the site as required by the State and deliver such samples to the appropriate INDOT laboratory office.
- 9. Shop Drawings:
 - a. Receive shop drawings and falsework drawings. Check for completeness and then forward to INDOT personnel for approval.
 - b. Review approved shop and falsework drawings, specifications, and other submissions, record receipt of this data, maintain a file of all drawings and submissions, and check construction for compliance in accordance with the Contract Documents.
 - c. Alert the Contractor's field superintendent when it is observed that materials or equipment are being or about to be used or installed before approval of shop drawings or samples, where such are required, and advise the LPA and INDOT when he believes it is necessary to disapprove the work as failing to conform the Contract Documents.
- 10. Review of Work, Inspection and Tests:
 - a. Conduct on-site inspections for the LPA of the work in progress as a basis for determining that the project is proceeding in accordance with the Contract Documents.
 - b. Provide on-site acceptance testing of materials in the manner and extent prescribed by the latest edition of the Indiana State Highway Commission Construction Manual and in accordance with current accepted practices.
 - c. Accompany visiting inspectors, representing Local, State or Federal Agencies having jurisdiction over the project, and report details of such inspection to the LPA and INDOT.
 - d. Verify that required testing has been accomplished.
- Modification: Consider and evaluate the Contractor's suggestions for modifications in drawings and/or specifications and report them with recommendations to the LPA and INDOT.
- 12. Records:
 - a. Prepare and maintain at the job site orderly files of correspondence, reports of job conferences, shop drawings and other submissions, reproductions of original Contract Documents, including all addenda, change orders and additional drawings subsequent to the award of the Contract, progress reports, and other project related documents.
 - Keep a diary or log book, recording hours on the job site, weather conditions, list of visiting officials, decisions, general observations, and specific observations with regard to test procedures. Upon request,

furnish copies of such a diary or log book to the LPA.

- c. Maintain for the LPA, a record of names, addresses, and telephone numbers of all subcontractors and major material suppliers.
- d. Maintain a set of drawings on which authorized changes are noted, and deliver to the LPA upon request, but in any event at the completion of the project.
- e. Prepare the Final Construction Record and Final Estimate as required by the INDOT and the LPA.
- <u>Reports:</u> Furnish to the INDOT and the LPA at periodic intervals, as required, progress reports of the project, including the Contractor's compliance with the approved construction schedule.
- 14. <u>Progress Estimates:</u> Prepare progress estimates for periodic partial payments to the Contractor and deliver to the LPA and INDOT for review and processing. The payments to the Contractor will be based on estimates of the value of work performed and materials complete in place in accordance with the Contract.
- 15. <u>Project Responsibility</u>: The RPR will be responsible for the documentation of pay quantities and estimates, and the maintenance of appropriate records related to the construction of this project.
- 16. Work Schedule and Suspension: The consultant's crew will be required to regulate their work week to conform to the contractor's hours in accordance with the directions of the INDOT's Area Engineer. If work on the construction project is suspended, all matters concerning contract compliance and administration are complete, the services of the consultant may also be suspended without cost to the project.
- 17. <u>Contract Administration</u>: The CONSULTANT will administer the contract in accordance with INDOT's procedures.
- 18. <u>Conflict of Interest:</u> The CONSULTANT acknowledges and agrees that the CONSULTANT, a firm associated with the CONSULTANT, or an individual associated with the CONSULTANT, can not accept or perform any work, (including but not limited to construction engineering, production staking, falsework drawings, shop drawings) for the contractor, material supplier of the contractor or for any of the contractor's subcontractors on this project. For purposes of this section, a firm is associated with the CONSULTANT if the firm and CONSULTANT have a common director, common officer or a common owner. For purposes of this section, an individual is associated with the CONSULTANT if the individual is an employee of the CONSULTANT or an employee of a firm associated with the CONSULTANT.

For purposes of this section the following definitions shall be used:

Director: Any member of the board of directors of a corporation.

Officer: The president, secretary, treasurer, or such other officers as may be prescribed by the corporation's bylaws.

Owner: A sole proprietor, any partner in a partnership, or any shareholder of a corporation.

