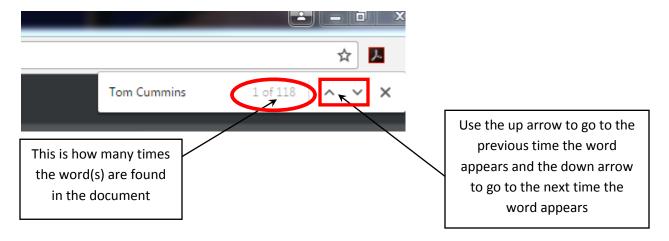
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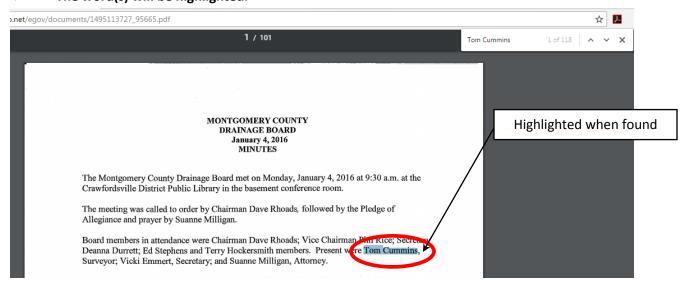
Hold down the CTRL key and the letter 'F' at the same time. A search box appears in the upper right hand corner. Type a word(s) in the box to search the document for the word(s).

Membership: The Montgomery County Drainage Board shall consist of five (5) members appointed by the Board of Commissioners. One (1) member shall be a Montgomery County Commissioner. Four (4) members shall be residents of Montgomery County who are freeholders and who are knowledgeable in drainage matters. Of the four freeholders at least

one shall be recommended to the Board of Commissioners by the Board of Montgomery County Soil and Water Conservation District (provided, however, the Board of Commissioners retains discretion to appoint or reject the recommendation); one shall be a resident who lives in either Coal Creek, Madison, Sugar Creek, Wayne, North Union or Franklin townships; one shall be a resident who lives in either Ripley, South Union, Walnut, Brown, Scott or Clark townships. The four freeholders shall serve for terms of three (3) years with their initial appointments made so as to provide for staggering of terms on a an annual basis. (Ordinance 2007-1, April 9, 2007)

Board practice: The Drainage Board may establish practices consistent with its authority under Indiana law." Jack Grimble seconded. 4 votes in favor. 1 abstained (McCormick). Motion carried.

Stormwater Reviews -

Kessier Hog Farms – Mark Kessier appeared before the Drainage Board suggesting that the installation of a perimeter tile around his facility would suffice the drainage issue of runoff from the hog buildings. After discussion, *Bill McCormick moved to require that a detailed tile plan be presented to DLZ to their review. Deanna Durrett seconded. 5-0 votes in favor. Motion carried.*

*Drainage Board Member Bill McCormick left the meeting after the discussion of the Kessler Hog Farm.

Ms. Durrett moved to hold a hearing to raise the assessment rate on the William McClamrock Drain on June 23, 2008 and request that the Surveyor calculate the amount. Bill McCormick seconded. 5-0 votes in favor. Motion carried.

There being no further business before the Drainage Board, *Kenny Pearson moved to adjourn. Jack Grimble seconded. 5-0 votes in favor. Motion carried.*

The meeting was brought to order by Mr. David Rhoads, with the pledge of allegiance and a prayer by Mr. Allen Goff.

Board members in attendance were David Rhoads, Chairman; Commissioner, William McCormick, Vice Chairman; Deanna Durrett, Secretary, Jack Grimble, and Kenneth Pearson members. Tom Cummins Surveyor. Drainage Board Recording Secretary Vicki Emmert, and attorney Suanne Milligan. Also present: Marc Bonwell, Lori Dossett, Allen Goff, Marian Lindow, of the League of Woman Voters, Penny King, Donna Sobolick, Stacey Ellsbury, Darrell Birge, Wade Bennett, Joe Miller, Lynn Fellows, Mary Rose Duncan, Mr. And Mrs. Dan Gwin, Donya Lester, Carl Gwin, Jo Ann Linn, Mitch ___, Jim Simpson, Ed Chenoweth, C.K. Discussion concerning advisory boards, landowners doing own work, and obstruction procedures were continued to a later date due to the busy agenda on June 9, 2008.

Tom Cummins stated that he has two contractors, possibly three, prepared to spray ditches this summer.

Alvin Sparks Ditch # 554

A hearing on a petition for reconstruction of the Alvin Sparks Drain #554 was held. Surveyor Tom Cummins reported that notice was sent to all landowners. Surveyor Tom Cummins reported that the drain is located in Walnut Township and has caused trouble for years to the landowners. He presented a map of the present and proposed watershed and a visual plan for the reconstruction and an alternate plan. He provided, in writing, information regarding the anticipated cost for reconstruction. Gwin and Daniel C. Gwin presented objections to the proposed reconstruction, including objection to the form of notice, on June 4, 2008. Carl E. Gwin and Daniel C. He also objected that the proposed outlets are not big enough. Montgomery County Drainage Board Monday, June 23, 2008 Minutes

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met on June 23, 2008 at the Crawfordsville District Public Library in the basement conference room.

The meeting was brought to order by David Rhoads, which was followed by the pledge of allegiance and a prayer given by Kenny Pearson.

Board members in attendance were David Rhoads Chairman; Commissioner William McCormick, Vice Chairman; Deanna Durrett, Secretary; and Kenneth Pearson, Member, Tom Cummins Surveyor. Board member Jack Grimble was not present. Drainage Board Recording Secretary Vicki Emmert.

Also present: Marc Bonwell, Andy Springer, Rob Braser, Bill Kimbley, Wayne Lasley, Rob Durrett of the League of Women Voters, Mr. & Mrs. Dan Gwin, Mrs. Donya Lester, Carl Gwin, Tim Jensen, Jeff Myers, Wade Bennett, Jerry and Nancy McBee, and Aleaysha Sandley of <u>Journal Review</u>.

Bill McCormick moved, seconded by Kenny Pearson to accept the minutes of the May 27, 2008 meeting. Motion carried 4-0.

Classification Report

Tom Cummins reported that the Foster Fletcher #573 drain with all the commercial growth in the area should be classified as an urban drain. Bill McCormick moved seconded by Deanna Durrett to reclassify the Foster Fletcher #573 Drain to an urban drain. Motion carried 4-0.

Storm Water Approval

Tom Cummins, Surveyor gave a report on the Candlewood Suites storm water drainage plan.

Bill McCormick moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett to open it up for discussion. Motion carried 4-0.

Speaking on behalf of Candlewood Suites was Bill Kimbley of Kimbley and Proctor with their plan to increase the detention areas that would lower the rate of water to the out flow, which would benefit all. One detention area already exists and another one is to be built.

There will be two assessments one on the east for commercial use and one on the west for farmland. There will also be special wording that acknowledges the conditions set forth in the plans.

Bill McCormick moved, seconded by Kenny Pearson to accept the storm water drainage plan of Candlewood Suites. Motion carried 4-0.

Reports

Deanna Durrett reported that no loans have been finalized as of yet on the James Sanders, John Ward and Basil Van Cleave Drains. Two banks did turn in their proposals. Deanna moved, seconded by Kenny Pearson to accept the Linden State Bank's proposal with the lowest rate of 4% for the James Sanders, John Ward and Basil Van Cleave Drain loans. Motion carried 4-0.

Old Business

Deanna Durrett reported that we would have a booth at the 4-H Fair with the Soil and Water Conservation District Board. There will be a written contract with the fairgrounds and have flexible time. The Fair Board has liability coverage. We may or may not have electricity.

Mrs. Durrett stated that attorney Susanne Milligan said that every storm water drainage plan approval action ruling such as the Hampton Inn should be recorded. Bill McCormick said more details will be needed as to what should be recorded and who should record it.

New Business

Tom Cummins reported on the possible reconstruction of the Allie Peterson Drain #549. He will have more information at the next meeting and possibly a landowner petition to reconstruct.

Deanna Durrett stated there was nothing new to report from a consultation with Rex Pranger, the Lagrange County surveyor.

Other Business

Deanna Durrett spoke about appropriation versus a loan. She stated there are two options. One is to get a bank loan through the county council and the other is to borrow money from the general improvement drain fund (GDIF). Until the GDIF is out of debt, the board must borrow from the bank. By the end of the year, the board can exercise the two options.

John Gobin #520 Hearing continued

Tom Cummins presented a report and figures of the watershed proposal. He said the cost for the tributary two would be \$115,700. There will be a \$3.50 an acre maintenance assessment on tiles over the whole watershed of all the landowners. Andy Springer from Farmland Reserve asked how much was in the current account. Mr. Cummins said there was approximately \$11,500 and that it has only been on assessment at the current rate for less than 2 years. The \$11,500 does not reflect recent work of \$3,000 to \$4,000. Wayne Lasley asked about adding on from his property and extending to the tiles. Mr. Cummins did a quick calculation and said it would be approximately \$16,000 with an average of \$300. per acre to fix it all. Mr. Cummins recommended reconstruction of Tributary 2 and extending it 2,000 feet on to Mr. Lesley's place. The total will be approximately \$131,000 or \$321 an acre. Kenny Pearson asked if we would have to go to the council to borrow. The answer is yes.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenny Pearson, to reconstruct the <u>John Gobin #2</u>, <u>tributary 2</u>, at approximately \$131,000 to include approximately 2,000 feet of 12-inch tile, through Wayne Lasley's property. Motion carried 4-0.

On the John Gobin tributary one, which runs along the railroad there is not a proper grade. Bill McCormick felt that a hydrology report is needed. Wade Bennett thinks it is a 15" concrete tile under the railroad. Dan Qwin inquired if there is a time period to get all this done and everyone was in agreement to get it done as soon as possible. Bill McCormick moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett, to continue this and put it on hold until we get a hydrology report and Deanna is to check out the code on engineering and who incurs that expense, find out how much the state and the railroad will be involved in this matter and bring it back to the August 25, 2008, meeting. Motion carried 4-0.

Other Business

Deanna Durrett discussed the issue of landowners doing their own work on county drains and how to handle the adoption of the new county code. Copy of the language will be brought to the next board meeting.

Claims

The Surveyor, Tom Cummins, presented the following claims:

Motion carried 4-0.

\$2,925.00 to Connor Excavating for work on the Lye Creek Drain #535.

Bill McCormick moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett to pay the claim. Motion carried 4-0.

Kenny Pearson stated the town of New Market is not happy with surface water problems. These are not issues concerning the county drain.

Dave Rhoads moved, seconded by Bill McCormick to adjourn. Motion carried 4-0.

Deanna Durrett reported that the new county ordinance does not include a section on landowners doing work on their own land. Suanne Milligan, Drainage Board attorney, said she would discuss liability issues with the county attorney.

It was reported that a reminder landowner letter will be sent to the landowners of the **John Gobin Drain** #520 that the hearing continuation will be August 25, 2008.

Bill McCormick moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett, that Marc Bonwell, Montgomery County Building Department Administrator, send a letter to Mr. Mark Kessler concerning the storm water plan for their swine facility and that Mr. Kessler should report to the Drainage Board at the August 25, 2008 meeting. Motion carried 5-0.

Under Public Comment

Dan Gwin, speaking on behalf of the landowners of the **Thomas Wilkins #589 Drain**, asked that the Montgomery County Drainage Board not adjourn, as they would like to discuss their project again.

Reports

Deanna Durrett stated that the grant administrator is moving ahead and will have more information in the future on the **James Hose Drain**.

Dave Rhoads stated at the budget meeting that the shared position between the Drainage Board and the Soil and Water Conservation District was presented to the council for the first reading.

Tom Cummins, reported that the county auditor has received all three loans (James Sanders #550, Basil Van Cleave #559 and John Ward #562) and he would submit claims next week. Bill McCormick moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett, that emergency claims be submitted now from Maxwell Farm Drainage for the Basil Van Cleave of \$30,100. and \$14,000. for the John Ward and to Birge Farm Drainage for \$25,417 for the James Sanders Drain be approved. Motion carried 5-0

Old Business

Marc Bonwell the Montgomery County Building Department Administrator, along with Mark Kessler swine facility owner with engineer Michael Veehinyer of Livestock Solutions, presented storm water plans for Kessler's swine facility. Mr. Veehinyer presented their drainage plans and said he would have a more formal proposal using natural topography using detention rather than retention drainage and would be working closely with Mr. Bonwell. Everything should be ready at the August 25, 2008 drainage board meeting.

Old Business continued

John Gobin Tributary #1: Information provided by Vester and Associates. Mr. Cummins is still looking into the situation with the pipes and tiles under US 231 and the railroad. They will have to have permission from Curt Hudson to look at his tile. Wade Bennett stated that both he and Mr. Hudson contributed money for the tile system in that area. The John Gobin Drain will be continued until the August 25, 2008 meeting to get figures, and get estimates to bore under highway and railroad. Bill McCormick recommended using a camera and flushing under the railroad.

Thomas Wilkins Drain

Tom Cummins, and Joe Miller of Banning Engineering discussed the proposal for the study of the **Thomas Wilkins Drain** project. The study will include the entire **Thomas Wilkins Drain**, open ditches and the tile system up to the county line at a cost of \$18,000. Deanna Durrett inquired about the impact of the open ditch on landowners, as

they are not being assessed at this time. In the future a new watershed will be created to encompass the **Sarah Kincaid** too. The cost of the study for the cleanout of 800 to 1000 feet would come out of the maintenance fund. Jack Rhoads moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett, that we approve a study on the tile portion up to \$10,000. Mr. Rhoades and Mrs. Durrett then withdrew the motion. Bill McCormick moved, seconded by Kenny Pearson, instructing Tom Cummins to get a breakdown of costs for the tile portion, dredging of 800 to 1,000 feet and up to the county line and when Mr. Cummins gets the figures to call the board to set up a special meeting to give them the details. Motion carried 5-0. When Mr. Cummins gets the information he should contact the board to set up a special board meeting.

Landowner petitions Deanna Durrett explained that this is a legal process and this is a hearing of the petitioners to advance the date, which is 10% of the landowners and to hold a hearing of only the petitioners and to listen to get their input. Next would be a hearing of all landowners.

Linn-Himes Drain #533 Petition

Speaking was Lynn Fellows. He stated that they have been having problems for several years now; some of the issues are standing water on roadways. It appears that they have broken tiles along the ditch and water is still running in areas but at the headwall it is not. The petition is to reconstruct the ditch and some de-brushing. There is a problem with beaver activity too. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Jack Grimble, to send the Linn-Himes petition to the surveyor to get a report for the next drainage board meeting August 25, 2008. Motion carried 5-0.

Glennard Miller Drain #583 Petition

Speaking was Wayne McCutchan. He stated he has done work on it himself over the years before finding out that it is a legal drain. He said they are old clay tiles and they are crumbling. Bill McCormick moved, seconded by Kenny Pearson, to send the Glennard Miller Drain petition to the surveyor to get a report for the next drainage board meeting August 25, 2009. Motion carried 5-0.

John McCorkle Drain #608 Petition

Speaking was Phil Rice. He stated that he has spent his own money before finding it is a legal drain. It is a 24-inch and runs from the Fountain County line to the culvert on 900 N. TBS Tri County Fiber Optic has laid lines and did not repair correctly. It keeps popping holes that need to be repaired. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenny Pearson, to send the John McCorkle Drain petition to the surveyor to get a report for the next drainage board meeting August 25, 2008. Motion carried, 4-0. Not voting was Bill McCormick.

Carolyn Kenyan Drain Petition (Does not have a drain #.)

Speaking were Ron Masten, Kent Campfield, and T.J. Horn representing Maxwell Farm Drainage. Old clay tiles were put in ground in 1800's or early 1900's. It is from east of 500 W. to 750 N. and the last 1000 feet from the outlet is all broken down. Mr. Cummins and Mrs. Durrett both stated that this drain has been off assessment since 1968. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Bill McCormick, to send the Carolyn Kenyan Drain petition to the surveyor to get a report to for the next drainage board meeting August 25, 2008. Motion carried, 5-0.

Phil Rice inquired after the vote if a private tile that was connected to the legal drain is now in poor condition would it be reconnected to the new drain. Mr. Cummins responded that if the private tile was connected before and is damaged, the surveyor may authorize the contractor not to reconnect until the private tile is restored to an acceptable condition at landowner expense.

Old Business Continued

Tom Cummins presented bids for the John Gobin #2 from the following contractors:

After talking to contactors it would cost \$68. per foot at a total cost at \$25,000 to \$30,000. He recommends a reconstruction proposal. Mr. Cummins stated he would proceed forward on getting a petition from landowners to reconstruct.

Raymond Weliever Drain #564 Report

Two years ago engineers went out and looked at the area, they are on standby to do a study. Possibly doing an open ditch as it runs through woods would be more feasible and that is what the study is for. Surveyor Cummins is to proceed forward on getting a petition from the landowners before getting a study done.

Bill McCormick asked about the **Odis Stafford Drain #591** just south of a swine facility. Tom is to check on getting a report before the next meeting from the engineer.

Claims Submitted

Maxwell Farm Drainage for \$12,000 for the road crossing on the Basil Van Cleave Drain #559. Jack Grimble moved, seconded by Bill McCormick to pay this claim. Motion carried 5-0.

Recessed

Bill McCormick moved, seconded by Jack Grimble to recess to look at bids. Motion carried 5-0.

