A. Councilman Smith made a motion to approve the Reductions of Appropriations for the Probation Department, seconded by Councilman Bohlander. Motion passed 6-0.

V. NEW BUSINESS:

- A. Resolution 2022 15 & EMS Inter-Local Agreement with City of Crawfordsville.
 - 1. County Administrator Tom Klein explained that this is the final version that had been approved by both the City and the Commissioners, and was recommended by consultant, Barry Ritter.
 - 2. A motion to approve the Inter-Local Agreement and Resolution 2022-15, was made by Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Booth. Motion passed 6-0.
- B. Prosecutor Joe Buser requested that the Council make the recently-passed pay increase for the Deputy Prosecutors retroactive to cover 75% of what the new salaries would be for this year. A motion to approve this request was made by Councilman Davidson, seconded by Councilman Bohlander. Councilman Booth voiced concerns that this was setting a precedence. Attorney Taylor assured the Council that it was not, that the Council can look at each pay change request individually and make decisions according to each unique situation. Motion carried 6-0.
- C. Auditor Jennifer Andel provided the Council with graphs depicting the year to date financial status of the County's major funds, and how close the County is to reaching anticipated revenues as well as current budgets and cash balances.
- VI. OLD BUSINESS: None.
- VII. STAFF, ELECTED OFFICIALS, DEPARTMENT HEADS, OR FUNDED ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS:

- A. County Clerk Karyn Douglas reported on the General Election, and spoke about anticipated expenses for the upcoming year. She also mentioned that she would be preparing an additional deputy to help with elections in 2024, as it will be a Presidential election, and much busier than this year's.
- B. County Administrator Tom Klein provided several updates on projects including:
 - 1. The EMS implementation plan, and other ongoing work with CCC Director Sherri Henry and Barry Ritter.
 - 2. Thanked employees who are Veteran's.
 - 3. Reported that the Bicentennial Committee will be hosting an event recognizing local unsung heroes, dispatchers, and the post card contest winners.
 - 4. Discussed that negotiations were underway to have Constitution Row become a public street maintained by the City of Crawfordsville. Currently it is owned by the Houston family.
 - 5. The Mace drainage project is nearly completed. Funding for it came from a SWIF Grant, INDOT, and ARPA funds.
 - 6. Landfill project is nearing completion.
 - 7. On the Tempur Sealy project, the water is now connected, and the rail spur is being worked upon. The company is looking at a 2nd quarter of 2023 opening of the plant.
 - 8. The County is working to obtain an \$18million grant to be used for the 136/Nucor Road overpass project.
 - 9. DLZ is working with Marc Bonwell to determine what exterior improvements need to be made on the Courthouse.
- C. Sheriff Ryan Needham announced that Deputy Walsh had brought the new vehicle, the Bearcat, to the Government Center, and that everyone was invited to view it.
- VIII. COUNCIL MEMBERS' REPORTS:
 - A. Councilman Smith announced that he would be out of town for the December meeting, and as this was his last meeting he would like to thank everyone. He has enjoyed the past 8 years of working together, and has been amazed at the breadth of community involvement associated with making the County work together.
 - B. The remainder of the Council thanked Councilman Smith for his service.
 - C. Councilman Booth also thanked Councilman Smith for his service. He also commented that he appreciated all of the work that has gone into bringing the EMS project together. He also appreciated how smoothly the election went. He spoke of things he's learned during his tenure as Councilman, specifically how the RDC benefits the county as a whole, as it essentially turns commercial funding into infrastructure.