The LPA shall furnish the CONSULTANT with the following:

- 1. Standard Specifications and standard drawings applicable to the project
- 2. Plans of existing bridge within the project limits
- 3. Necessary permit forms and permit processing (US Army Corps of Engineers, US Coast Guard, and/or Indiana Department of Natural Resources)
- 4. Utility plans available to INDOT covering utility facilities govern the location of signals and underground conduits throughout the affected areas
- 5. Provide access to enter upon public and private lands as required for the CONSULTANT to perform work under this Contract
- 6. Geotechnical investigation, if applicable

- 5. It is the policy of the Indiana Department of Transportation that Project Representatives and/or Inspectors be on the construction site whenever the Contractor is engaged in any activity requiring inspection or testing concurrent with the construction or activity. In order for the contractor to comply with the Contract Plans and Specifications and complete the work within the time required, it is often necessary for the Contractor to work more than an 8-hour day and more than a 5day week. COLLECTION AGREEMENT

This agreement is made this ______ day of ______ between Montgomery" County", hereinafter called "COUNTY", and Eagle Accounts Group, hereinafter called "EAGLE".

ARTICLE I - GENERAL

COUNTY intends to retain the services of EAGLE to process and collect customer accounts receivable for unpaid fees. EAGLE is in the business of processing, treating and collecting accounts. Accounts will be forwarded to EAGLE via an electronic report such as Excel. COUNTY does not contract to place with EAGLE any specific number or percentage of accounts at any time, but the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall apply and be incorporated as a part of all placements that shall be made. EAGLE in collaboration with COUNTY may review and update processes as needed.

ARTICLE II - LICENSE TO ENGAGE IN BUSINESS

EAGLE is in the business of collecting accounts. EAGLE is licensed to engage in business as a collection bureau in the state of Indiana. EAGLE shall submit such evidence of compliance with regulatory, bonding, or licensing requirements as COUNTY may demand from time to time.

ARTICLE III - TERM

This Agreement shall commence on the date set forth above and shall continue in effect thereafter until terminated in accordance with its provisions. Each party to this Agreement shall have the absolute right to terminate this Agreement at any time with or without justification or cause, by giving written notice not less than thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of such termination. Neither party shall be liable to the other for any damages or losses whatsoever, which are directly, incidentally or remotely caused by or result from the termination of this Agreement. Such termination shall not operate to affect any indebtedness due EAGLE for commissions earned pursuant to the other terms and provisions contained in this Agreement. It is EAGLE's duty to remit to COUNTY all moneys received from delinquent accounts referred for collection. In accordance with this Agreement, all terms and provisions as set out herein shall survive termination provided for in this Article shall not in any manner effect the obligations of EAGLE under this Agreement to protect, defend, indemnify and hold forever harmless COUNTY from all acts or omissions prior to such termination.

ARTICLE IV - PAYMENT

EAGLE shall add a thirty percent (30%) collection fee to each account it receives. EAGLE shall be compensated as follows:

- Should payment in full be received by EAGLE: EAGLE shall keep the 30% fee and remit 100% of the principal to COUNTY.
- Should partial payment be received by EAGLE: EAGLE shall pro-rate the payment so that it receives \$0.30 for every \$1.00 that it remits to COUNTY.
- Should payment in full be received by COUNTY: EAGLE shall invoice COUNTY for the 30% fee.
- Should partial payment be received by COUNTY: EAGLE shall invoice COUNTY for a prorated amount so that EAGLE receives \$0.30 for every \$1.00 that COUNTY keeps.

EAGLE shall remit all money due COUNTY paid to it by the tenth (10th) day of the following month with an invoice for EAGLE fees based on the above terms. COUNTY agrees to remit any fees due EAGLE within thirty (30) days of invoice receipt. If COUNTY becomes sixty days delinquent on its remittance, EAGLE may begin withholding its fee out of current collections.

ARTICLE V - DISPUTES

No accounts that are disputed in writing will be reported to the credit bureau until they are reviewed and deemed valid.

ARTICLE VI - OTHER EXPENSES

Except for the payment for collection fees as set forth herein, COUNTY shall not be liable for any expense, cost or other disbursement whatsoever, which EAGLE incurs by acts or omissions directly, incidentally or remotely related to the collection service on any account.

ARTICLE VII – REPORTS REQUIRED FROM EAGLE

EAGLE shall provide COUNTY with the following written information and data:

- (A) An itemized statement acknowledging receipt of each account referred by COUNTY identifying the account number, and balance.
- (B) A monthly itemization of payments and cancellations.
- (C) Monthly collection recovery and status reports.