Reconvened

In discussion it was asked what was meant by plus expenses. Mr. Cummins stated that in case something arose that was not known about that is where this cost could come from.

Mr. McCormick moved to amend his motion, seconded by Jack Grimble to accept the scope of services from Banning Engineering on the <u>Thomas Wilkins Drain</u> at Mr. Cummins discretion if a problem would arise. Motion carried, 4-0.

Mr. Rhoads inquired about the **John Galey Drain #518**. It was stated to contact landowners in the railroad area to get permission after the crops are out to get a closer look at the problems there.

Mr. Rhoads also inquired about the **James Servies Drain #703**. Could you use improvement funds for work on this drain? Mr. McCormick stated we would need a petition from the landowners to do a reconstruction to start the process.

There were no minutes to be approved.

Reports per IC 36-9-27-49 and 50 Surveyor Cummins presented reports for the following drains.

Linn-Himes #533

Tom Cummins recommended this drain for Reconstruction for 2008. Tile needs replaced from west side of C. R. 400 E. to the headwall outlet in Lynn Fellows field. Open drain needs to be de-brushed and possibly dipped to allow sufficient drainage of tile. Current maintenance assessment: \$6.50/acre

Glennard Miller #538

Tom Cummins recommended this drain for Reconstruction for 2008. Tile needs replaced from C. R. 1000E. west to the headwall outlet in Wayne McCutchan's field. Tile needs to be installed deeper to minimize tile problems. Current maintenance assessment: \$1.06/acre.

John McCorkle #608

Tom Cummins recommended this drain for Reconstruction for 2008. Tile needs replaced from C.R. 900 N., northwest to C.R. 1000 W. in Phil Rice's field. Tile location needs to be verified, and the Wingate tile needs to be investigated. Current maintenance assessment: \$1.15/acre

Carolyn Kenyon #N/A

Tom Cummins recommended this drain for Reconstruction for 2008. Tile needs replaced from C.R. 750 N. to the outlet. According to the records, the tile in question has no record of being established as regulated drain. Tile location is questionable and needs to be verified. Drain is currently un-assessed.

Dave Rhoads inquired whether the drains that were taken off of assessment in the 1960's if a hearing was needed to put them back on assessment. Deanna stated that the approach we have taken is that the legal drains were never vacated and their assessment is now at zero.

Tom Cummins stated that he is currently creating new watersheds for the Linn-Himes#533, Glennard Miller #538, John McCorkle #608 and the Carolyn Kenyon #N/A drains and will have reports for you at the next meeting.

Randy McCormick was present and asked the status of the **Schenck #506 Drain**. Randy McCormick stated that Chris Torp from Soil and Water had been out to the site and suggested to fix the holes and use risers and no pond. The **Guy Little #534 Drain** is also in that area and needs work. Mr. Cummins suggested contacting a contractor to survey the area and he will have a report at the September 8, 2008 meeting.

Mr. Cummins gave an update on the **Odis Stafford #591 Drain** from the study done by Banning Engineering. Based on their observations and evaluation there are three options.

- 1. Maintain the Open Ditch along the county road, extending from the Hall Drive to the unnamed tributary to Sugar Creek (I-74 culvert).
- Reconstruct the subsurface drain from the open ditch, under the Hall Drive to the outlet of the borrow pit pond; recommended size 24-30 inch, solid tile with gasketed, watertight joints.
- 3. a. Reconstruct the subsurface drain from east side of County road 600 East and extend to an outlet at the head of the open ditch, approximately 710 linear feet, recommend 24-inch. Or
 - b. Reconstruct the subsurface drain from the west side of county road 600 East and extend to an outlet under I-74 (36-inch corrugated metal pipe, CMP), approximately 1,600 linear feet, recommend 24-inch.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Jack Grimble, to continue the discussion on the <u>Odis Stafford #591 Drain</u> to September 8, 2008 and send a reminder letter by regular mail to the landowners involved. Motion carried, 5-0.

Deanna Durrett inquired about canceling the September 22, 2008 meeting due to harvest. Kenny Pearson moved, seconded by Bill McCormick, to hold the September 22, 2008 meeting and to cancel the October 13, 2008 meeting due to harvest. Motion carried, 5-0.

Deanna Durrett reported that the 2nd hearing on the county budget has not been held yet. She had a good meeting on the possible shared position between the Soil & Water Conservation District and the Drainage Board.

Old Business

Storm Water Plan: Mark Kessler swine facility. Mr. Kessler was not present. Mark Bonwell the Montgomery County Building Department Administrator said he was contacted on Friday by Michael Veehinger of Livestock Solutions who had been out of state working on another project. Mr. Veenhuizen contacted Mr. Bonwell for more information and said he would have it ready at the next meeting. Bill McCormick stated that the Drainage Board has been working with Mr. Kessler for about a year on this problem with no solution as of yet. Bill McCormick moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett, to have Marc Bonwell send a certified letter that a storm water drainage plan should be submitted to the Drainage Board at its next meeting and approved by the Drainage Board, along with a copy of the Stormwater Ordinance, highlighted about fines to be incurred. Motion carried, 4 to 0. Jack Grimble abstained from voting.

Deanna Durrett, reported the County Recorder will record Stormwater Plans and at no charge.

Deanna Durrett stated that the Shelley Drain is not designated as an urban drain. The Shelley Drain was taken off of assessment in the mid 60's and there are no funds available to fix the problems there. In the 60's there was no zoning in the city and county. This drain could be put back on assessment and there are approximately 900 property owners involved. David L. Burget of PRKD Properties, Inc. speaking about the Meadow Wood Apartments, stated that when heavy rains come the people in that area have to move their cars as their back ends of their cars start to float. He said there is an overgrown area that he feels could be dredged and cleaned out that would help the situation. It will not solve all the problems but would help in the short term. Bill McCormick along with Tom Cummins and Marc Bonwell will go over the Christopher Burke Report. Mr. Cummins would like to see this drain classified as an urban drain with separate commercial, residential and industrial assessments. Bill McCormick moved, seconded by Jack Grimble, to hold an urban drain hearing for the Shelley Drain on October 28, 2008, at 6:30 p.m., to put the Shelley Drain back on assessment in the council chambers in the city building. Mr. McCormick then amended his motion to state that the Surveyor and his staff will establish a location to hold the meeting. Motion carried, 5-0.

Joe Miller of Banning Engineering gave a report on the Foster Fletcher Drain. This drain involves 450 acres. He stated that the drainage works fine for the agricultural portion but it is the commercial area that is being addressed now. He presented the different options. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Jack Grimble, for Mr. Miller to get further details. This will be continued to the September 8, 2008 meeting. Motion carried, 5-0

John Gobin Hearing Continuation

Tom Cummins reported that Vester and Associates did a study on Tributary 1. To find the real source of the problem a camera needs to be used under the railroad bed at a cost of \$250 to \$300. Most likely it will have to be jetted first before the camera can go through at a cost of \$3,000 to \$4,000. and have contractor dig up the area for \$300. to \$400. These activities can come out of the maintenance fund. Bill McCormick moved, seconded by Jack Grimble, to continue the reconstruction hearing on the John Gobin Tributary 1 Drain until the September 8, 2008 meeting at 10:00 a.m. Motion carried, 5-0

New Business

Raymond Weliever #564 Petition

Tom Cummins reported that the Drainage Board has received a petition for advancing the date of reconstruction per IC 36-9-2 7 and 36 on the Raymond Weliever Drain from Gary and Anita Hardwick. Mr. Rhoads stated that the Raymond Weliever Drain is still in the red. Deanna Durrett stated after the assessments this year it will be in the black. Anita Hardwick stated that they have had the property for 12 years and the holes just keep getting bigger and more soil keeps washing away. This is at 1000 East, South of I-74 to 900 E to 300 S. Mrs. Hardwick says it is all tile and there are 6 huge holes. Mr. Cummins stated that it is basically functioning as an open ditch and it is a 475-acre watershed. Bill McCormick moved, seconded by Jack Grimble, to refer the Raymond Weliever Drain to the surveyor for his cost estimates and the cost estimates of an engineering study for a landowner hearing on October 27, 2008 at 10:00 a.m. Motion carried 5-0

Public Comment

Andrew McCorkle from Wingate spoke on the problems of the **Charles Ludlow #2** an open drain that is blocked by cornstalks from heavy rains. This maintenance will be over \$1,500. Tom Cummins will check with Merritt Excavating on his estimate as to the cost of the project.

Old Business

An update was given by Michel Veenhuizen of Livestock Engineering Solutions for the Kessler Swine Facility Storm Water Plan. Mark Kessler was also present. Mr. Veenhuizen stated that their plans are nearly ready for review. Mr. Veehuizen's will have the Plan and DLZ approval for the Drainage Board's October 27, 2008 meeting.

Reports

Mr. Cummins stated that after discussing the **James Servies Drain** with several contractors he felt that a reconstruction is not needed and repairs could be made out of maintenance funds.

Mr. Cummins stated that he is still working on the **Odis Stafford Drain** and asked to keep it on the agenda for the next meeting.

Tom Cummins reported that he has two bid proposals for the Chineyance Schenck Drain project. One from Frank James for \$13,415. and the other from Foster Farm Drainage, Inc. for \$5,919.90. Deanna Durrett stated that after assessments this year the Chineyance Schenck will be out of debt and will have enough money to cover this project. Jack Grimble moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to accept the bid of \$5,919.90 from Foster Farm Drainage, Inc. to do the work on the Chineyance Schenck Drain. Motion carried, 4-0.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Jack Grimble, to hold the landowners hearing for reconstruction on the <u>Guy Little #534Drain</u> Monday, November 24, 2008 at 9:30 a.m. Motion carried, 4-0.

Auditor Michelle Cash, and Stacy Ellsbury of the Auditor's office came to the meeting at the request of the Drainage Board about the **James Servies Drain** tax assessment that was not put on property tax statements correctly this year. Michelle Cash stated it was her fault for not catching the problem. Ms. Cash says they have no special training in understanding the county drain accounting system. Ms. Cash reported that they have had problems with the computer programs not being compatible at the courthouse. Ms. Cash stated she will send out an assessment statement to landowners on the **James Servies Drain** after the surveyor supplies a list of landowners. The assessment will not be due until November 10, 2008. Mr. Cummins states it would be easier if he could update from his office and be able to edit. Michelle Cash will make a phone call to get Mr. Cummins the ability to run reports and edit. Ms. Cash and Mr. Cummins will work on this together.

Tom Cummins presented the three proposals for feasibility studies from engineering firms on the Raymond Weliever Drain:

Mr. Cummins stated there were approximately 488 acres in the watershed of the Raymond Weliever Drain. Mr. Cummins stated that there were 8,000 feet of tile, which should probably be converted to an open ditch and that is the reason for the studies. Suanne Milligan inquired to whether we should commit to a study without the landowner hearing, because of the cost of study. Mr. Cummins replied that the study is needed to figure the cost of such a reconstruction project to be able to present a cost to the landowners as he does not feel he is qualified to give an actual cost estimate. It was stated that the cost of the study would be taken out of maintenance. Landowner petitioner Anita Hardwick was present and inquired about the people who came out last summer and if the landowner across the road would be put in the watershed. Mr. Cummins stated that was a field day of several drains last year and no one was charged to get an evaluation of what was needed and, "Yes" in the new watershed that he is creating the landowner across the road would be included. Joe Miller of Banning Engineering presented options for reconstruction costs of the **Thomas Wilkins Drain.**

Dan Gwin stated that tiling machines only go up to 24" and using 30"tile would substantially raise the price. Mr. Gwin also suggested cleaning up open ditches on some of their properties there. Approval of Minutes

Old Business

Marc Bonwell presented the Storm Water Plan for the New Market Volunteer Fire Department. It will be a 6,000 square foot building. There have been revisions since the first presentation in 2003. The DLZ has reviewed the plans and cleared it. The B & A Van Cleave Drain #559 is 100 feet from the building. Jack Grimble moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson to accept the stormwater plans for the New Market Volunteer Fire Department. Motion carried, 4-0.

New Business

Tom Cummins presented his classification report on the Smith-Elmore #641 Drain:

- Tile failing throughout
- Open drain constructed in middle of drain, through Dean Rush's property
- Open drain leads to drop structure which feeds back into tile (insufficient)
- Tile needs immediate replacement from drop structure to outlet
- Open drain which serves as outlet for tile is grown over and needs dredged

Drain Status 08: Active

Drain Classification 08: Reconstruction

Administrator's Recommendations:

Administrator classifies this drain for Reconstruction for 2009. The open ditch constructed on Dean Rush property needs dipped out, and a new, more functional structure is needed to allow the water to flow back into the tile. The tile needs to be replaced from drop structure to the outlet into the open drain on Gary Moore's property. The open ditch also needs to be dredged to allow better drainage.

Current maintenance assessment: \$9.55/acre

Proposed Maintenance Rate: \$2.25/acre (if reconstruction is approved) \$9.55/ acre (without reconstruction)

Approval of Minutes

Old Business

Marc Bonwell stated the Stormwater plan for the Marc Kessler swine facility is still being reviewed and he expects comments back this afternoon. Bill McCormick said the matter has been turned over to the county attorney to pursue the late fee fines. Deanna Durrett stated that the Drainage Board should hold a special meeting as soon as the plan is reviewed favorably by DLZ to stop the fines.

Deanna Durrett presented copies of the Drainage Maintenance and Improvement Report to the Drainage Board. This report gives information on each drain that has been worked on this year and who did the work. It does not balance with the Auditor as of yet. Deanna Durrett reported that she is getting the required signatures and working with the Auditor on the James Hose #572 Planning Grant.

Approval of Minutes

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Jack Grimble, to approve the minutes of the November 10, 2008 Drainage Board meeting. Motion carried, 5-0.

Thomas Wilkins #589 Drain Hearing

Tom Cummins reported that landowners from the **Thomas Wilkins #589 Drain** were re-noticed as new calculations were presented on this reconstruction project of \$254,180.00 total at \$339.89 per acre. Joe Miller of Banning Engineering reported that the scope of this project related to what the landowners had discussed at a previous meeting. Landowners present were Mr. and Mrs. Dan Gwin, Mr. and Mrs. Carl Gwin, CK Wilkins, and Ed Chenoweth. Dan Gwin reported that the price of tile had come down and felt that bids would be lower than projected. Ms. Durrett inquired about doing this project in phases. Mr. Cummins reported that after working with the Auditor, a pattern has been found of negative and positive numbers on their bookkeeping practices. The Auditor and the Treasurer's office balance with maintenance and improvement funds as of December 5, 2008.

Tom Cummins reported that he met with Joe Miller of Banning Engineer and Anita Hardwick concerning the **Raymond Weliever Drain #564** project. Mr. Miller is working on the study now.

Contractors have received their checks Mr. Cummins said for reconstructions projects; however a new quicker process is still needed.

Mr. Cummins reported that he has reviewed all the bids for the <u>James Servies Drain #703</u> and recommended that the Board accept the Wilson Construction's bid of \$13,683. Mr. Kessler discussed dipping on the east side of road and Mr. Cummins and William McCormick said the

tenant farmer had previously dipped on that side of the road. The Board stated that if need be in the future it could be done out of maintenance. William McCormick reported that the **EP McClaskey #544 Drain** was dredged about four years ago near the Rocky Ridge Golf Course and is again filling up with silt. According to Kenny Cain some farmers are not farming responsibly. Mark Kessler responded with that the Farm Service Agency has the right to take government payments away from landowners who are not farming responsibly on ground that highly erodes.

Other Business

Dan Gwin/Cox-Kelly Farms presented a petition for attachment to the Charles Leas #532 Drain. Mr. Gwin is the tenant farmer of this ground. It was noted that the assessment on this drain is seventy five cents per acre. Deanna Durrett stated that she would look into a report for raising the assessment rates on the Charles Leas #532 Drain. William McCormick moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson to grant the petition to connect to the Charles Leas #532 Drain, if Mr. Gwin will get the required landowner signature on the petition by 4:00 p.m. Friday, December 12, 2008, to Mr. Cummins office. Motion carried, 5-0.

New Business

The Drainage Board received a letter of resignation from Jack Grimble effective December 31, 2008. The reason given was not enough time to devote to the Drainage Board. William McCormick will take the resignation to the Commissioners to select a new Board member after conferring with the Soil and Water Conservation District Board.

Other Business

It was discussed whether to raise Mr. Cummins maintenance fund spending authority from \$1,500.00 to \$5,000.00 without going to the Drainage Board for approval. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by William McCormick, to give Tom Cummins maintenance fund spending authority up to \$5,000.00 if the amount is in the drain account. Motion carried, 5-0.

Discussion on a more timely method of securing reconstruction loans for contractors was brought up as it takes too long in the processing and the payment to the contractors doing the work. Joe Schalk suggested that possibly going to the bank before the reconstruction and getting a 15 % loan until final bill is submitted. Dan Gwin felt that contractors would submit lower bids if they knew they were going to be paid quicker. Donya Lester attended the Indiana Farm Bureau Conference in Evansville, IN and stated that the drainage code was a topic of discussion and if the code needed to be updated our board should bring it to the attention of the Indiana Farm Bureau. Deanna Durrett stated that the problem is with the timeliness of the Auditor and the Council, not the code.

The Board discussed the fee required for an obstruction **Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Jack Grimble, to lower the petition fee from \$175 to \$100.00 for an obstruction petition.**Motion carried, 5-0.

