

Local Officials React to Nucor Steel's Announcement to Expand their Crawfordsville Steel Mill

(February 1, 2022) Local officials from Montgomery County government have reacted to today's announcement from Nucor Steel of their plans to invest \$290 million in their Crawfordsville steel mill. The investment will create 80 more jobs.

The County has offered an incentive package that includes the construction of the Nucor Road overpass over US 136 and tax abatement for real and personal property.