ARTICLE VIII - REPORTS REQUIRED FROM COUNTY

(A) Monthly report of payments made to the COUNTY on cases assigned to EAGLE for collection.

ARTICLE IX - COMPLIANCE WITH ALL LAWS

EAGLE agrees to conduct its business operations in full compliance with all applicable laws, rules, and regulations. In the event that EAGLE violates a law, rule or regulation in the collection of an account, or in the attempt to collect an account, EAGLE shall forfeit the commission on the account, in addition to all other remedies, in law or in equity, which COUNTY may have against EAGLE. EAGLE shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend COUNTY, its servants, agents and employees from any and all claims, demands, suits, judgments, damages, costs and expenses, including reasonable attorney fees, and any and all liability arising from EAGLE's failure to conduct its business operations in full compliance with all applicable statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations.

ARTICLE X – INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

EAGLE's relationship to COUNTY is that of an independent contractor. No acts, omissions or assistance given by COUNTY, its officers, staff, employees, agents, representatives or associated companies shall be construed to alter EAGLE's status as an independent contractor.

ARTICLE XI - INDEMNIFICATION

EAGLE agrees that it will indemnify and hold harmless COUNTY, its officers, agents and employees from any loss, cost, damage, expense, attorney's fees, and liability by reason of personal injury, property damage, or both of whatsoever nature or kind, arising out of or as a result of the sole negligent act or negligent failure to act of EAGLE or any of its agents or employees.

COUNTY agrees that it will indemnify and hold harmless EAGLE, its officers, agents and employees from any loss, cost, damage, expense, attorney's fees, and liability by reason of personal injury, property damage, or both of whatsoever nature or kind, arising out of or as a result of the sole negligent act or negligent failure to act of COUNTY or any of its agents or employees.

Notwithstanding its right to protections, defense, reimbursement, and indemnification by EAGLE, and without limiting or restricting the other terms or provisions contained in this Article, EAGLE reserves for itself, at its own option, the exclusive right to settle, compromise, and pay any and all claims, demands, proceedings, suits, actions, or causes of action which are brought against either party herein under the terms and provisions of this Article. However; if COUNTY settles, compromises or otherwise pays any claim without consent of EAGLE, EAGLE shall not be required to indemnify or hold harmless COUNTY.

ARTICLE XII - SETTLEMENT AND LITIGATION

No compromise or settlement shall be accepted by EAGLE on any account referred by COUNTY without first obtaining the consent of COUNTY.

EAGLE shall notify COUNTY of its intention to file suit on individual accounts. EAGLE will send a list to the COUNTY of the accounts EAGLE would like to sue. COUNTY needs to authorize the suit for the listed accounts and make any adjustments if needed. EAGLE shall not commence litigation until it has received authorization from the COUNTY. EAGLE will file suit as the assignee of the Clerk of the County.

Any necessary filing fees, court costs and attorney fees will be reimbursed by the defendant.

ARTICLE XIII - WAIVER

The failure of either party to enforce at time, the terms, provisions and covenants of this Agreement shall in no way be construed to be a waiver of such terms, provisions, and covenants; nor shall such failure affect the validity of this Agreement, or any part thereof; nor affect the right of either party to thereafter enforce each and every such term, provision and covenant therein.

ARTICLE XIV - NON EXCLUSIVITY

This Agreement shall not be interpreted or construed in any manner whatsoever as giving EAGLE exclusive right to collection services which might be required by COUNTY.

ARTICLE XV - SEVERABILITY

In the event that any provision hereof is found invalid or unenforceable, pursuant to judicial decree or decision, the remainder of this Agreement shall remain valid and enforceable according to its terms.

ARTICLE XVI – MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

<u>Section 1.</u> The laws of the State of Indiana shall govern this Agreement and the relations of the parties hereto. EAGLE and COUNTY agree that, in the event of any dispute, courts sitting in Knox County, Indiana will be the venue for resolution of such dispute.

<u>Section 2.</u> EAGLE and COUNTY acknowledge that each of them has negotiated and drafted this Agreement, and that any interpretation hereof shall not be construed more strictly against one party or the other.

Section 3. Assignment of this Agreement or the rights or obligations hereunder shall be invalid without the specific written consent of the other party herein, except that this Agreement may be assigned by COUNTY without the written approval of EAGLE to any successor entity operating the facility now operated by COUNTY or to a related or affiliated organization.

<u>Section 4.</u> Notices or communications herein required or permitted shall be given the respective parties by registered or certified mail or by hand delivery.