Public Comment

Mark Kessler reported that he has a beaver dam on a legal drain and would like to know if he took out the dam himself at no cost to anyone would he be fined or anything. The Drainage Board responded that they did not have the authority, either way to give on taking out beaver dams. William McCormick stated that the when the county takes out dams or log jams out of Sugar Creek they are not allowed to use a motorized vehicle in the water and that county highway employees go out in the water and hook up chains to the logs to bring them to the banks to cut up.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by William McCormick, to cancel the December 22, 2008 Drainage Board meeting. Motion carried, 5-0.

The next meeting will be Monday, January 12, 2009.

Suanne Milligan expressed thanks to Jack Grimble and William McCormick for their service on the board.

William McCormick moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to adjourn the meeting at 11:00 a.m. Motion carried, 5-0.

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met on January 12, 2009 at 9:30 a.m. at the Crawfordsville District Public Library in the basement conference room.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman David Rhoads, which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance and a prayer given by Rob Durrett.

Board members in attendance were David Rhoads, Chairman; Kenneth Pearson, Vice Chairman; Deanna Durrett, Secretary; Terry Hockersmith, Member; Tom Cummins, Surveyor; Vicki Emmert, Recording Secretary; and Suanne Milligan, attorney.

Also present were Rob Durrett of the Montgomery County League of Women Voters, Marc Bonwell, Mark Kessler, CK Wilkins, Jim Bowling of M & D Excavating, Anita Hardwick, Dave White, Tim Wilson of Wilson Construction & Excavating, Ed Chenoweth, Brenda Foster of Foster Farm Drainage, Wayne McCutchan, Jason McCutchan, Joellyn Maxwell of Maxwell Farm Drainage, Jacob Arthur of Arthur's Excavation and Phil Rice.

There were no minutes to approve.

Chairman David Rhoads welcomed Commissioner Terry Hockersmith to the board. Election of officers as follows. Kenneth Pearson moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett, to elect Dave Rhoads as chairman of the board. Motion carried, 4-0. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith to nominate Kenneth Pearson as vice chairman. Motion carried, 4-0.

David Rhoads moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to hire Suanne Milligan as the Montgomery County Drainage Board attorney. Motion carried, 4-0. It was stated that the County Council has appropriated funds for an attorney.

Discussion on times and places for Drainage Board meetings was conducted. The meetings are currently held on the second and fourth Monday of the month. Brenda Foster and Terry Hockersmith stated they would prefer evening meetings. It was tabled until the next meeting to set the schedule for the year as the fifth board member has not been selected yet. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to hold the next meeting on Monday, February 9, 2009 at 9:30 a.m. at the Crawfordsville District Public Library.

Old Business

Marc Bonwell presented to the board his recommendation that the Drainage Board approve the Storm Water Drainage Plan for the Kessler Hog Farm with one Variance. The Project is located in Section 4, Township 17 north, Range 4 west, Scott Township, Montgomery County, Indiana. Deanna Durrett, moved seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to approve the storm water drainage plan for Kessler Hog Farms with the variance. Motion carried, 4-0.

Deanna Durrett reported that the **Shelley Drain** landowner meeting previously scheduled for Tuesday, January 13, 2009, is cancelled due to not enough information available to present to the public from the city of Crawfordsville and the Surveyor's office.

Joe Miller of Banning Engineering presented a study on the **Raymond Weliever Drain # 564**, which is in Walnut Township North of New Ross. It is approximately 400 acres. The last known maintenance occurred in 1995. The study was from 900 E. to the outlet which is approximately 350 acres. The tiles have deteriorated due to trees. There are numerous tile holes. He recommended the tiles be upgraded to fifteen and eighteen inch tiles and a grass water way through the woods be constructed. There could possibly be a wet land issue in the woods. He presented three (3) alternatives:

Alternative 1 (Reconstructed tile along existing alignment)

Based on slope calculations estimated from a Banning Engineering field survey a 15' smooth interior wall tile is recommended through the wooded area just east of CR 900 East. From the downstream edge of the woods to the outlet an 18" tile is recommended. As part of this alternative it is recommended that the wooded area be cleared at least 40'to 50' each side of the installed tile to lesson the likelihood of root infiltration into the subsurface tile. Within the cleared area of the woods it is recommended a grassed waterway be installed to pass the overland flow to two 60" corrugated CMPs under CR 300 south. There is the potential need for environmental permits from the Indiana Department of Environmental Management or United States Army Corps of Engineers if this alternative is chosen.

Alternative 2 (Reconstructed tile north along CR 900 East)

A second alternative to divert the subsurface flow away from the wooded area north to Walnut Fork of Sugar Creek was also analyzed. A 21' tile would be required to pass the subsurface flow. This alternative passes through a high point along CR 900 East, and would require tile depths of 10' or more to outlet as shown on the exhibit. With the diversion of the upstream flow the existing regulated drain tile would be abandoned through the wooded area. At the edge of the wooded area the tile would be capped to cut off flow from the abandoned tile through the woods. Maintenance would be performed on the remainder of the existing regulated drain so it could adequately serve the grassed area just south of CR 300 South. This portion of the drain could potentially be abandoned by the County and become a mutual drain, or maintained by the county as a separate regulated drain.

Alternative 3 (Construct a ditch from CR 900 East to Walnut Fork of Sugar Creek)
The third, and final option considered was constructing a 2'to 3' deep open ditch through the woods and grassed field west of CR 900 East. An additional pipe would need to be installed under CR 300 South to serve as the outlet for the ditch since the current 60" diameter pipes are not low enough. The regulated drain tile downstream of CR 300 South would be abandoned, and all existing lateral connections would need to day lighted into the constructed open ditch. There is the potential need for environmental permits from the Indiana Department of Environmental Management or United Stares Army Corps of Engineers if this alternative is chosen.

This project could cost approximately \$65,000-\$80,000 at an approximate cost to landowners of \$200.00 an acre. Anita Hardwick stated she would prefer underground tiles. Tom Cummins is to contact Soil and Water about the hay field and the wetland issues. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to have Mr. Cummins present an estimated cost for Alternative #1 at the February 9, 2009 meeting for the <u>Raymond Weliever Drain # 564</u>. Motion carried, 4-0.

Mr. Cummins asked to keep the **Smith Elmore #641 Drain** on the agenda for the next meeting for classification and maintenance rates.

Mr. Cummins asked to keep the EP McClaskey #544 Drain report on the agenda for the next meeting to.

Deanna Durrett reported that a joint landowners meeting with Hendricks County will be held at Ladoga Public Library at 6:00 p.m. January 20, 2009. This is a meeting of the landowners, not a hearing to discuss the drainage issues on the **Albert Hysong #618 Drain**.

Tom Cummins opened and read sealed bids for the **John McCorkle Drain # 608** reconstruction project. His cost estimate is \$46,090.00 for the project. The bids were as follows:

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to refer the bids to Mr. Cummins and to hold a special meeting on Friday, January 16, 2009 at 8:00 a.m. at the Surveyor's office at 110 W. South Boulevard, Crawfordsville, IN to select a bid. Motion carried, 4-0.

Tom Cummins opened sealed bids for the **Glennard Miller #538 Drain** reconstruction project. His cost estimate is \$32,500.00 for the project. The bids were as follows:

Tom Cummins answered that contractors may use either but the excavator option is more expensive since a stone fill is required. Mr. McCutchan stated that he had put in a lot of laterals and asked if the contractor will connect these to the tile. Mr. Cummins said laterals reconnection will be part of the project and that Mr. McCuthan's identification of lateral locations will be helpful. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to take the bids under advisement and for Mr. Cummins to report back to the board on Friday, January 16, 2009 at 8:00 a.m. at the special meeting be held that morning. Motion carried, 4-0.

New Business

Deanna Durrett presented the Drainage Board 2008 Annual Report to the Board. A copy of this report is attached.

Dave Rhoads inquired about the **James Hose #572 Drain** Grant. Joe Miller of Banning Engineering stated that the study will start this coming week. While the engineer is there would be the time to run cameras through the tiles at Linden.

Marc Bonwell stated that Wendy's Frosty Management requesting to build at the corner of US 231 and Industrial Boulevard in the Foster Fletcher #573 Impact Area and they have gotten permission from the state highway to drain off into the state ditch. They are requesting a variance from the city Storm Water Ordinance in the Foster Fletcher #573 Impact area, which would direct all overflow water into the Foster Fletcher. Mr. Cummins will attend the TAC (Technical Advisory Committee) with the city. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to continue this discussion to the special meeting on January 16, 2009 at 8:00 a.m.

Other Business

Mr. Cummins presented a claim for the Minn-Miser-Corn Drain #539 Drain from Maxwell Farm Drainage for \$9,160.46. The claim is higher than the original estimates because a larger tile was required. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to approve the claim from Maxwell Farm Drainage for \$9,160.46 and to schedule a hearing to raise the assessment to \$4.00 an acre. Motion carried, 3-0. David Rhoads abstained from voting.

Dave White inquired about the upcoming **Shelley Drain** meeting. Joe Miller stated a good meeting format is to come prepared with displays for the landowners to understand the drainage problems in the area. This will be a joint meeting between the City and County Drainage Board.

Kenneth Pearson inquired about the Allie Peterson Drain. Mr. Cummins stated that he is seeking additional signatures on the petition.

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met on January 16, 2009 at 8:00 a.m. at 110 West South Boulevard, Crawfordsville in the conference room.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman David Rhoads, which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Board members in attendance were David Rhoads, Chairman; Kenneth Pearson, Vice Chairman; Deanna Durrett, Secretary; Terry Hockersmith, Member; Tom Cummins, Surveyor; Vicki Emmert, Recording Secretary; and Suanne Milligan, attorney.

Also present were, David Foster of Foster Farm Drainage, Wayne McCutchan, Janet McCutchan, Phil Rice, Jerry Janssen of Janssen LLC, Jacob Arthur of Arthur's Excavation, and Gerald Moore.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to approve the minutes from the November 24, 2008 and December 8, 2008 meetings. Motion carried, 3-0. Terry Hockersmith abstained from voting.

Mr. Cummins presented a spread sheet with all the bids on the **Glennard Miller #538 Drain** for review. The lowest bid is Arthur Excavating for \$27,384.00.

Landowners stated their views and asked questions about the procedure to award this contract. Gerald Moore of New Ross stated that he has seen some of Jacob Arthur's work and he tends to drag projects out and this would not be beneficial to anyone and he should not be awarded the job. Wayne McCutchan inquired to whether the Drainage Board has to give the bid to the lowest bidder and if the landowners have any say in the decision. Mr. Cummins stated it should go to the contractor who is qualified and has submitted the proper paperwork for the bid. Suanne Milligan stated that the Indiana Drainage Code 36-9-27-78C states the bid should be awarded to the lowest bidder who is qualified with the work experience to back it up. Ms. Milligan also stated the board does take into account what landowners say. Mr. Arthur spoke and stated that he has never done any work for Mr. Moore or Mr. McCutchan in the past, and he does good work, in a timely fashion, at a reasonable price and wants to prove himself on this project. David Foster inquired about how Mr. Arthur is going to put in the ditch. Mr. Arthur said he has purchased a wheel machine. Kenny Pearson stated that the board members should listen to the landowners if they have an objection, as they are the landowners who will pay for the reconstruction.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to open discussion on the <u>Glennard Miller #538</u>. Motion carried, 4-0.

Deanna Durrett asked if Mr. Arthur has done any work for the county recently. Mr. Cummins stated that he was contacted to complete a maintenance project in spring of 2008, on the William McBee Drain. Mr. Arthur was unable to begin the project in a timely manner; therefore Mr. Cummins contacted another contractor to complete the project. Mr. Cummins stated that Mr. Arthur has not worked on any county regulated drains, since before the fall of 2005. Deanna Durrett inquired as to how much supervision Mr. Cummins would give on a project such as this. Mr. Cummins stated he would be on the project site as much as possible during the installation of the tile, due to the grade of the tile and the depth issue. Mr. Pearson inquired about the price of putting in laterals. Mr. Cummins said the price given is for connecting laterals, not putting in new laterals. Mr. Rhoads asked Mr. Arthur if he has installed 15", 18", and 24" tile before. Mr. Arthur stated he has installed 15" tile with his excavator. Mr. Arthur stated that he has not installed any new tile with his wheel machine yet, as it is new. Terry Hockersmith asked, as he is new to the Drainage Board, if there are standards to go by to ensure that all drains will work when the project is complete. Mr. Cummins stated that the specifications used by the county are the manufacturer's specifications. Mr. Arthur stated that all of his equipment is on auto-grade, and uses lasers to establish depth. Mr. Arthur assured the board that he tries to do the best work possible, and strives to install tile at the optimal grade. Mr. Arthur stated that he is only 28 years old and he works to preserve his reputation. He also stated that he tries to bid jobs competitively and would like to be able to work for the county. Mr. Arthur pleaded with the board to give him the opportunity to prove himself, as he had a bad experience with the past County Surveyor. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to accept the bid from Arthur Excavating for \$27,384.00 for the *Glennard Miller Drain #538* reconstruction project. Motion carried 3-1. Kenny Pearson voted against.

The **John McCorkle #608 Drain** bids were received by Tom Cummins. The lowest bid was for \$27,601.00 from Arthur Excavating and meets all the requirements in the bid packet. Phil Rice, landowner, inquired if Mr. Arthur received both of the bids would he be able to get both projects

done before crop season. He stated that most of the work would be done on his land. He would like to be able to re-seed before April 1, 2009. It has lots of laterals and wanted to know if the road, when fixed, will not break down in the future. Mr. Arthur said yes. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to open the John McCorkle #608 Drain for discussion with the board. Motion carried, 4-0.

Wayne McCutchan inquired about the cost of a 24" T. He feels the bid is too low. Mr. Cummins stated that is why there is a 10% contingent clause in the project. Mr. Cummins says the bids are for T taps. Deanna Durrett inquired as to the size T taps were bid. Mr. Cummins says they are for 6" tiles. No one will know for sure what size is out there until the tiles are opened up. David Foster inquired of Mr. Cummins if the depth tile diagram would be submitted before working. Mr. Cummins stated he would be out there most of the time and it would be submitted when the project is done along with the bill. Phil Rice inquired about destroying the old tile. Mr. Cummins said it would be destroyed. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to award the bid to Arthur Excavating for \$27,601.00 for the John McCorkle #608 Drain reconstruction project. Motion carried, 4-0.

David Rhoads inquired of Mr. Cummins about the Foster Fletcher #573 impact area and the Wendy's that Frosty Management would like to build. Mr. Cummins has created a new contour watershed with real changes along 231 with little change of outlet. Mr. Cummins stated he had been in contact with the City engineer and he would also be attending the TAC Meeting on January 20, 2009. He stated the city would not approve this variance until the Drainage Board approves. Terry Hockersmith inquired as to if we have any recourse if Wendy's water flows into the watershed. Mr. Cummins says yes. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to give Tom Cummins the authority to speak for the Drainage Board to the city of Crawfordsville and to hold firm on the release rate in the impact area based on the variance they have submitted to the City. The Drainage Board will remove the property from the Foster Fletcher #573 as long as all water from the Wendy's goes into the state

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to adjourn at 8:52 a.m.

Deanna Durrett stated that the area newspapers <u>The Paper</u> and <u>The Journal Review</u> have not been able to attend our Drainage Board meetings due to conflicts. **Kenneth Pearson moved**, seconded by Phil Rice to hold the Drainage Board meetings on the second and fourth Fridays of the month at 9:30 a.m. at the Crawfordsville District Public Library. Motion carried, 5-0.

Guy Little Drain #534 Assessment Increase Hearing. Surveyor Cummins's reported as follows:

Proper notice of the hearing was given to all landowners on this drain.

Proposed yearly assessment- \$2907.66

The Guy Little #534 Drain is in need of maintenance, specifically a project to dredge the open drain which serves as the outlet for the tile. There is also approximately 1,500 ft. of 15" tile, which needs to be investigated and possibly replaced.

Minn-Miser-Corn Drain #539 Assessment Increase Hearing. Surveyor Cummins's reported as follows: Proper notice of the hearing was given to all landowners on this drain.

Proposed per acre assessment - \$4.00

Proposed yearly assessment - \$4,794.92

The Minn-Miser-Corn drain was repaired in December 2008, for the amount of \$9,160.46. This repair was to replace 985 ft. of 15" tile. This repair has left the drain in a deficit.

Maintenance balance as of 2/1/09 - \$0.00Improvement balance as of 2/1/09 - (\$2,736.83)

This Minn-Miser-Corn Drain is in Walnut Township. The assessment needs to be raised to take the drain out of debt. It will need more work in the future.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson to raise the assessment rate from \$1.25 to \$4.00 per acre for the <u>Minn-Miser-Corn Drain #539</u>. Motion carried, 3-0. David Rhoads and Phil Rice abstained from voting.

Deanna Durrett has spoken to the Mayor of Crawfordsville about a **Shelley Drain** landowner meeting. It was stated that the new board members should be briefed about this project and this could be done at the strategic planning meeting.

Mr. Cummins presented the **Raymond Weliever #564 Drain** report. This drain is in Walnut Township.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to hold a reconstruction landowners hearing for the <u>Raymond Weliever #564 Drain</u> on Friday, March 27, 2009 at 9:30 a.m. at the Crawfordsville District Public Library. Motion carried, 5-0.

Mr. Cummins reported the **Smith Elmore** # **641 Drain** is in need of a reconstruction. He cannot get a petition from landowners and recommends keeping the assessment rate of \$9.55 to pay back the deficit of this drain.

