V. NEW BUSINESS:

A. ERPS Committee Report – Health Department, CCC: County Administrator Klein provided additional detail about the most recent ERPS committee change requests. Two temporary positions, to be paid for by a grant and only in effect for two years, were defined for the Health Department. For the Central Communication Center, adjustments were made to all staffing positions, creating narrow bands of pay variance between all levels. A motion to approve the ERPS Committee recommendations was made by Councilman Hunt. This

was seconded by Councilman Bohlander. Motion carried 6-0.

- B. Recorder's Certification of Perpetuation Fund Usage Ordinance 2021-05
 - a. A motion to suspend rules was made by Councilman Booth, seconded by Councilman Mills. Motion to suspend carried 6-0.
 - b. A motion to approve Ordinance 2021-05, as presented, was made by Councilman Hunt, seconded by Councilman Booth. Motion carried 6-0.
- C. End of Year Transfer of Appropriations Resolution 2021-12
 - a. A motion to approve Resolution 2021-12 was made by Councilman Mills. This was seconded by Councilman Davidson. Motion carried 6-0.
- D. January 2022 Meeting Date/Time/Location
 - a. A motion to set the first council meeting in 2022 to January 11 at 9:00 a.m. in the Council Chambers was made by Councilman Booth. This was seconded by Councilman Davidson. Motion carried 6-0.

- A. Wabash Heartland Innovation Network (WHIN) Grant Presentation and Request
 - a. Pat Corey, VP of Engagement, presented an opportunity for the county to invest in expanding broadband in the counties rural areas.
- B. Final Reading 2022 Salary Ordinance 2021-03
 - a. A motion to approve was made by Councilman Hunt, seconded by Councilman Davidson. Motion carried 6-0.
- C. Final Reading 2022 Appropriations Ordinance 2021-04
 - a. A motion to approve was made by Councilman Booth, seconded by Councilman Davidson. Motion carried 6-0.

VII. STAFF & ELECTED OFFICIALS' REPORTS:

- a. County Administrator, Tom Klein, had several items to share:
 - i. He outlined other broadband initiatives available to Hoosiers.
 - ii. He wished everyone a Merry Christmas and thanked Jennifer Bentley, Recorder, and Heather Laffoon, Treasurer, for decorating the courthouse.
 - iii. The courthouse will be accepting food and toiletry items to donate to the local FISH Pantry throughout December. This is being organized by Mindy Byers, Chief Deputy Auditor.
 - iv. The county will celebrate its 199th birthday on December 21. He invited everyone to the Council Chambers that day for cake.
 - v. The Commissioners agreed to opt in to an opioid settlement. There are class action lawsuits against two companies.
 - vi. He announced the county has been awarded several grants. He recognized Andria Geigle, Shari Harrington, Amber Reed, Jake Lough and Jim Peck for their efforts.
 - vii. He welcomed Nick Hedrick in his new position with the Public Defender's office.
 - viii. Tempur Sealy has hired a new plant manager, Tao Zhu.
 - ix. Tom shared the new logo for the county's bicentennial.
 - x. The Montgomery County Government center is progressing nicely. They anticipate completion at the end of February with a March move-in.
 - xi. The EMS study is currently on hold.
- b. Auditor Jennifer Andel stated she has received the 1782 Notice from the State. All budgets were approved with the exception of Cumulative Capital Development (CCD). This is due to 4th quarter additional appropriations. She will submit an updated Form 2 in order to receive approval.
- c. County Attorney Dan Taylor congratulated the County Council on a great year. Due to their efforts, the county is in good financial standing and was able to secure good bond ratings. He then provided several updates on the BAN and bonds for the Tempur Sealy project.

VIII. DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS:

a. Jake Lough, Highway Director, said around 25 trees were downed from the storms during the previous weekend. He thanked the Central Communications Center and the Sheriff's Department for their help getting the roads back open. He also mentioned there was a washout on 575 West.

- a. Gary Booth wished everyone a Merry Christmas and thanked everyone for their efforts in 2021. He specifically recognized Tom Klein, Dan Taylor and the commissioner's office for everything they've done to help move Montgomery County forward.
- b. Tom Mellish thanked everyone for their hard work in 2021 and extended his appreciation to the department heads for a good budgeting season. He recognized the councils of past for putting the county in the good financial position it is in. He thanked his fellow councilman and is looking forward to 2022.