Section 5. This Agreement may be amended only by an instrument in writing signed by the parties hereto.

<u>Section 6.</u> Should Indiana Statute regarding collection fees change, or should case law establish new criteria, the Parties shall adjust this Agreement immediately to conform to Indiana law.

ARTICLE XVII - AUDITS

Upon request, EAGLE shall permit COUNTY or its authorized agent to audit formally all books, files, records and other relevant data pertaining to accounts referred by COUNTY. Such audits as provided for in this Article shall be undertaken during EAGLE's regular business hours.

ARTICLE XVIII – EMPLOYMENT ELIBIGILITY VERIFICATION

EAGLE shall enroll in and verify the work eligibility status of all newly hired employees through the E-Verify program as defined in IC 22-5-1.7-3. EAGLE shall not knowingly employ or contract with an unauthorized alien. EAGLE shall not retain an employee or contract with a person that EAGLE subsequently learns is an unauthorized alien.

EAGLE shall require all subcontractors who perform work under its contract to certify to EAGLE that:

- 1) The subcontractor does not knowingly employ or contract with an unauthorized alien;
- 2) The subcontractor has enrolled and is participating in the E-Verify program. EAGLE agrees to maintain this certification at least two years after the term of a contract with a subcontractor.

COUNTY may terminate the contract if EAGLE fails to cure a breach of this article no later than thirty (30) days after being notified by COUNTY.

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ARTICLE IXX - ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement contains all the promises, covenants and reservations existing between the parties, and there are no outside or collateral agreements existing with respect thereto, and neither party has agreed to do or omit any act not specified herein. This Agreement shall only be amended, modified, deleted, or otherwise changed by written supplement thereto, which must be authoritatively executed by both parties.

IC 5-22-6.5-3 Authorization

Sec. 3. (a) The state, a unit of local government, a state agency, an agency of a unit of local government, a body corporate and politic, or a state university may let a contract with a public or private person for the performance of any ministerial service that it must or may have done under its direction that is necessary or desirable in the public interest.

(b) Notwithstanding IC 4-6-2-6, the state, a state agency, a body corporate and politic, a state university, a unit of local government, or an agency of a unit of local government may:

(1) contract with a collection agency to collect any amount owed to the state, state agency, body corporate and politic, state university, or unit of local government; and (2) authorize a collection agency in a contract for collection services to collect from the debtor a

collection fee. As added by P.L.22-1997, SEC.9.

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE 2022-2023 DRUG FREE MONTGOMERY COUNTY COALITION GRANT FUND

Whereas, the Montgomery County Probation Department has been awarded \$15,330 in mini-grants by the Drug Free Montgomery County Coalition/Local Coordinating Council; and

Whereas, these mini-grants consist of \$3,000 for Drug Court incentives, \$1,000 for Veteran Court incentives, \$1,680 for juvenile and young adult drug screening, \$4,050 for substance abuse assessments, \$3,000 for emergency/transitional housing assistance and \$2,600 for juvenile cognitive behavioral programs; and

Whereas, the use of funds from these mini-grants may be used by the Probation Department consistent with the terms and conditions of the grant award and grant agreement; and

Whereas, the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners finds that a new fund, the 2022-2023 Drug Free Montgomery County Coalition Grant Fund, should be created in order to receive the funds and to provide a mechanism for appropriation and accounting for the funds used.

Therefore, it is ordained that a new section, Section 35.____ of the Montgomery County Code, is hereby added to the County Code and that this new section shall read as follows:

"§ 35.____ 2021-2022 DRUG FREE MONTGOMERY COUNTY COALITION GRANT FUND

- (A) Source of Funds. The Montgomery County Board of Commissioners hereby establishes the 2022-2023 Drug Free Montgomery County Coalition Grant Fund. The fund shall consist of monies received by the Montgomery County Probation Department in mini-grants from the Drug Free Montgomery County Coalition/Local Coordinating Council.
- (B) *Use of Funds.* All money in the Fund will be used by the Probation Department in a manner consistent with the terms and conditions of the mini-grant awards and grant agreements.
- (C) Non-Reverting Fund. This is a Non-Reverting Fund."
- It is further ordained that this ordinance shall be effective upon adoption.

It is further ordained that all other provisions of the Montgomery County Code

of Ordinances which are not specifically amended by this ordinance shall remain in

full force and effect.