Mr. Cummins recommends keeping the EP McClaskey #544 Drain on the agenda.

Mrs. Durrett believes the Auditor's office has not processed the correction of errors for the over payment by landowners for 2006 on the **Kirkpatrick One** and **Martin Gray Drains**, joint drains with Tippecanoe County. Mike Emmert, in attendance stated he has not received any payment. Terry Hockersmith will meet with the Auditor about this matter.

Deanna Durrett reported that there is an issue with the Auditor concerning drain accounts. The Surveyor's office has not received an official listing of drain account balances for 18 to 24 months from the Auditor's office. The Surveyor is to turn in a list of drains that should be taken off of assessment by March 1, 2009, because they have over four years' assessment in their accounts. The Surveyor needs a list in order to balance with the fund balances. Mr. Hockersmith will discuss this with the Auditor also.

It was stated that the Montgomery and Hendricks County Surveyors and landowners met on January 20, 2009 to discuss the **Albert Hysong Joint Drain #618**. There was good attendance and much information was brought forth. The Surveyor will gather more information and report back.

A hearing on a petition to advance the date of reconstruction on the Allie Peterson Drain #549, was set for Friday, February 27, 2009 at 9:30 a.m. in the Crawfordsville District public Library.

Mr. Cummins presented the need of a strategic planning meeting. It was decided to hold a public strategic planning meeting on Friday, February 20, 2009 at 9:30 a.m. at 110 W. South Boulevard, Crawfordsville.

Mr. Cummins will present an off list for 2009 to the Drainage Board for their approval,

Mr. Cummins recommends assessment rate increases on the Wm. McClamroch #543, Charles Newkirk #594, and Wm. Z. McBee #610 drains. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to hold assessment rate increase hearings for <u>Wm. McClamroch #543</u> and to raise the rate from \$1.51 to \$4.50, the <u>Charles Newkirk</u> #594 from \$1.18 to \$4.00 and the <u>Wm. Z. Mc Bee # 610</u> from \$1.15 to \$5.00 on Friday, March 13, 2009 at the Crawfordsville District Public Library at 9:30 a.m. Motion carried, 5-0.

Mr. Cummins stated he did not recommend lowering the Wm. Buchannan #505 Drain from \$8.96 to \$4.00 as may need reconstruction. Mr. Cummins feels we need to talk to more of the landowners before making a decision to lower the rates. Jeff Linn and Ruth Bronaugh both asked questions about payments on the Raymond Weliever and Mr. Cummins stated more information would be provided at the reconstruction hearing. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to lower the rates on the <u>Rebecca Flaningam #516</u> from \$7.82 to \$.4.00, the <u>Raymond Weliever #564</u> from \$6.28 to \$4.00 and the <u>Odis Stafford #591</u> from \$11.19 to \$3.50. Motion carried, 5-0.

Deanna Durrett proposed having Gary Weliever of MS4 come to our February 27, 2009 meeting and brief the Board on the Sugar Creek Watershed.

There were no claims.

David Rhoads moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to adjourn the meeting at 10:30 a.m. Motion carried, 5-0.

MONTGOMERY COUNTY DRAINAGE BOARD Strategic Planning Meeting Friday February 20, 2009 MINUTES

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met on February 20, 2009 at 9:30 a.m. in the conference room at 110 W. South Boulevard.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman David Rhoads, which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Board members in attendance were David Rhoads, Chairman; Kenneth Pearson, Vice Chairman; Deanna Durrett, Secretary; Terry Hockersmith and Phil Rice Members; Tom Cummins, Surveyor; Vicki Emmert, Recording Secretary; and Suanne Milligan, attorney.

Also present Marian Lindow of the Montgomery County League of Women Voters, Marc Bonwell, CK Wilkins, Michelle Cash, Auditor; Donna Bowling, Treasurer, and Ed Stephens...

Mr. Rhoads welcomed everyone, and then turned the meeting over to Deanna Durrett. Changing the meeting dates from Friday to Tuesday was discussed. Kenneth Pearson moved, seconded by Phil Rice, to move the Drainage Board meetings from the second and fourth Friday to the second and fourth Tuesday of each month. Motion carried, 4-1.

Deanna Durrett reported that the Board will attend a field trip to the **Shelley Drain** along with the Crawfordsville city officials on Tuesday, February 24, 2009 at 10:15 a.m. following the Drainage Board meeting. We will be using the county van for transportation.

The Surveyor's ditch listing report as of February 11, 2009 is current with claims. Ms. Durrett referred to a listing with miles of tiles and waterways.

Mr. Cummins discussed the assessment rate inventory spread sheet. The drains that should be raised are highlighted.

Michelle Cash stated that Mr. Cummins should enter rate changes starting in November for the coming year. She will let Mr. Cummins know the deadline for this year, possibly the second week of March 2009.

Mr. Cummins presented the list of fifty-three drains to be taken off assessment as they have hit the four year cap. Two will be left on as they need additional maintenance. Mr. Cummins will take these off the ditch listing for the Auditor.

Tom Cummins gave the Board members the 2009 list of contractors who will be available to work for the Surveyor's office this year. These contractors all have their rates and insurance on file in the office. Deanna Durrett will make a list of contractors we used in 2008.

Mr. Cummins reported that he is working on drawing new watersheds for all the drains. He asked about the procedure the board would like. Mr. Rhoads discussed the area in which he lives and that open ditches and tiles may need to be assessed at different rates. Deanna Durrett suggested bringing the watersheds to the board as Mr. Cummins finishes them.

Correction of Error Report

Deanna Durrett reported that a letter from Tippecanoe County to the Surveyor's and the Auditor's offices that their county has taken the Kirkpatrick One and the Martin Gray drains off of assessment in 2006. After discovering that nothing was done to correct this situation a correction of error letter was sent to all landowners to file for a refund of assessment for 2006. Ms. Durrett reported that after sending these forms onto the Auditor's office that they did not credit the landowners tax forms as they stated they had done. Ms. Cash cannot run them through MVP. Michelle Cash has talked to the State Board of Accounts. She states that the Surveyor will have to file a claim, with property owner, address and parcel number to receive their refunds. These may be submitted to either Michelle Cash or Charlie Leslie. Ms. Durrett inquired about interest on these refunds. Suanne Milligan stated the county pays no interest in this situation. The Auditor stated if a landowner owned more than one parcel to put them all on the same claim. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith to direct the Surveyor to prepare claims for the 2006 year for the Kirkpatrick One and Martin Gray Drains with no interest and to pay each landowner no matter the sum of refund. Motion carried, 5-0.

Drain Account Balances

Michelle Cash explained her procedure with the Harris Computer System in tracking the drain account balances. She stated that all transfers have to be signed by the Surveyor, Tom Cummins and Terry Hockersmith, Commissioner. Ms. Durrett will get back with Ms. Cash on account balances.

Deanna Durrett presented a handout of information regarding the Stormwater Ordinance 90-5 and the Mark Kessler Stormwater plan for his hog farm facility. It was stated that on January 12, 2009, DLZ approved the Kessler plan. At this time the commissioners have not resolved the situation with the fine. Ms. Milligan will prepare a letter to the commissioners to impose the fine. Michelle Cash noted that this is a Class C infraction by the county. Kenneth Pearson moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett, to request Attorney, Suanne Milligan to draft a letter to the County Commissioners regarding the Mark Kessler Swine Facility Stormwater Plan fines. Motion carried, 3-0. Phil Rice and Terry Hockersmith abstained from voting.

Polices and Procedures

The Drainage Board policies and procedures were presented to Board Members. They will be discussed on March 10, 2009.

Other Business

Deanna Durrett turned the meeting back to David Rhoads.

Donna Bowling inquired about a parcel of land that was taxed on a reconstruction that was incorrect. She has found the correct landowner. Tom Cummins will look into this issue.

C K Wilkins inquired as to what has to be done to put drains back on assessment that were taken off in 1968. It was stated that a hearing has to be held to raise the assessment.

Ed Stephens inquired if the county's windmill ordinance will affect drainage. Phil Rice reported that on his property that is leased, the leassee will fix all tiles due to weight of their equipment that runs over the tiles. Marc Bonwell reported that Montgomery County Commissioners are looking into the drainage requirements. If a drain easement is affected, they will need Board approval and have to submit, a plan, etc. to the Board. The meeting was adjourned at 11:00 a.m.

There were no minutes to approve.

Allie Peterson #549 Drain petition by landowners.

Terry Cain presented a petition for reconstruction of the Allie Peterson #549 Drain, located in Sugar Creek Township. Landowners in attendance were Terry Cain and Ed Gable. It is approximately 1,200 to 1,300 acres. The outlet is a 24" tile which is eroding away. The culvert on CR 1050 was put in during the WPA days and has given way on both sides. Mr. Cain stated that it seemed unfair that the Surveyor has to set a high estimate as that sometimes keeps landowners from wanting to do the required work that is needed on the drains. Mr. Cain inquired as to whether Mr. Cummins has the right to walk on property owners land. The answer is, "yes", and Mr. Cain and Mr. Gable may walk with him. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to hold a reconstruction hearing on the <u>Allie Peterson #549 Drain</u> on Tuesday, April 14, 2009 at 9:30 a.m.

Deanna Durrett presented a copy of the 2009 Drainage Board meeting dates.

Ms. Durrett reported on items discussed at the February 20, 2009 strategic planning meeting. Items discussed: the Shelley Drain, correction of errors concerning the Kirkpatrick One and Martin Gray Drains, Kessler Swine Farm Stormwater plan.

New business

Mr. Cummins presented the list of drains to take off assessment for 2009. He will turn it in to the Auditor's office.

Board members signed the order to raise the assessment rates for the Guy Little #534 Drain to \$6.00 and the Minn-Miser-Corn #539 Drain to \$4.00.

Mr. Rhoads inquired about holding a rate increase hearing for the drains that were taken off assessment in 1968 as they have a zero balance. Hearings will be scheduled as needed or requested by landowners.

Mr. Rhoads inquired about contractors who can spray ditches. Mr. Cummins reported there are two county licensed sprayers, Glenco and Turner. Dalton's from northern Indiana inquired about spraying for the county. They agreed to look over the drains that need maintenance free of charge, and give an estimate. Mr. Rhoads suggested a rotation for spraying drains. Deanna Durrett suggested that Mr. Cummins look into becoming licensed to spray, not to spray, but to be knowledgeable. Mr. Cummins said it would be easier to inquire of herbicides, etc. that can be used if he were licensed as no one wants to give out information if you are not licensed. Mr. White inquired as to how wide an area would be sprayed. Mr. Cummins said only the slopes are sprayed to get rid of underbrush and trees, not the grass. Joe Miller stated that only certain types of grass can be seeded as some kill wildlife.

Terry Hockersmith reported that someone had inquired of him what to do about a neighbor who was dumping water on their property with a six inch pipe. Do we have recourse? Tom Cummins said the issue is not within the jurisdiction of the Drainage board. It will require legal action by the aggrieved landowner under the "Common Enemy" law.

Terry Hockersmith also reported that a landowner on the west edge of New Market owns a pond which overflows onto another property. Due to the absence of Planning and Zoning in the county, the landowner has no recourse.

There were no claims.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to adjourn the meeting and proceed to the *Shelley Drain* field trip at 10:16 a.m. Motion carried, 5-0.

Minutes approved

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to approve minutes from the February 9, 2009, February 20, 2009, and the February 24, 2009 Drainage Board meetings. Motion carried, 4-0.

Assessment Rate Increase Hearings

Charles Newkirk #594 Drain Proper notice was given to all landowners. The drain, located in Madison Township was constructed in 1917. Mr. Cummins created a new contoured watershed. There are 568.23 acres in the drain; the tile length is 5,500 foot, with 8", 10", 12", 15" and 18" tiles. On October 14, 2008 the Surveyor inspected and classified the drain.

Surveyor's Notes:

- Drain consist of two tributaries
- Outlets into the Joe Hall Ditch
- Outlets clear and functioning well
- Few tile holes repaired in 2008
- South tributary is structurally sound
- North tributary needing sections replaced
- New contoured watershed created on 3/6/09

Drain Status: Active

<u>Surveyor's Recommendations</u>: The Surveyor classifies this drain for Maintenance for 2009. Northern tile needs to be investigated and replaced in a couple of troubled sections, and possibly re-sized. The current maintenance assessment is \$1.18 and should be increased to \$4.00 per acre.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to raise the maintenance assessment from \$1.18 to \$4.00 per acre on the <u>Charles Newkirk #594 Drain.</u> Motion carried, 4-0.

Wm. Z. McBee #610 Drain Proper notice was given to all landowners. Cox-Kelly Farms, Inc. was returned by mail as they are out of town. Mr. Cummins received one phone call from Mary Winger inquiring about the hearing. The drain was constructed in 1898 and is in Madison Township. There are 455.75 acres in the drain and the tile length is 8,900 feet with 12, 14, 15, 16, 18, 20,22,24,27, and 30 inch tiles. On June 10, 2008 the Surveyor inspected and classified the drain.

Surveyor's Notes

- Tile broken down on downstream end
- Outlets into the Ermentrout tributary of the Lye Creek Ditch
- Outlet replaced in 2008; 40 ft. of 30" tile under CR 900 N.
- Few tile holes need repaired in 2009
- New contoured watershed created on 3/5/09

Drain Status: Active

<u>Surveyor's Recommendations</u>: The Administrator classifies this drain for maintenance for 2009. Tile holes need repaired on downstream end and possible investigation to

determine quality of tile. The current assessment rate is \$1.25 per acre and should be raised to \$5.00 per acre.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to raise the maintenance assessment rate from \$1.25 to \$5.00 on the <u>William Z. McBee #610</u>. Motion carried 4-0.

Benjamin Remley #597

The Benjamin Remley #597 Drain is in North Union Township. Mr. Cummins stated there are repairs that need to be done and if the Drainage Board would allow raising the rates, it could all be done out of maintenance. The current rate is \$3.00 and he would like to raise it to \$6.00. Mr. Cummins has been in contact with Richard Harshbarger who farms the Caster farm. Deanna Durrett suggests that Mr. Cummins contact some of the larger landowners and explain the situation, prior receiving a hearing notice in the mail. She also inquired if the Detchon Adams Drain, which is not assessed, has an impact on this drain. Mr. Cummins said no. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to hold a rate assessment hearing for the Benjamin Remley #597 on April 14, 2009 at 9:30 a.m. at the Crawfordsville District Public Library to raise the rates from \$3.00 to \$6.00. Motion carried, 4-0.

Old Business

Mr. Cummins received a petition from Randy Borden and Wayne Kessler who comprise approximately 20% of the John Galey Drain #518. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to hold a hearing on the petition to advance the date for reconstruction on the <u>John Galey Drain #518</u> on March 24, 2009 at 9:30 a.m. at the Crawfordsville District Public Library. Motion carried, 4-0.

Mr. Cummins reported on the Moses Maxwell Drain # 603. He said that beaver have been causing major problems there and he has contractor Frank James working to clear the beaver dam and brush in area. The contractor has completed 7/10 of a mile at a cost of \$5000. The drain needs more work up to the county line, plus the northern and southern sections need work. Mr. Cummins stated there is money in the drain account to finish this project. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to allow Mr. Cummins to finish cleaning the Moses Maxwell Drain #603 and not to exceed the amount in the account. Motion carried, 4-0.

Mr. Cummins reported that Lye Creek Drain #535 in Madison Township also has a beaver problem. Both outlets are blocked. A contractor destroyed the beaver dams, but new dams appeared again. Contractor John Wilcox provided an estimate to clean out 5 log jams, brush removal and ditch cleanout at for a total of \$38,620 with a 10% contingent clause. The drain has approximately \$49,000 in the account. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to award John Wilcox the <u>Lye Creek Drain #535</u> project and to complete it by August 1, 2009. Motion carried, 4-0.

Foster Fletcher Drain #573

Mr. Cummins reported that the Hampton Inn would like to connect a private tile which is in the urban Foster Fletcher impact area into the farm Foster Fletcher Drain #573. Mr. Cummins spoke to Nikki Copeland about this tile as the Hampton Inn has opened their private tile and allowed slit to fill it up partially. At this point the Drainage Board will not allow it to connect to the Foster Fletcher Drain #573. Chris Kaufman from BLM stated that a letter has been sent to landowners from the City of Crawfordsville requiring the landowners to fix the problem before they will be given the permit to allow occupancy of the Hampton Inn. Joe Miller of Banning Engineering said when the study was done this tile is not sufficient in size for the area. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to authorize Tom Cummins to hire a contractor to dig a silt basin to protect the Foster Fletcher Drain #573. Motion carried, 4-0.

Other Business

Mr. Cummins reported that Joe Carter and Hobb Mennon contacted Mr. Cummins and both have agreed to new specifications on the **Ottis Stafford Drain #591**.

Phase I – Completed @ \$15,166.55

Phase II - Completed @ \$9,625.00 Phase III- Change Order

- Approved to install 1,600 feet of 24' tile from west side of CR 600 E. to outlet
- Requested change to install 500' of 15" smooth-core tile at outlet, 2,486' corrugated tile across Carter/Mennen property line, to connect to existing 12" tile.

Mr. Cummins reported that the watershed changed due to new information regarding drainage area, and inaccurate tile maps. Less watershed acreage negated the need for a 24" tile. New calculations performed, called for a 15" smooth-core tile at the outlet. This change was agreed to by affected landowners and contractors.

Mr. Cummins stated there will be 50 acres less in the watershed and a cost increase of 16% to landowners. Terry Hockersmith moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to give permission to the change order for the <u>Ottis Stafford Drain #591</u>. Motion carried, 4-0.

Public Comment

Suanne Milligan reported that Montgomery County, Montgomery County Drainage Board and the Montgomery County Highway Department are being sued by Marcella Anderson of New Market, Indiana, filed February 26, 2009. The suit has been referred to the county attorney and the county's insurance carrier.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to adjourn the meeting at 11:04 a.m. Motion carried, 4-0.

Also present Marian Lindow of the Montgomery County League of Women Voters, Dave White, Joe Miller of Banning Engineering, Frank Phillips, Journal Review, Marc Bonwell, Gary Weliever, Chris Kaufman of BLM, David Peebles, Tom Mitchell, Rob Durrett, Mayor Charles Coons, Frank T. Luse of INDOT and Barry Lewis The Paper.

It was reported that a one million dollar economic stimulus grant application has been submitted to the State for the Shelley Drain.

Storm water fees and drain assessment were discussed. Chris Coffman City engineer, said at the moment there is no money for capital projects in the city fund. The city will have a meeting on March 30, 2009 to propose rates for the stormwater utility fees, possibly \$6.00 per household and \$10.00 commercial per month. Deanna Durrett inquired if landowners on the Shelley Drain would have to pay the utility fee and the assessment. The answer was yes, even though not all landowners will understand the benefit of both fees.

The possibility of a joint drainage board with the city was discussed. Ms. Milligan referenced the Indiana Code that does not provide for a city/county board. Discussion about whether the assessment would stay on the drain if it was turned over to the city was questioned. Suanne Milligan and the city's attorney David Peebles would look into this and joint board issues.

Tom Cummins presented three project ideas to eliminate some of the water problems. They would cost approximately \$18,000, \$40,000 and \$15,000. Mr. Cummins stated if done by reconstruction, the landowners would see an immediate benefit and would pay over the next five years.

This meeting was continued to March 24, 2009 at 11:00 a.m. in the Crawfordsville District Public Library.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to approve minutes from the March 10, 2009, and the March 10, 2009 Shelley meetings. Motion carried, 4-0.

Raymond Weliever #564 Reconstruction Hearing

Proper notice was given to all landowners. Landowners in attendance were Helen Bronaugh. John & Ruth Bronaugh, Bill Demaree, Leslie H. Ebaugh, Anita Hardwick, Everette J. & Verna Newton, Mary & Sonny Reed, Jan Tate, and Jimmie Vogel. Tom Cummins Surveyor presented the **Raymond Weliever #564** reconstruction project report. A study was done by Banning Engineering. This drain is in Walnut Township. The proposed project consists of the following:

Landowners in attendance inquired about the area that would be reconstructed and where it would stop and start. Anita Hardwick inquired if Mr. Cummins had heard if the Soil and Water Conservation would be working with this project as well. Mr. Cummins stated at this time no. Said a field would have to be farmed at least one year for the Soil and Water to be involved. Mrs. Hardwick stated that hay has been harvested from the field and asked if that would count. Mr. Cummins did not think so and will check on this issue. Fortunately the area through the woods is not a designated wetland. This project will go through the normal bid process as it is under \$100,000.00. Landowners in attendance felt the Drainage Code interest of 10% is very high. The payments may be spread over a five year span or all paid for up front by landowners. Mr. Reed inquired about whether maintenance assessment collected would stay in the Raymond Weliever #564 Drain account under maintenance. Mr. Cummins stated "yes". Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Phil Rice, to reconstruct the Raymond Weliever #564 Drain pursuant to the Surveyor's Report at an approximate cost of \$92,850. Motion carried, 4-0.

John Galey #518: Landowner petition to advance the date of reconstruction. Petition landowners in attendance were Randy Borden and Wayne Kessler. Mr. Cummins reported camera work showed that the tile is running at about 40% capacity. It looks like when the tile was put in under the railroad it was not bedded properly and with the weight of the trains has settled over the years; now it is not functioning to full capacity. There are two options: (1) to bore under the railroad and reconnect the tile (2) run a new tile alongside the track line to the creek. Either option will cost approximately \$40,000. The existing tile under the railroad will take care of the twelve acres on the

other side of the railroad. Mr. Cummins will remove those acres from the watershed. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to schedule a reconstruction hearing for the <u>John Galey #518 Drain</u> for May 26, 2009 at 9:30 a.m. at the Crawfordsville District Public Library. Motion carried 4-0.

Old Business

Mr. Cummins reported contractor Frank James is two-thirds of the way done with the **Moses Maxwell #603 Drain** and is on the third phase.

Mr. Cummins reported contractor John Wilcox is working on tree removal on the Lye Creek Drain #535.

Mr. Cummins reported that a silt basin along the property line of Wright Implement in the Foster Fletcher Impact Area had been dug.

Deanna Durrett reported that the **Martin Gray and Kirkpatrick One Drain** 2006 refunds have been sent out from the Auditor's Office. Ms. Durrett has contacted some of the landowners and they said they have received their refund checks.

Mr. Cummins reported that Curt Hudson of the **John Gobin #520 Drain** would like to see the reconstruction go a different direction and use a pumping station. Deanna Durrett inquired as to why he did not present this at the reconstruction hearing. Joe Miller of Banning Engineering doesn't know if pumping stations are even legal to use. Phil Rice stated there are major costs for pumping stations and overseeing them. Mr. Cummins stated they will not bore until after crop season. The reconstruction will proceed as ordered on November 10, 2008.

New Business

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Phil Rice, to hold a rate increase assessment hearing for the <u>Wm McClamroch #543 Drain</u> to raise the rates from \$1.51 to \$4.50 per acre on April 28, 2009 at 9:30 a.m. at the Crawfordsville District Public Library. Motion carried, 4-0.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to cancel the June 9, 2009 Drainage Board meeting. Motion carried 4-0.

Other Business

Deanna Durrett collected from the Drainage Board their correct e-mail addresses. Ms. Durrett presented a listing report of contractors used since 2004 and the amounts awarded them. She stated in 2008, forty-five drains were worked on and two reconstructions were completed.

Under Policies and procedures Deanna Durrett reviewed the Drainage Board mission statement adopted June 12, 2007. **Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to again adopt the mission statement. Motion carried, 4-0.** . "The mission of the Montgomery County Drainage Board is to assure that the county's regulated drain system complies with state and county laws and professional drainage standards; provides adequately functioning and financially sound drains; and earns public and landowner trust."

Deanna Durrett reported on Drainage Board member qualifications. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to approve the revised Board Member expectations and qualifications. Motion carried 4-0. Exhibit A

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Phil Rice, to approve the procedure for a drain repair. Motion carried, 4-0. (Revised Exhibit B)

Other Business

Tom Cummins presented a petition for attachment to the George McClain Drain #541 from Louis Manson. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Phil Rice, to allow connection to the <u>George McClain Drain #541</u>. Motion carried 4-0.

Tom Cummins reported that he would like to see a county ordinance to have 30 foot filter strips along all regulated drains. Phil Rice would like to know who would over see this

project. Would it be the Drainage Board or Soil and Water? Joe Miller stated Hamilton County has standards on filter strips. Ms Milligan was asked to research and draft an ordinance. Mr. Cummins and Mrs. Durrett will provide information from other counties.

Terry Hockersmith moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett, to adjourn the meeting at 10:43 a.m. Motion carried 4-0.

Mr. Cummins reported that proper notice was given to landowners. It was stated that drain is in need of repair and is still in debt (\$587.62). The outlet is broken down and about 300 feet from outlet it is covered with willow trees. It will cost approximately \$10,000.00 to repair. Landowner Roger Harshbarger stated the outlet is not working properly and Shawn Ramey attended to be informed. Kenneth Pearson moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett, to raise the assessment on the <u>Benjamin Remley #597</u> from \$3.00 to \$6.00. Motion carried, 5-0.

Allie Peterson #549 Reconstruction Hearing

Mr. Cummins reported that proper notice was given to landowners. The project would entail:

Mr. Rhoads stated a petition had been filed by landowners. Ed Gable stated he would have liked to see the project done on a larger scale. John Cook inquired as to when it would be repaired. Mr. Cummins stated it would be done after the bid process and hopefully could be done in the dry summer months. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Phil Rice, to reconstruct the <u>Allie Peterson #549 Drain</u> at an approximate cost of \$143,821. Motion carried, 5-0.

Old Business

Deanna Durrett stated that it may be on the Montgomery County Commissioner's agenda to resolve the issue of the Kessler Swine Facility fines.

Deanna Durrett stated that each year a review is done of polices and procedures. Policies on repairing drains that are in debt and reimbursement of landowners for repair of deficit drains were reviewed. Deanna Durrett moved, to resend the policies as they are no longer needed. There was no second to the motion. Dave Rhoads stated polices would stay in affect.

New Business

Tom Cummins reported that the Jesse Snoddy #553 Drain needs an emergency repair as there is an open tile hole at an electric pole. This hole is close enough to the road that the contractor can sit on the road to repair it. He has a contractor ready to repair it. This drain is on assessment at \$7.72 per acre and is still in debt. Several years ago work was done in the area and the contractor hit quick sand and the drain went into debt at this time trying to repair it. Board granted Mr. Cummins permission to repair.

Mr. Cummins presented a petition and diagram from Beck's Hybrid's to connect to the John Wilkinson Drain. This tile crosses I-74 on the north side and is west of the Frey Farm. Mr. Cummins stated connection to the John Wilkinson Drain would not hinder the drainage in the area. Kenneth Pearson moved, seconded by Phil Rice, to allow Beck's Hybrid to attach to the John Wilkinson #565 Drain. Motion carried, 4-0. Deanna Durrett abstained.

Jim Biddle of Biddle Construction presented a diagram for expansion of the old Bertsh Food building. The owners would like to expand on the southwest corner to build office spaces. The building expansion will be either a 28 x 32' or 24 x 28'. Marc Bonwell stated this area is gravel and is semi impervious and is in the Shelley Drain watershed. At this time there is a no build ordinance on the Shelley Drain. It was stated that Ceres Solution has mentioned they would like to expand and they are also in the Shelley Drain. There are no existing stormwater tactics in area. More information is needed and this There are no existing stormwater taches in area. Priore information is necessary request will be kept on the agenda for the next Drainage Board meeting on April 28, and the second

Tom Cummins reported on the Prince Croy and the George Conrad Drains that are both off of assessment at the present. These drains both tie into the William McClamroch #543 Drain. He recommends that they both be put back onto assessment at a rate of \$5.00 per acre. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to schedule rate assessment hearings to raise the rates from zero to \$5.00 per acre for the Prince Croy and the George Conrad on Tuesday, May 26, 2009 at 9:30 a.m. at the Crawfordsville District Public Library. Motion carried, 5-0.

REAL THE

Ms. Milligan reported she is waiting on more information before proceeding with a filter strip ordinance. She will report on May 26, 2009.

Mr. Greg Miller attorney for landowners Dan Booher and John Binder presented information on their drainage problem on Memorial Drive. They have come to the Drainage Board to present their case, not knowing for sure if this is the place to start or not. It was stated that a report was made by Deckard Engineering in June 2008. These landowners did not have a drainage problem until Memorial Drive was completed. At this time they have a continuous water flow across their property. A tort claim can only be filed within the time limit of 180 days and that timeline starts March 16, 2009. Deanna Durrett inquired as to why a drainage plan was never submitted. Marc Bonwell and Tom Cummins stated they never received a drainage plan for the road when it was built. This road project was paid for by county, state and federal money. Marc Bonwell stated that INDOT should have done a study of the area. Mr. Miller said their agenda is not to find blame, but to get the problem solved. Terry Hockersmith will have this problem put on the commissioner's agenda. Dan Booher said he would never have hired a lawyer if Brett Cating had not told him they had all the required permits and would not do anything about the drainage. Mr. Booher said he would meet with Steve Yeager of the Highway Department over a fence issue.

Gary Weliever, of MS4 of the City of Crawfordsville, gave a presentation and history of MS4. MS4 stands for Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System. MS4 currently affects only the city and the two mile zone. Mr. Weliever stated he has mapped 1,400 outlets in Crawfordsville. He showed examples of water filtration gardens and two-stage ditch design to slow down water and allow water filtration back into the ground water level. Mark Kessler inquired as to how well two-stage ditch designs work without overgrowth maintenance becoming a problem. Mr. Weliever stated native plants stop invasive plants. Joe Miller stated that 2-stage meander ditches works very well with less sediment. MS4's time frame to start collecting fees is August 2009.

Public Comment

Mark Kessler reported that when the second phase of Ladoga road project was done they took a reduced amount for their land in exchange for a crossing. There is now an erosion problem as the culvert is under sized. The crossing is a 15" and should have been a 40". The county says it is his problem. He would like some suggestions of what to do? The **Joel Tobin #576 Drain** is only 150 feet away. Terry Hockersmith said the county is going to go back and look at who the engineer was at the time and the legal aspect of it all. Mr. Rhoads asked Mr. Kessler to keep the Drainage Board informed of the situation.

Suanne Milligan reported that the county insurance will provide the legal defense for the Marcella Anderson lawsuit.

Tom Cummins presented a petition from Mike Patton to accept a private drain into the **Charles Cowen #510 Drain**. When the landowner had the tile worked on it was found that the tiles run parallel of each other and were put in at the same time. It is highly likely both tiles are county tiles.

Phil Rice moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett, to accept the petition to make a private drain a part of the <u>Charles Cowen #510 Drain</u>. Motion carried 5-0.

Mike Patton stated he would like to be reimbursed for recent work on the private tile that has now become part of the **Charles Cowan #510 Drain**. Deanna Durrett proposed that Mr. Patton and Mr. Cummins work together, and then submit the cost of the project to the next meeting.

Ćlaims

Mr. Cummins reported that the George Hutchinson #527 Drain was in need of an emergency repair as tiles and the headwall were dangerously near a county road. Deamna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Péarson, to pay the claim of \$6142.54 to Bart Maxwell for the work that was completed on the George Hutchinson#527 Drain. Motion carried, 5-0.

Mr. Rhoads inquired as to the status of the **Thomas Wilkins #589 Drain**. Mr. Cummins and Ms. Milligan are working on this project because it requires additional federal bidding procedures since it is over \$200,000.00.

Mr. Rhoads inquired on the time line for the Linn-Himes #533 Drain reconstruction as he had heard there was going to be a new fertilizer plant in the area. Mr. Cummins stated that tile rates are going down in price. Mr. Rhoads thought Mr. Cummins should look into this situation possibly as this could affect the reconstruction.

Montgomery County Drainage Board Tuesday, April 28, 2009 Public Meeting Shelley Drain Minutes

The Montgomery County Drainage Board held a public forum for the Shelley Drain on Tuesday, April 28, 2009 at 6: 30 p.m. at the Montgomery County 4-H Fairgrounds. The meeting was called to order by Chairman David Rhoads. Mr. Rhoads welcomed guests and introduced city and county officials. Approximately fifty people attended. An attendance sheet has been filed in the office of the county Surveyor. The meeting was then turned over to Tom Cummins, Surveyor.

Tom Cummins stated we have a new working relationship with the city of Crawfordsville. Mr. Cummins gave a history of the Shelley Drain that was built in the early 1900's as an agricultural drain and was established as a county drain in 1911. It has 23,000 feet of sub-terrarium tile. He explained the difference between subsurface water and surface water. Numerous studies have been done over the years. The 1999 Christopher Burk, 2004 Army Corp of Engineers and the Multi Hazard study in 2006. Areas within the Shelley Drain with drainage problems are the Raybestos factory, Meadow Wood, Eastern Acres, and Cloverdale Heights housing developments. There is a western and an eastern leg of the Shelley Drain with most of the drainage problems occurring in the eastern leg. The money spent on the studies was allocated by the county as the Shelley Drain is not on assessment and has no money for repairs or anything else. A lot of mistakes have been done in the past and we are trying to work through them and correct some of the water issues in the Shelley Drain for the community.

Mr. Cummins stated there are four assessment options: 986 parcels

Mr. Cummins presented the following repair options;

Install approximately 800 ft. of 24" tile from junction of tributaries (Exhibit A.) to existing outlet behind Raybestos. 800 ft. of 24" tile @ \$20.00 per foot =\$16.000)

Install and re-direct approximately 3,000 ft. of 18" tile between First Baptist Church and Montgomery Place Condominiums, across SR 32, northwest across the crop field, and west behind Jiffy Lube. (Exhibit B.) 3,000 ft of 18" tile @ \$14. per = \$42,000

Repair broken down areas of existing tile through wooded area, and west of Eastern Acres Subdivision. (Exhibit C.) Approximately 10 areas @ \$1,000/ ea. = \$10,000

Examine the need for retention/detention in trouble areas; Cloverdale/Meadow Wood apartments and Eastern Acres (Exhibit D.).

Deanna Durrett stated that no one has paid an assessment or taxes on the Shelley Drain since 1968.

Mr. Cummins and the Drainage Board answered questions about the following issues:

- Drainage problems. Mr. Cummins showed problem areas on the overhead.
- Who will pay for assessments and repairs? Mr. Cummins described various rate options and the process for payment of assessments.
- Mr. Cummins explained the watershed and the provision of the state law
- When would the project begin? Mr. Cummins said repairs can begin as soon as an assessment has been ordered by the Board

• Are there other watersheds within the City? Shelley Drain is the main watershed in Crawfordsville.

When there is a hearing on an assessment rate scheduled, all landowners will be notified by certified mail with date, time and place to be announced in a notice.

It was moved and seconded to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried.

Board members in attendance were Chairman, David Rhoads; Kenneth Pearson, Vice Chairman; Deanna Durrett, Secretary; Terry Hockersmith, Phil Rice members. Tom Cummins, Surveyor; and Vicki Emmert, Recording Secretary and attorney Suanne Milligan were present.

Also present Marian Lindow of the Montgomery County League of Women Voters, Dave White, Joe Miller of Banning Engineering, John R. Mayotte, Fredrick Crum, Peggy A. Fyffe, Jim A. Bittle, Marion Fyffe, Mike Patton, Jeff Troike, and Ken W. Presslor,

Assessment Hearing

The Surveyor reported that William McClamroch # 543 Drain is in North Union Township and is currently in debt \$2,486.79. Landowners in attendance were Fredrick Crum, Marion Fyffe, and Peggy Fyffe. Mr. Crum stated that at this time no more improvements were needed on the drain and feels the proposed rate of \$4.50 is too high and would like to see it at \$3.00. Mr. Fyffe stated his water runs north and does not feel he should have to pay the assessment. Mr. Cummins reported that new contour watersheds have been created, instead of using the old squared off maps. Mr. Cummins showed the landowners where their properties were in the watershed with the GIS program. Phil Rice moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to raise the assessment rate from \$1.51 to \$3.00 on the William McClamroch #543 Drain. Motion carried, 5-0.

Old Business

Mr. Rice reported that the Montgomery County Soil and Water District would like to be involved in the filter strip process for the open ditches. At this time all open drains have a seventy-five foot easement from the top of each drain. Each drain needs to be accessible for repair and spraying. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Phil Rice to have Ms. Milligan along with the Soil and Water District to prepare a draft ordinance for the May 26, 2009 Drainage Board meeting. Motion carried, 5-0.

Suanne Milligan reported that the in Marcella Anderson lawsuit the Drainage Board is being represented by counsel provided through the county's insurance.

Mr. Cummins reported that he spoke with John Wilcox on the work that was done on the Charles Cowen Drain #510 and the costs were divided according to private work versus public. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith to pay \$2,900.00 to John Wilcox for work done on the <u>Charles Cowen Drain #510</u>. Motion carried, 5-0.

Mr. Cummins reported that Banning Engineering has about 60% of the study completed on the **James Hose.**

Ms. Durrett reported that the Auditor's office is working with the Harris System and cannot locate the contract #. Ms. Durrett asked to keep the review of polices and procedures on the next agenda.

Terry Hockersmith reported that the Commissioners will impose a fine for the Kessler Swine Farm and would like to know a fair amount. This matter will be tabled until the May 26, 2009 meeting to get the exact dates, before recommending a fine amount.

Shelley Drain building expansions:

Deanna Durrett reported according to the 1998 Shelley Drain Resolution that in order to build in the Shelley Drain an exception is allowed if the proposed building will not increase the runoff by more than 10%. Mr. Rhoads inquired about how much is 10%. Mr. Cummins says there are several factors to consider, roof size, ground, etc.

Old Birge Building expansion continued from the April 14, 2009 meeting.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to allow Biddle Construction to expand the old Bertch Food building according to his submitted plans in the Shelley Drain Area, as it meets the 1998 Shelley Drain Resolution runoff exemption. Motion carried, 4-1.

Mr. Cummins reported that Dan Allridge would like to demolish his home of 1,344 square feet and build a new one with 1,417 square feet which results in a 3% increase in runoff in the Shelley Drain area. **Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by David Rhoads, to allow Mr. Allridge to**

build his home, as it meets the 1998 Shelley Drain Resolution runoff exemption. Motion carried, 4-1.

Ken Pressler, 400 Louise Ave. would like to demolish his 21 x 12 foot garage and replace it with a 24 x 20 foot garage. It results in a 9% increase in runoff. **Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to allow Mr. Pressler to build his garage, as it meets the 1998 Shelley Drain Resolution runoff exemption. Motion carried, 4-1.**

April White, Fairlane Drive would like to build a 7 x 40 foot deck. It results in a 2% increase in runoff. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Phil Rice to allow Ms. White to build her deck, as it meets the 1998 Shelley Drain Resolution runoff exemption. Motion carried 4-1.

Ray Faber would like to demolish his 13 x 20 garage and replace it with a 9 x 14 garage. This results in a decrease in runoff. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by David Rhoads, to allow Mr. Fabor to build his garage, as it meets the 1998 Shelley Drain Resolution runoff exemption. Motion carried, 5-0.

Jeff Troike of Ceres Solution would like to expand their building with a 20 x 12 breezeway and a 50 x 104 building expansion. This results in a 3% increase in runoff. **Deanna Durrett moved**, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to allow Ceres Solution to expand their building and breezeway, as it meets the 1998 Shelley Drain Resolution runoff exemption. Motion carried, 4-1.

New Business

Mr. Cummins reported he has received a petition for the Smith Elmore Drain #641 from more than 10% of the landowners. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to advance the date of reconstruction on the of the Smith Elmore Drain #641 and hold a hearing with the petitioners on Tuesday, May 26, 2009 at the Crawfordsville District Public Library. Motion carried, 5-0.

Tom Cummins reported he has received a petition to attach to the James Sanders #550 Drain from Phil Campbell. Mr. Cummins stated a contractor reports the tiles are clean. Mr. Cummins recommends allowing the attachment. Phil Rice moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson to allow attachment to the <u>James Sanders #550 Drain</u>. Motion carried, 5-0.

Mr. Cummins reported that he has received settlements from Boone County on the A.F. Ward Drain #561. It is in debt \$1,000.00. The drain is in need of repairs and the assessment is \$0.62 an acre. More information is needed. This matter will be kept on agenda for next meeting.

Other Business

Mr. Cummins reported that the open ditch portion of the Joe Hall #581 Drain on Curt Hudson's property on needs dipping. Mr. Hudson has requested that Bart Maxwell do the work while he is there doing private tile work for him. Mr. Cummins reported that proper notice was given to landowners. The project would entail:

Motion carried, 3-0.

George Conrad #705 Assessment Hearing

Mr. Cummins reported that proper notice was given to landowners. He stated that the George Conrad #705 Drain has not been on assessment since 1968. It is in North Union Township. The proposed rate is \$5.00 an acre. Part of this drain runs under the North Montgomery Northridge Middle School and there are no accurate records of where it runs. North Montgomery High School is also in the watershed. Any work that has been done on the drain in that area has been done at the landowner's expense. With the building of the schools it has caused drainage problems for Clark Truck Equipment Co. and they are putting their ground in the CPR program because of the surface water. Landowners in attendance were Jeff Myers and Bill Clifton. Mr. Myers stated that Clark Truck Equipment Co., Ione R. Clifton, William D. Clifton, William Curtis Sidener Jr. and him self were not in favor of putting it back on assessment. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith to not raise the assessment on the George Conrad #705. Motion carried, 3-0.

Smith/Elmore Drain Petition

Mr. Cummins has received a landowner petition to advance the date when a regulated drain will be referred to the county surveyor from Gary Moore, Kenneth Moore, Dan Rush, Mark Barclay and Danny Sering. The Smith/Elmore Drain is in Ripley Township northwest of Almo. The landowners discussed the problems and possible costs with the Smith/Elmore with the Drainage Board. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to schedule a reconstruction hearing on the <u>Smith/Elmore Drain</u> for Tuesday, August 11, 2009 at 9:30 a.m. at the Crawfordsville District Public Library. Motion carried, 3-0.

John Galey Drain Reconstruction

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith to rescind her motion to reconstruct the <u>John Galey #518 Drain</u> as the landowners hearing notice stated 10:00 a.m. instead of 9:30 a.m. and it was not 10:00 a.m. when the first motion was made. Motion carried, 3-0.

Landowners present were Wilbert Renick, Linda Richmond, Roy Sillery, Richard and Janet Valliere, Wayne Kessler, Tom Melvin.

Mr. Cummins presented the following information.

This drain is in South Union Township. Mr. Cummins presented a robotic video of the waterway under the railroad, which showed the major breakdown of the waterway. It was reported that to re-bore under the railroad would cost approximately \$70,000.00. All the tile holes that have been fixed on this drain have been due to back pressure. **Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to reconstruct the** <u>John Galev #518</u> at an approximate cost of \$49,830. Motion carried 3-0.

Moses Allen Drain

Mr. Cummins reported that Ross Foxworthy presented a petition to advance the date when a regulated drain will be referred to the county surveyor on the Moses Allen Drain. This drain is in North Union Township. It is a small watershed of approximately 100 acres. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith to schedule a reconstruction petitioner's hearing on Tuesday, August 11, 2009 at 9:30 a.m. at the Crawfordsville Public Library on the Moses Allen Drain. Motion carried 3-0.

Mr. Cummins has received a petition to attach to the Clarence Widner Drain from Tom Hedrick. He would like to attach two six inch tiles to the 12 inch Clarence Widner Drain. Terry Hockersmith moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett, to allow Mr. Hedrick to connect his two six-inch tiles to the <u>Clarence Widner Drain</u>. Motion carried, 3-0.

Mr. Melvin from Elmdale reported that he has a problem with road water because of there are no side ditches in the area. He also stated he is going to the County Commissioners meeting today. His family has owned the property for the past 35 years and nothing has been done to solve the problem. He stated he did not feel he was benefiting from the **Kenneth Hudson Drain** on which he pays assessment. It was stated he does get benefits from it but cannot see it as it is subsurface water. Mr. Cummins stated we have a new highway department head now and will contact him as to whether all the culverts are open in the area.

The **John Cochran Drain** will be on the agenda for discussion at the June 23, 2009 meeting.

Marc Bonwell presented drainage plans from the St. Bernard's Church that is in the Shelley Drain watershed. They would like to add to their building under the 1998 Shelley Drain Resolution. They own 12.5 acres and this would be a 1% increase in runoff. Gary Weliever reported to Mr. Bonwell that a city stormwater sewer is in that area. Deanna Durrett, moved seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to allow the St. Bernard Church to expand their building as it meets the 1998 <u>Shelley Drain</u> Resolution runoff exemption. Motion carried, 2-1.

Tom McCormick of 211 Vine St. Waynetown, Indiana, stated that after the heavy rain on April 14, 2009 they had a flooding issue. Mr. Cummins reported that Rex Ballard farms the Henthorn farm and is in the CRP program and that there is a distribution box at the corner of Vine St. and

St. Rd 25. Mr. Cummins, acting as a facilitator only, he met with Paul Rusk of Waynetown Maintenance and Mark Hoffman of the State Highway Department. Neither one told him "No" when asked if work could be done to alleviate the problem on the Henthorn farm from the washing out of his field. At this point the restrictor plate has been removed. Mr. McCormick felt it was in the better interest of the community to keep the homes from flooding in the area than to have useable farm land. He stated the homeowners involved do not have the resources to fix problems after each heavy rain. He has lived in the area for 33 years and has never seen it this bad before.

Terry Hockersmith moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett, to adjourn the meeting at 11:05 a.m. Motion carried 3-0.

Montgomery County Drainage Board William T. Shelley Landowner Assessment Hearing June 23, 2009

The William T. Shelley landowner assessment hearing was brought to order by David Rhoads chairman of the Montgomery County Drainage Board. It was held at the Montgomery County 4-H Fairgrounds on June 23, 2009 at 6:30 p.m.

Mr. Rhoads presented ground rules for the evening and introduced the Drainage Board. Present were Kenneth Pearson vice-chairman; Deanna Durrett, secretary; Terry Hockersmith and Phil Rice members.

Tom Cummins, Surveyor; Vicki Emmert, Recording Secretary and attorney Suanne Milligan were present. There were approximately 300 people in attendance. The list of landowners may be found in the exhibit book.

Tom Cummins, Surveyor, presented background of the William T. Shelley Drain. Old County records show that it was established as a legal drain in 1911, and consists of approximately 23,000 linear feet of sub-surface tile. The drain location is Twp. 18 N., Range 4 W: Sections 3 & 4 Twp. 19 N. Range 4 W: Sections 33 & 34. The drain has had many problems in the past, due to many different reasons. This drain was designed for subsurface water not above ground (surface water). The William T. Shelley Drain affects 986 parcels and 594.48 acres, most of which are developed.

Mr. Cummins stated it will take money to fix the affected areas. The proposed assessment rate is from zero to \$10.00 per acre with a \$100.00 minimum. There are four proposed projects.

- 1. Install approximately 800 ft. of 24" tile from junction of tributaries to existing outlet behind Raybestos. 800 ft. of 24" tile @ \$20/ft. = \$16,000.
- 2. Install and re-direct approximately 3,000 ft. of 18" tile between First Baptist Church and Montgomery Place Condominiums, across SR 32, northwest across the cropfield, and west behind Jiffy Lube. 3,000 ft. of 18" tile @ \$14/ft. = \$42,000.
- 3. Repair broken down areas of existing tile through wooded area, and west of Eastern Acres Subdivision. Approximately 10 areas @ \$1,000/ea. = \$10,000.
- 4. Examine the need for retention/detention in troubled areas: Cloverdale/Meadowood Apartments and Eastern Acres.

Mr. Cummins stated that after repairs are made the assessment may be lowered in approximately 2 to 3 years.

David Rhoads opened the meeting for landowners' comments and questions. Landowners spoke for and against the assessment. Tom Cummins and the Drainage Board answered their questions.

Following discussion by the board, Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to raise the <u>William T. Shelley Drain</u> assessment from zero to \$10.00 an acre with a \$100.00 minimum. Motion carried 5-0. This vote was signified by a hand vote.

Hearings and Petitions

Mr. Cummins presented a petition to attach from landowner Curt Hudson to attach to the <u>Arthur Fraley #596 Drain</u>. Deanna Durrett suggested that we should postpone the petition until Mr. Hudson could be present. No action was taken on this petition.

Tom Cummins brought forth a petition from Mark Barclay to attach to the <u>Charles O.</u> <u>McFarland # 545 Drain.</u> Mr. Barclay would like to attach 600 feet of six inch tile to the drain. Deanna Durrett inquired as to the condition of the drain. Mr. Cummins reports that it is in good condition. Kenneth Pearson moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett to allow the attachment to the <u>Charles O. McFarland #545 Drain</u> by landowner Mark Barclay. Motion carried, 5-0.

Tom Cummins presented a petition to take over jurisdiction of a private tile from landowner Dick Inskeep. It is an eight inch tile. Mr. Cummins reported that it is in good condition. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Phil Rice to take over jurisdiction of landowner Dick Inskeep's private tile and this would be called tributary four on the Allen Lewis #578 Drain. Old Business

Phil Rice and Suanne Milligan reported the need for more input from the Drainage Board before writing a filter strip ordinance. Ms. Milligan met with David Stanley of the Soil and Water Conservation office and suggests that we put this issue on the strategic planning agenda.

It was stated that the July 14, 2009 regular Drainage Board meeting will now be the strategic planning meeting.

Terry Hockersmith stated he was in need of more information on the Storm Water fines for the Kessler Swine Farm. Deanna Durrett will provide that information to him.

Mr. Cummins reported that there were fifteen applications for the new position as Deputy Surveyor and watershed conservation specialist with the Soil and Water Conservation

office. Five candidates were interviewed. Dave White inquired about the job description of this new position. It was stated that this is a pilot program and may be unique in the state of Indiana. Both groups will be working together to protect the land from erosion. There will be an Executive Drainage Board meeting Thursday, June 25, 2009 at 8:30 a.m. at the Montgomery County Surveyor's office to select the new Deputy Surveyor.

Mr. Cummins reported there was nothing new to report on the Allie Peterson Drain.

New Business

Salaries and Wages

Discussion on salaries and wages will be on July 14, 2009 with the department heads.

Discussion on the long-range plan for the Surveyor's office is always changing as projects are completed. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith to approve the Surveyor's Long Term plan presented at the May 26, 2009 meeting. Motion carried, 4-0. Phil Rice abstained.

Other Business

Donya Lester inquired about bids on the <u>Thomas Wilkins Drain</u> bids. It should have been removed from the agenda on the Surveyor's website but was not. It will be on the agenda for the July 28, 2009 Drainage Board meeting.

Dave Rhoads inquired of Terry Hockersmith what was done at the County Council meeting about drain loans. It was stated that the Auditor was given approval to get rates on the <u>Glennard Miller and John McCorkle Drains</u>. Deanna Durrett stated that the contractors have been paid out of the general improvement fund. Councilman Jim Fulwider has been given general authority to sign for all Drainage Board reconstruction loans. From now on after receiving the contractor's bids the loan process will start, instead of waiting until the project is completed.

The Montgomery County Drainage Board met on Tuesday, July 14, 2009 at 9:30 a.m. at 110 South Boulevard office.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Dave Rhoads.

Board members in attendance were Dave Rhoads, Chairman; Kenneth Pearson, Vice Chairman; Deanna Durrett, Secretary; Terry Hockersmith, Phil Rice members. Tom Cummins, Surveyor.

Filter strip ordinance: SWCD and Deputy Woods are continuing to develop a positive approach. This issue should remain on the agenda. The Drainage Board may wish to create leverage about the strips at the time of reconstruction. Board should consider the language in the Indiana Drainage Board Handbook for "best practice." Attention to the need for a filter strip should be included in the surveyor's classification of drains. Members expressed concern that a policy must take into account the unique nature at each situation.

Also:

Hearings and Petitions

Mr. Cummins reported that Curt Hudson was unable to attend and would like to move the petition for the <u>Arthur Fraley #596</u> to our next Drainage Board meeting August 11, 2009.

Mr. Cummins reported that Vestor & Associates is studying the area of the <u>Allen Lewis #578</u> drain for the petition to attach with Dick Inskeep and will have information at our next Drainage Board meeting August 11, 2009.

Old Business

Greg Miller attorney representing Dan Booher and John Binder gave the Board an update of the drainage problem along Memorial Drive. Mr. Miller reported that Tom Cummins and Terry Hockersmith both have been to the site. Mr. Miller stated that no drainage plan was submitted to the county or city that can be found. His client has 180 days from the date of the letter to file a tort claim. The claim asks the county to fix the problem or be liable for suit. The intention is not to sue but to fix the problem. There is a two year statue of limitation. The beginning date to file a Tort Claim is when the owners received their information from Deckard Engineering, which was March 16, 2009; deadline to file is September 16, 2009. Mr. Cummins has requested a copy of the plans for Memorial Drive from the County Highway Department. Mr. Booher stated that back in 1978 when the railroad maintained the tracks the drainage worked. Random House has always had problems. Deanna Durrett stated that Suanne Milligan the Drainage Board attorney will be involved in this issue too, but is not here today.

Phil Rice reported there was nothing new to report on the filter strip ordinance.

Mr. Cummins reported that he was contacted to furnish the final sketches and a completion date concerning work at in New Market for the Anderson lawsuit. The County Highway Department was also contacted.

Joe Miller of Banning Engineering reported that there are draft reports of the **James Hose** and there will be an additional public meeting at the end of August and will meet again afterwards. Stated he has information to pass out to the board after the meeting.

Deanna Durrett reported that work is still being done on the financial report.

Ms. Durrett submitted a letter to the personnel committee. The committee will meet on Friday to consider change in the grade matrix for the Surveyor. The recommendation of the committee will be sent to the board.

Terry Hockersmith reported that Deanna Durrett recently updated him on the time frame of the Mark Kessler swine operation. Marc Bonwell reported that Mr. Kessler has until August 1, 2009 to complete the Stormwater drainage plan that was submitted last fall. There is still a question as to who will levy the fine of non compliance. **Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, that Marc Bonwell and Tom Cummins make a site visit to the Kessler Swine**

facility before our next Drainage Board meeting which is August 11, 2009. Motion carried, 5-0.

It was stated by Marc Bonwell that new language for the Stormwater Ordinance that imposes fines is with the county attorney now and that the amount of money for the fine will be determined by the courts. Terry Hockersmith stated that after reviewing the information and also reviewing the Memorial Drive and Ladoga Rd issues. He wonders if we are treating individuals differently than the county. Deanna Durrett stated that there was on going communication with Mr. Kessler over his project and the circumstances are not quite the same.

Tom Cummins reported that he has met with Mr. Adrian McClain over the Jesse Evans #514Drain over what could be done to fix the drain. Mr. Cummins said the repair would cost about \$12,000.00. It is a small watershed of approximately 500 acres. Mr. Cummins stated that if the rate is raised there would be enough money in the drain to cover the cost of the project with at least within two years. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to have a rate assessment hearing to raise the rates from \$3.00 an acre to \$10.00 an acre for the <u>Jesse Evan #514 Drain</u> on August 25, 2009. Motion carried 5-0.

New Business

Larry Cain landowner with property in the **William Buchanan** #505 **Drain** stated that the drain is working as an open ditch rather than using the tile as it is overgrown and the water cannot get away. It works fairly well on the east side CR 675. Mr. Cummins recommends leaving the rate the same and work through maintenance as the rates were raised a while back to \$8.96 an acre. Mr. Cain stated he was glad that Tom walked the area with him.

Tom Cummins reported Dave Price has requested a building permit to build on Traction Road East of Daugherty Lane. It is in the **Shelley Drain** area and is under the 10% runoff that is permissible. It is not required, but Mr. Cummins would like to see a stormwater drainage plan as the water from his property runs into the **Shelley Drain** area. **Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith to change the resolution of the <u>William T Shelley #705 Drain</u> to an impact resolution that meets the criteria of the area by our next meeting of August 11, 2009. Motions carried, 5-0.**

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to allow Dave Price to build according to his submitted plans in the <u>William T. Shelley #705 Drain</u> Area, as it meets the 1998 Shelley Drain Resolution runoff exemption. Motion carried, 4-1. Terry Hockersmith voted no.

Terry Hockersmith inquired as to whether there had been any objections to the William T. Shelley #705 Drain assessment since the letter had been sent out to the landowners. The answer is no.

Tom Cummins reported originally we were to open bids for the **Thomas Wilkins #589 Drain** and that twenty-five to thirty firms have requested plans. On Friday, July 24, 2009 Mr. Cummins was contacted by the Indiana Department of Labor about the prevailing wage that would be used on the **Thomas Wilkins #589 Drain** reconstruction project. Suanne Milligan is attending a meeting today to better understand what our Surveyor needs to do to prepare for a project of this size. It was stated that there is to be a five member board with representatives from the state, labor, drainage board, a taxpayer who pays on the projects and a taxpayer appointed by the commissioners who also will be paying for the reconstruction. The Department of Labor only meets once a month on these issues and that is the meeting that Ms. Milligan is attending today. We may be able to have a private meeting with the Department of Labor. It will also require a special meeting of the Drainage Board. Representative from the Drainage Board will be Deanna Durrett, Dan Gwin, taxpayer and name being brought to the County Commissioners will be taxpayer, Mary Rose Duncan. The meeting is August 26, 2009.

Mr. Cummins will propose an earlier meeting with the Department of Labor since if we get too late in the season, this project will not be able to be completed in good weather conditions. Mr. Cummins reported that for a project over \$150,000.00 a performance bond is required or an irrevocable line of credit. CK Wilkins inquired if the landowners have a say as to what contractor gets the bid. Mr. Cummins stated yes, with a project of this size. Ward Wilkins then inquired as to if the landowner wants the middle of the road bid. Can they select him over others? Mr. Cummins reported that he would inquire about this with our attorney Suanne Milligan. CK Wilkins stated that years ago a drain was vacated; reconstruction of a ditch was done by landowners, than the drain was turned back over to the county. If the meetings can be moved up with the state, our plan is to open the bids on August 25, 2009 and make the decision that afternoon.

Other Business

Deanna Durrett reported that Sullivan County Soil & Water would like our help in setting up a drainage board.

Greg Woods will be attending drainage board meetings on Monday, August 3, 2009 in Clinton County and Wednesday, August 5, 2009 in Tippecanoe County.

Smith/Elmore # 641 Reconstruction Hearing

Tom Cummins reported on the <u>Smith/Elmore #641</u> Reconstruction Hearing. Proper notice was given to all landowners. This reconstruction encompasses 1023.14 acres. The estimated cost is \$99,610.00 to:

Construct a new structure at open ditch inlet to tile. Install 1,590 feet of 18" dual wall tile. Install 1,800 feet 24" dual wall tile. New tile under CR 925 W. Install 850 ft. 30" dual wall tile.

Discussion followed and landowners questioned the size of tiles needed.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to have Mr. Cummins contact an engineer about tile size and to continue the <u>Smith/Elmore #641</u> reconstruction hearing to August 25, 2009 meeting at 9:30 a.m.. Motion carried, 5-0.

Tom Cummins reported on the petition from Ross Foxworthy to advance the date for reconstruction for the <u>Moses Allen #500 drain</u>. It is in Madison Township. The tiles are shallow and break easily. It is now a 110 acre watershed, but with using the new contours it would include 230 acres. Mr. Cummins would like to talk to Mr. Foxworthy again. Terry Hockersmith moved, seconded by Phil Rice, to continue the petition for the <u>Moses Allen</u> #500 drain to August 25, 2009 meeting at 9:30 a.m. Motion carried, 5-0.

Tom Cummins reported that Jay Clifton has presented a petition to attach to the <u>Charles Newkirk # 594 Drain</u>. Would like to clean a petroleum land problem and then connect. Mary Hile of Creek Run stated it would take a week to clean the soil and they have a permit from the State. It will be clean water running to the tile. Mr. Cummins recommended, they be allowed to attach. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to allow Jay Clifton to attach a tile to the <u>Charles Newkirk #594 Drain</u>. Motion carried, 5-0

Jacob Arthur Excavating at \$30,472.00

All have bid bonds in place.

Dave Rhoads stated they would take the bids under advisement and will look at them at the end of meeting.

Old Business

Mr. Cummins reported that he and Marc Bonwell went out to the Kessler Swine Farm on August 3, 2009. Everything was in place except for an emergency overflow that was in the original design. Mr. Cummins and Mr. Bonwell spoke to the contractor and again went out on August 5, 2009. Everything was in place on August 5, 2009, the work has been completed.

Mr. Rice reported that there is nothing new to report on the filter strip ordinance.

Joe Miller of Banning Engineering reported on the James Hose Drain with the town of Linden. There will be a public hearing on August 25, 2009. The next grant cycle is to be submitted in September. Deanna Durrett inquired as to what information Mr. Miller has received from the landowners. Mr. Miller stated there have not been as many floods in the last few years. One landowner remembers when they had to use canoes to get around Water Street. Deanna Durrett inquired of Marc Bonwell whether he gets building permits from the town of Linden. Marc says yes, anything over the 10% runoff cannot build. Mr. Miller reported that reworking the drain through town is the best option. If the town of Linden cannot demonstrate a need from the landowners, they cannot receive grant money. Ms. Durrett inquired of Terry Hockersmith if we have competition from Office of Community and Rural Affairs grants with other projects in the county. Mr. Hockersmith was not sure. It was suggested to check with Shannon McCleod. Dave Rhoads reported he agrees with Mr. Miller on the drainage problem. Mr. Cummins reported work has been done on the George Nichols #546 drain in that area. Shannon McCleod, the grant administrator, is taking care of publication of the hearing.

Deanna Durrett reported that fines are pending on the Kessler Swine Farm and a memo should be sent to the County Commissioners to refer it to the courts.

Tom Cummins reported he spoke with Adrain McClain concerning his petition to attach and will have information at the August 25, 2009 meeting on the Jesse Evans Drain.

Mr. Cummins reported on the Arthur Fraley #596 Drain about taking over jurisdiction of the area on the Curt Hudson property. Mr. Cummins knows there are legal issues. Mr. Cummins reported it may have been a legal drain at one time. There is no file from the Arthur Fraley #2. Landowners have worked to keep the drain fairly clean. The outlet is bad. Mr. Cummins would like to talk to Mr. Hudson and discuss that again at the September meeting.

Tom Cummins reported on the William T. Shelley Drain. There has been water testing in the area of Raybestos, East side of First Baptist Church and Montgomery Place II. Testing indicated e-coli particles of 172 to 400. The Health Department reported the tests results are within acceptable limits. A dye test also has been done. Mr. Cummins reported that at St. Rd. 32 and St. Rd. 47 the dye came out where the tile runs under the bridge. It is partially broken and much of the water at St. Rd. 32 runs along St. Rd. 47.

Terry Hockersmith inquired of Suanne Milligan as to distributing cost on urban drains. At this time Ms. Milligan does not have information.

Deanna Durrett reported on the proposal to change the Surveyor's salary matrix rate. Ms. Durrett and Mr. Cummins will meet this afternoon with the Board of Review on this issue.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to relinquish her position for the Department of Labor and common wage committee for the <u>Thomas Wilkins #589 Drain</u> and assign Tom Cummins to the position. Motion carried, 5-0. Terry Hockersmith reported that Mary Rose Duncan was selected by the Commissioners to sit on the committee.

New Business

Bart Maxwell reported on work to be done on the Linn Himes Drain. Mr. Rhoads reported that he had not heard any changes from the fertilizer plant. Bart Maxwell asked if bids would be let soon on the Linn Himes Drain. Mr. Cummins said he will prepare the bid package as soon as possible. Mr. Maxwell also inquired about the Minn-Miser-Corn Drain. Mr. Cummins reported that he should be able to get the Minn-Miser-Corn information ready by the next Drainage Board meeting on August 25, 2009. Mr. Maxwell also inquired about work on the Jeff Lynn property and tiles that are silted. There seems to be a problem on the Montgomery County Foundation property. Mr. Cummins stated more information is needed on this project and possibly a petition and to please keep it on the agenda.

Other Business

Terry Hockersmith inquired about the memo that was to be sent to the Commissioners on the Kessler Swine Farm. Phil Rice asked to refresh his memory on past occurrences. Marc Bonwell reported that the fines were to start in September of 2008. Mark Kessler reported he had IDEM approval and did not know he was required to get approval from the Montgomery County Drainage Board.

Dave Rhoads stated he was not in favor of a fine. Phil Rice spoke as a citizen and said that mistakes were made on both sides of the issues between Mark Kessler and the Drainage Board. Mr. Kessler stated that the property around his swine facility was rented by him and if the drainage was not working properly he would have been hurting himself. Deanna Durrett stated the Drainage Board should have not allowed hogs in the building until the drainage problem was fixed. Marc Bonwell reported any fine money would go in the Stormwater fee fund. Dave Rhoads moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett, to recommend to the County Commissioners to levy a fine of \$1.00 to the Kyle Kessler Hog Farm. Motion carried, 3-2.

Public Comment

Tom Cummins reported that Curt Hudson could not attend today. Please keep the <u>Arthur Fraley</u> #596 <u>Drain</u> on the agenda for the September 22, 2009 meeting. Mr. Cummins has gathered more information and there is a blue line stream involved and DNR permitting will be necessary to complete this project. Other Business

Dave Rhoads inquired if the loans for the **Raymond Weliever** and the **Carolyn Kenyon** reconstruction projects could be gotten sooner, since the bids have been awarded. Mr. Cummins says he had prepared to get the loans processed.

Phil Rice Drainage Board member came in at 10:09 a.m.

Dave Rhoads reported that he received a call from Randy McCormick concerning the **Guy Little Drain** and would like for Tom Cummins to call him. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to continue the <u>Smith/Elmore #641</u> reconstruction hearing to December 8, 2009. Motion carried, 5-0. Deanna Durrett requested that reminder notices be sent to landowners.

Tom Cummins reported he has not heard from Mr. Hudson concerning the petition to attach to the Arthur Fraley #596. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Phil Rice, to continue the <u>Arthur Fraley #596</u> petition to attach to the November 10, 2009 meeting. Motion carried, 5-0

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to hold an assessment rate increase hearing for the <u>John Cochran #621</u> from \$2.26 to \$10.00 at the November 24, 2009 meeting. Motion carried, 5-0.

Shelley Drain Building permits requests;

Tom Cummins has received a request from Mrs. Coffing 303 N. Grace Ave. Crawfordsville to build an addition to their house of 22' x 24'. It is an increase of 5% runoff. Mr. Cummins recommends the use of downspouts and that the water is diverted to run into the ditch along the road. A notation to the city about the downspouts should be presented along with the plan. There are concerns about the drainage in that area as an adjourning neighbor's property retains water. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded Phil Rice, to allow Mrs. Coffing to build her addition, as it meets the 1998 Shelley Drain Resolution runoff exemption and the downspout recommendation be part of the permit. Motion carried, 4-1.

Mr. Cummins also received another request from Mrs. Coffing as she has an adjourning property and would like to build a 24' x 24' garage without a driveway. This is an increase of 9% runoff. Discussion concerned the need for a driveway. Whether it is stone or just grass either way the ground will become compacted and affect the impervious percentage. Kenneth Pearson moved, seconded by Phil Rice, to deny the request to build a garage and to wait and see how the addition drains first. Motion carried 5-0.

Tom Cummins received a request from Mr. Mike Stark on Eastgate Drive to build a 24' x 32'garage without a driveway. It is an increase of 8% runoff. It is just south of 32 and west of Montgomery Place II and the water flows towards 32. Dave White inquired if Mr. Cummins has been out in that area recently with a camera crew. Mr. Cummins responded two to three weeks ago they were out in that area. Marc Bonwell reported that city of Crawfordsville does not have drainage tackies. Mr. Deckard says the drainage goes to the street. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to deny the garage permit as there were no driveway specifications. Motion passed 5-0.

Mr. Cummins inquired if there is a plan to meet to change the Shelley Drain resolution? Deanna Durrett said a change in the resolution is being prepared. Marc Bonwell reported that there is Stormwater ordinance being written at this time. Ms. Durrett will pursue the issue.

Mr. Cummins opened up bids for the Linn-Himes #533.

Mr. Cummins opened up bids for the John Galey #518.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to take the bids under advisement for the <u>John Galey #518</u> and to recess at the close of the meeting to examine the bids. Motion carried, 5-0.

Old Business

Ms. Milligan was not in attendance to give a report on the Dan Booher Memorial Drive drainage issue or the Anderson lawsuit.

Deanna Durrett reported on the Salary Matrix grade scale. Mr. Cummins' grade has been increased from 1.5 to 2.3. Ms. Durrett also reported that for every certified mile of drain and for each section corner found the Surveyor will receive \$2.00 from the County General Fund each year.

Mr. Cummins reported that he was still working with Kenny and Larry Cain on the William Buchanan #505 Drain.

Mr. Cummins reported that he is still working on the size of the water shed along with Leroy Bunnell on the unknown drain in Wayne Township.

Randy McCormick landowner on the Guy Little #534 Drain was present to discuss the variance of the fence which is to be placed after the Guy Little is dredged and reseeded. The request is from a 75 foot variance from the top of the bank to a 30 foot variance along the open ditch. Mr. McCormick is in the Equip program which allows the grazing of the ditch when conditions are favorable for a short period of time to keep the grass under control. Mr. McCormick wanted to know why it was taking so long to get this project underway as it was approved early in 2009. Deanna Durrett reported there were changes in the plan and now we are moving on. Mr. McCormick also reported there is a breather that was put into place on the Chrin. Schenck #506. It is approximately 9 ft tall. Greg Woods reported on the research he has done on the inactive drains that are now not assessed. At present there are 37 that have not been vacated and are inactive. Some of these landowners have paid for the work that has been done to improve drainage. The **Detchon-Adams Drain** covers 10,000 acres and is in poor shape. Deanna Durrett inquired as to when a drain should be put back on assessment. Mr. Cummins reported the research is the last step before deciding if a drain should be vacated or put back on

assessment. Mark Kessler inquired as to who is responsible for putting a drain back on assessment? Mr. Cummins reported a legal hearing would have to be held for each drain before anything could be done.

Deanna Durrett gave reports on fund balances, interest and indebtedness to the board. The assessments that were turned into the Auditor's Office were not raised or lowered this year. There is still miss-communication with the Auditor's Office. Dave Rhoads inquired as how to fix the process. Phil Rice reported the reconstruction on the John McCorkle Drain payable in 2010 the bills have already been sent out and have been very confusing, especially to the older generation. Mr. Cummins reported the special assessment reports are not easy to read and the Auditor is working on a more reader friendly version.

New Business

Other Business

Dave White would like to know if money for the **Shelley Drain** will be used to fix the Whitlock Avenue problem. Mr. Cummins reported that issue is not part of the **Shelly Drain**. Terry Hockersmith says that is a stormwater issue with Crawfordsville.

Dave Rhoads reported that Waveland and New Richmond have grants and wondered why we can't get a grant. Mr. Cummins reported that these are planning grants which do not cover the cost of construction.

Mr. Cummins reported the meeting with the town of Linden is tonight and will need at least one Drainage Board member and one commissioner in attendance along with him. Mrs. Durrett and Mr. Hockersmith will attend.

Dave Rhoads moved, seconded by Phil Rice, to recess to go over the bids for the *Linn-Himes* and the *John Galey*. Motion carried, 5-0.

The meeting was reconvened and Mr. Cummins recommended the Linn-Himes #533 be awarded to Maxwell Farm Drainage at \$27,648.00. Moses Allen #500 Hearing

Tom Cummins reported on the proposed reconstruction of the Moses Allen #500 Drain.

After discussion with area landowners, the watershed was enlarged to a total of 299.09 acres.

The petition to reconstruct was submitted by landowner Ross Foxworthy. Notice was sent to landowners. The surveyor reported as follows:

Replace 2,011 feet of 12 inch with 15 "
Install 2,011 feet of 15"smooth core tile @ \$10.50 /ft = \$21,115.50
Replace 1,604 feet of 10 inch with 12"
Install 1,604' feet of 12" smooth core tile @ \$8.50/ft = \$13,634.00Total \$34,749.50

It is old clay tile and very shallow in some areas.

The original drain was built in 1898. Landowners in attendance were Donald Redden and Jeanette Shelton.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to approve the Surveyor's report and reconstruct the <u>Moses Allen #500</u> Drain at a cost of \$34,749.50 and instructed Mr. Cummins to prepare to receive bids for the December 8, 2009 meeting. Motion carried, 4-0.

Mr. Cummins reported that following with the installation of a new computer last week, his e-mail program was not sending and receiving correctly. Hence, not all contractors received information on the Guy Little #534 maintenance project. The time to receive quotes has been extended to the end of the week. The estimated cost is \$15,000 which will come out of maintenance. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to authorize the Surveyor to accept the best quote from contractors for the <u>Guy Little #534 Drain</u> maintenance project and to e-mail the Drainage Board with the information. Motion carried, 4-0.

Old Business

Suanne Milligan reported there were no new updates on the Dan Booher Memorial Drive drainage issue or the Anderson Lawsuit.

Mr. Cummins reported they are still waiting on harvest for the William Buchanan Drain and working with landowners on the Unknown drain in Wayne Township.

Deanna Durrett reported there is a new strategy to resolve the resolution with the William Shelley build policy and will be sending out an e-mail.

Dave Rhoads inquired if Mr. Cummins has spoken with Mr. Deckard on the Linn-Himes #533. Mr. Cummins said he had no new information. Discussion on whether Ceres Solution should have its own outlet was brought fourth. Mr. Deckard was to present information for this drainage board meeting but was not present. Mr. Cummins is looking into the legal issue of Ceres Solution using the Linn-Himes easement. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to authorize Maxwell Farm Drainage to reconstruct the <u>Linn-Himes #533 Drain</u> as designed and bid. Motion carried 3-0. Dave Rhoads abstained as he is a landowner.

Deanna Durrett reported that there will be a rate increase assessment hearing for the **John Cochran #621 Drain** at the November 24, 2009 Drainage Board meeting.

Deanna Durrett reported the Robert Niven #637 is in debt and the rates should be increased to cover this debt.

Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Dave Rhoads, to schedule a rate assessment hearing for the <u>Robert Niven</u> #637 on December 8, 2009 to raise the rates from \$1.25 to \$20.00 an acre. Motion carried, 4-0.

Deanna Durrett and Mr. Cummins met with the Auditor and reported that the rate changes were entered three times, but the Manitron program rejected the changes. They lock the system at certain times of the year. We need to know when this deadline is. Terry Hockersmith reported that he spoke with the Auditor. In the near future Mr. Cummins should be able to access the computer program and enter the changes himself.

Greg Woods presented his report for October. Mr. Woods has now completed his research on un-assessed drains. He spoke with some of the landowners about the condition of various drains and some will probably be put back on assessment in the future.

Other Business

Deanna Durrett inquired of Tom Cummins on reconstructions. Mr. Cummins reported it has been a busy year and the most difficult ones are being completed.

Tom Cummins reported that a Jet-eye truck was used on sections of the William T. Shelley Drain. At Raybestos outlet 130 feet west there is an obstruction. At state roads 32 and 47 at the state bridge about 110-120 feet there is a concrete blockage. From 32 and 47, 530 feet west the tile is in good shape but has lots of debris. Concerning the western tile along Wabash Avenue, the city doesn't know if there are storm sewers or not but the tiles have lots of debris. It flows well from the West. The tile is clear at the "Bowl "at Montgomery Place II. This work was all done free as a contractor is interested in purchasing similar equipment.

Deanna Durrett is enlisting Soil and Water for help with the EP McCaskey.

Deanna Durrett inquired of Mr. Cummins as to if he has heard from Hendricks Co. concerning the **Albert Hysong** joint drain. Mr. Cummins said he has not heard anything from Hendricks Co. but did receive an e-mail from DNR and they need to be kept informed and permits will be needed when work is now. It is best to work on this next year. Ms. Durrett says there are a few Montgomery County landowners who have real issues on this drain. Mr. Cummins still is waiting on a landowner list from Hendricks's County. The **Albert Hysong** will be put on the February 2010 agenda.

Tom Cummins reported he has been in contact with Boone County concerning the **AF Ward** and a rate increase is in order. This will be on the agenda for the December meeting.

Other Business

Don Redden inquired as to why he pays on two drains. Mr. Cummins displayed the watershed and showed Mr. Redden that the **Moses Allen** is inside of the **Joe Hall** watershed.

Kenneth Pearson moved, seconded Terry Hockersmith, to adjourn the meeting at 10:30 a.m. Motion carried, 4-0.

There were no minutes to review.

John Cochran #621 Hearing to raise assessment:

Tom Cummins reported on the **John Cochran #621 Drain**. It is in debt \$3,750.19. Earlier this year 9,000 ft of tile were replaced. Mr. Cummins recommended raising the assessment from \$2.26 to \$10.00 and then in 2012 lower to it to \$6.00 when the debt has been paid back. No landowners were at the meeting. Mr. Cummins has talked to several of them about this and they are agreeable with the increase. **Kenneth Pearson moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett, to raise the assessment from \$2.26 to \$10.00 for the <u>John Cochran #621 Drain</u>. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to allow Mike Stark to build a storage building as it meets the 1998 <u>Shelley Drain</u> Resolution runoff exemption. Motion carried, 3-1.

Boswell Clough Drain

Troy Stahl of Bonar Group presented a report for the town of New Richmond. The town has been award a \$570,000.00 grant. Currently the ponds overflow, there is flooding on the ball diamonds, and Wabash Street is the flooded area. The **Boswell Clough Drain** is not in good condition. The town would like to build a dry detention pond and expand the two ponds that are already in the town park and to disconnect two 8-inch tiles and connect a 2-inch tile to the **Boswell Clough drain**. Landowner Darrell Birge reported the ponds are already full of water and believes the plan will not work. Following further discussion, **Deanna Durrett moved**, seconded by Kenneth Pearson, to allow the petition to connect to the Boswell Clough Drain with a maximum 2-inch tile from the dry pond and to disconnect the two 8-inch tiles. Motion carried, 4-0.

Old Business

Mr. Cummins reported landowners are still working in the fields on the William Buchanan drain.

Mr. Cummins reported that he has created a watershed draft of the **Unknown drain**. Mr. Bunnell does not own land in the watershed but farms ground for a landowner within it. **Deanna Durrett moved**, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to invite landowners to the January 12, 2010 Drainage Board meeting, to discuss the watershed of the <u>Unknown drain</u>. Motion carried, 4-0.

Mr. Cummins reported that the **Guy Little** maintenance project was awarded to Foster Farm Drainage for \$1,999.99. Mr. Foster's bid was low because he is doing work for landowners in that area. There were five bids submitted.

Deanna Durrett reported she is still researching the William T. Shelley Impact Area Resolution.

Linn-Himes

Mr. Cummins reported on the reconstruction of the Linn-Himes Drain. Dave Deckard presented site plans to the Board. Mr. Deckard apologized for being absent at the last meeting. Mr. Deckard is representing Ceres Solution. Ceres Solution would like to replace the proposed 15" tile with a 24" tile. Mr. Deckard explained the drainage plan. Ceres Solution has not been paying assessment and an adjustment in the watershed will need to be made to include Ceres Solution. Ceres Solution will have to waive objections to be included in the watershed. Mr. Deckard reported that the water from the detention pond is a controlled flow. Mr. Deckard and the Drainage Board discussed the different types of tile that could be used and if two tiles should run side by side or use one large tile, whether to use incased tile or perforated tile. Mr. Maxwell reported that one tile is better than two. Mr. Deckard reported that IDEM will be working closing with Ceres Solution on the construction site. Marc Bonwell and Tom Cummins reported that perforated tile will be better than encased as the water will still outlet in the same spot. Terry Hockersmith spoke his concerns of contamination with the detention pond and inquired if it could hold three million gallon. Mr. Deckard reported no. A petition to attach and waivers of landowner objections will be needed. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, that the Ceres Solution-Linn Himes project be on the agenda for the December 8, 2009 Drainage Board meeting. Motion carried, 4-0.

Ms. Milligan reported there was no new information on the Dan Booher drainage problem along Memorial Drive or the Anderson lawsuit.

New Business

Terry Hockersmith always votes no to building in the Shelley Drain area and Deanna Durrett votes according to the resolution.

Tom Cummins reported that water dye test have begun and it will be at least 6 months before we dig and make repairs. There have been 8 building permits approved.

Marc Bonwell says the 10% runoff comes from the stormwater ordinance in Montgomery Co.

Mr. Rhoads discussed the idea of making the Shelley Drain an urban drain. Mr. Cummins says with an urban drain designation you have the right to change to a higher assessment on commercial versus residential. It is a flat rate now.

Deanna Durrett reported to have the same language in all ordinances about stormwater.

Gary Weliver reported it is best to define the area better and use a stormwater board. Mr. Rhoads says it is a possibility to vacate the drain and turn it over to the city but questioned whether this is that the best way to handle it.

Suanne Milligan reported that the city and county are out of sinc with each other as to what the ordinance should do within the 2 mile radius of the city and what the Drainage Board is to impose.

Deanna Durrett reported that before 2006 the Drainage Board consisted of all commissioners. Today, there seems to be more cooperation between the city and county.

Mr. Rhoads inquired of landowners what they would like to see done. Mr. While explained how the "Bowl" has helped the Montgomery Place II drain better but there is still room for improvement.

Horace Tomey reported that he would like to see the assessment used properly. His property drainage issues, go back 50 years. After Montgomery Place II did work his drainage problems are better. Mr. Tomey would like to find grants to help fund Shelley Drain.

Deanna Durrett says there are three goals.

- 1) Bring the 2 stormwater codes together.
- 2) Change existing and update to coe efficient instead of percentage.
- 3) The Surveyor is investigating solutions with positive action. Tom Cummins and Greg Woods to try to map sub surface and surface water.

Mary Collun says no build until the problems have been fixed. Her basement fills with water with every rain.

Phil Rice inquired of Suanne Milligan if we go to a no build will it cause a problems with our votes in the past. Suanne says no we acted in good faith.

Horace Tomey inquired about application for grants etc. Fred Davis says there is FEMA money. Mr. Cummins and Ms. Durrett did apply in March 2009 for OCRA, and stimulus money

Hearings and Petitions

Robert Niven #637 Drain Assessment Hearing

Tom Cummins reported the Robert Nivens #637 required maintenance work earlier this year and is now in debt \$13,327.64. Mr. Cummins recommends raising the maintenance assessment to \$20.00/acre for the 2010 and 2011 tax years, and lowering the assessment to \$5.00/acre for future years. This plan will bring the drain out of deficit after the assessments are collected, and ensure that the necessary funds are collected to adequately maintain the drain in the future. Kenneth Pearson moved, seconded by Deanna Durrett, to raise the <u>Robert Niven #637</u> assessment to \$20.00 per acre for the 2010 and 2011 tax years, and lowering the assessment to \$5.00/acre after the two years of assessments are collected. Deanna Durrett moved, seconded by Terry Hockersmith, to take the bids for the <u>Moses Allen #500</u> under advisement till the end of the meeting to give the Surveyor time to review the bids and make a recommendation. Motion carried 5-0.

Old Business

Tom Cummins reported that Ivy Tech would like to put in a new parking lot on the Allen Trucking property. This is in the Foster Fletcher #573 impact drainage area. Mr. Cummins passed out the Banning Engineering study to the Board which showed the 1st alternative that is in effect now. Dave Rhoads requested that Mr. Cummins look into the ways other counties handle these growth areas and cost of assessments. Deanna Durrett stated that for Crawfordsville to keep growing something needs to be done. Marc Bonwell reported that of January 1, 2010 Crawfordsville will have stormwater assessment in this area. Deanna Durrett requested before our next meeting that information be gathered about the Foster Fletcher #573 assessments and expansion from landowners. Mr. Rhoads would like a special meeting to brainstorm possibly on January 12, 2010.

Tom Cummins requested keeping the Arthur Fraley #596 on the agenda for the January 12, 2010 meeting.

Tom Cummins reported he would be sending information to the Board and Suanne Milligan in the near future on the **Unknown Drain**.

Deanna Durrett reported there are no new updates on the William Shelley #706.

Dave Deckard of Deckard Engineering thanked Suanne Milligan for getting the legal forms prepared regarding the Linn-Himes Drain #533. Ceres Solution has signed their part and the rest has been forwarded to Nucor, which sent them on to their corporate office for approval. Mr. Deckard submitted the latest plan, which mostly has to do with the railroad drainage area. Jeff Troike was present from Ceres Solution. Mr. Troike reported this is a big project with lots of state and federal rules and regulations to follow for containment. The large tanks will be double walled and the small tanks will be dyked. Dave White inquired about what happens when the overflow valve is shut down. Mr. Deckard reported the pond is designed for a 100year flood. Bud Rose inquired about the cost of future problems, concerning the new pipe size of 24" and who will pay the cost. Mr. Cummins stated it would be shared by all, but the watershed will be larger and it should be less per acre. The Linn Himes #533 Drain is 90% open ditch. Concerns about a train derailment were discussed and it was reported that CSI Railroad has regulations about the distance from the track to the tanks. Kenneth Pearson inquired of Jeff Troike if this plant would

look similar to the plant in Danville, Ill. and he said yes. No action was taken pending signatures of all parties to the agreement for payment.

New Business

Deanna Durrett reported that the financial report is currently be prepared for the end of the year report. At this time Mr. Cummins does not have authority to change the rates himself on the MVP computer program. Phil Rice inquired as to why the Auditor's Office was able to send out statements concerning the John McCorkle #608 Drain for bills not due until fall of 2010 but cannot get the assessments entered. Deanna Durrett reported that the Auditor's office entered the numbers three different times but the data was rejected by the computer software each time. Terry Hockersmith will look into why the authority cannot be given to Mr. Cummins to enter the rates.

Deanna Durrett will check to see if Monday is available.

New Business

Mr. Cummins reported that the Mace Methodist Church is planning to expand and he is waiting on a site plan. It is in the Moody Drain and is next to an existing water problem.

Greg Woods presented his activity report for the month. Mr. Woods reported that contour watersheds have been made for many of the un-assessed drains with landowner parcels. This information will be used eventually to put these drains back on assessment as needed. Mr. Wood's report included work with the NRSC Office with the grass water way projects.
